The Pepsi International Cricket Council (ICC) East Asia – Pacific (EAP) Development Programme is preparing for the annual ICC EAP Elite Squad Camp to be held at the Cricket Australia (CA) Centre of Excellence (CoE) in Brisbane from 17th to 29th October 2010.

Some of Australia's very best coaches and staff members will be on hand to put the East Asia – Pacific representatives through their paces, with the ultimate goal being to represent the region at the upcoming 2011 Australian Country Cricket Championships to be held in Bunbury, January 2011.

PNG Barramundi's wicketkeeper Jack Vare, selected to attend his first ICC EAP Elite Squad Camp, is ready for the challenges that lie ahead.

"I am looking forward to attending the 2010 ICC EAP Elite Squad Camp in October", said Vare, who had an outstanding series for the PNG Barramundi's when they hosted the Australian Indigenous XI earlier this year.

"For several years I have seen PNG players selected for this important camp, and each year the participants come back to Papua New Guinea with exciting stories and better cricket skills" explained Vare.

"I have dreamed of representing my country ever since I was a cricket-loving young boy growing up in my village, and to be selected to represent the East Asia – Pacific region is a wonderful honour', said Vare.



"I always look forward to learning new things and facing new challenges, and cricket is a sport that provides great opportunity to exercise what you want to achieve not only on the field but in life as well", said Vare.

"I want to be a role model for my community in PNG, an ambassador for cricket and hopefully represent my country for another 10 years. With Andy Bichel as National Coaching Director we have taken great strides forward recently, he is a great ambassador for the sport", said Vare.

Experience of an AYAD in Vanuatu By Natalie Mendan

It was a great relief as the plane came in to land at Bauerfield International Airport, Port Vila on Saturday 24 April, following my acceptance into the Australian Youth Ambassador for Development Program (AYAD) working with Vanuatu Cricket. Having been involved with the ICC EAP office for nearly twelve months, it was very exciting to have a chance to work directly with a member country.

My name is Natalie Mendan, and within the AusAID funded position, I am working in a twelve-month posting under the title of Community Cricket Assistant Development Officer. This role gives me the chance to work closely with all staff and board members of Vanuatu Cricket, and already much has been happening.

In preparation for the 2010 Pepsi ICC EAP Under 17 Cricket Trophy, our Development staff hosted a successful pre-squad camp, giving Vanuatu Cricket the opportunity to see the talent available to the Under 17 national squad. Work has also begun on the Vanuatu Cricket website, which our Administration Officer, Henry Boe, has taken a great shining too. Finally, the culmination of two weeks hard preparation saw Vanuatu Cricket host our first scoring seminar for 2010. This was an extremely successful event that saw 31 participants educated on scoring in cricket. We hope that this number will only grow as we work together with all of our clubs to ensure that our games continue to be recorded accurately and neatly.

Though that was the action of my first three weeks, the following twelve months shall be a similarly exciting time for cricket in Vanuatu. Aside from the 2010 Pepsi ICC EAP Under 17 Cricket Trophy, which we are proud to host, and the chance for competition in the Pepsi ICC World Cricket League Division 8, development of the game is always a key focus. The next few weeks will be busy with the planning and implementation of a new Women's Cricket Development Squad program in Port Vila and a Village Cricket Development Squad program in North Efate. Both activities aim to increase the knowledge of women and people in the village on the game of cricket, and encourage their participation through playing, umpiring and scoring. In addition, Vanuatu Cricket is in the final stages of planning for the Vanuatu Cricket Outreach Program. This initiative shall see cricket introduced to the islands of Santo and Tanna, and provide a model that Vanuatu Cricket can use to grow the game on other islands as well.

I look forward to my next twelve months here and working with everyone in Vanuatu Cricket to achieve our goals. Vanuatu is a beautiful country and I am excited to be able to explore more of it, and helping to grow its cricket during my posting.

PNG win inaugural EAP U17 Cricket Trophy

Papua New Guinea have won the inaugural U17 Championships of the East Asia – Pacific region, defeating Vanuatu by 125 runs in the Grand Final of the 2010 Pepsi ICC EAP U17 Cricket Trophy held at Kazaa Field in Port Vila, Vanuatu.

Surprisingly, Vanuatu Captain Callum Blake won the toss and elected to field in hot conditions, hoping that his bowlers could grab early wickets and have the PNG middle order under pressure.

PNG began their innings cautiously, and reached 40 without loss after 10 overs of tight bowling from Callum Blake and Nalin Nipiko.

Bau and Jimmy progressed the score to 60 before Jimmy (16) was caught from the bowling of Stephen, however PNG continued to tick the scoreboard over, with Bau (37) and Boge (46) in fine form, PNG reached 5/218 from their 35 overs.

In reply Vanuatu were never in the hunt, with left arm swing bowler Kabua Vagi taking two early wickets and Vanuatu Captain Callum Blake tragically run-out for just 2 to have Vanuatu reeling at 3 for 6.

Ronald Tari (13) and Nalin Nipiko (37) fought hard against the relentless PNG attack, but with the required run rate continuing to rise, Vanuatu lost the final 6 wickets for just 34 runs, PNG the victors by 125 runs.

PNG Batsman Nigel Boge was named Player of the Final for his innings of 46.

In the 3rd v 4th Playoff match between Fiji and Indonesia, Fiji ran out victors by 8 wickets in a competitive game at Independence Park.

Set just 114 to win from their allotted 35 overs after knocking over Indonesia in the 22nd over, Fiji set out to keep wickets in hand early in their chase.

Opener Naipolioni Gu batted well for Fiji, patiently pushing the ball around the field during his 109 minute knock, well supported by Daucakacaka (20*), with Fiji comfortable winners by 8 wickets.
