VFL season 2011 preview

Rolling full steam into round 1 of the 2011 VFL season, we take a brief look at the preseason happenings of each of the competing clubs and what 2011 has in store for them.

AFTER North Ballarat left an indelible imprint on the storied history of the VFA/ VFL competition with its third successive premiership, the burning question as the 2011 season kicks off is can the Roosters do what only one other team has achieved. And, history buffs must scroll back to the late 19th century to find the only club - Essendon - in the 134-year history of the competition to win four successive flags. The Bombers won premierships in 1891-92-93-94, a feat North Ballarat will attempt to match this season. History tells us it's a herculean assignment, one which has been made all that more difficult with the departure of a host of key North Ballarat players and also from affiliate North Melbourne And, other clubs have ramped up their list in a bid to wrest away North Ballarat's dominance. High profile recruits like Brendan Fevola. Travis Tuck, Troy Selwood and Wayde Skipper as well as a raft of emerging young players from the TAC, suburban and country leagues come into the competition.

Adding another intangible to an already unique Statewide competition is the advent of the Foxtel Cup, which involves North Ballarat, Northern Bullants and Williamstown. One by-product of the Foxtel Cup is that each club has four byes during the home and away season, another imponderable for clubs and coaches to factor into the mix. So, how does your club shape up? Who's new, who's no longer there and who does you club play only once as the hunt begins for season 2011 premiers?

BENDIGO BOMBERS

'09 season where they failed to win a match, Bendiao Bombers mounted a significant recovery last season. Not only did the VFL Bombers snap its embarrassing losing streak, but they won more games than they lost to play finals football for the first time since 2007. Bendigo lost much experience since its Elimination Final loss to Box Hill Hawks. Captain James Flaherty, defender Jason Cloke and former Adelaide/ Essendon player Hayden Skipworth have all left. But, following a selective and extensive recruiting drive Bendigo can expect to again play finals in '11 and they've addressed a significant deficiency - bolstering its forward power. Netting 'Frosty' Miller medallist Matthew Little is the recruiting coup of the season. Little, coming off a career season where he also won the Frank Johnson Medal for his seven goal haul in the VFL win against WA, provides Bendigo with a bona fide target. Complimenting Little is Justin Maddern who kicked a 100 goals for Kangaroo Flat in the local Bendigo league. Add former Frankston player Tory Dickson combined with an improved Essendon list and Bendiao looks well equipped to play finals.

BOX HILL HAWKS

Captain Steve Kenna has departed for local footy; Ed Curnow, whose season was cruelly ended mid-season by injury, and Cam Pederson find themselves on AFL lists and Luke Ablett also has gone. Compounding matters. Hawthorn recruit Beau Muston will miss much of the first half following an ankle reconstruction. While Adam Pattison will provide much needed weekly physical presence both in the ruck and around the ground, Box Hill Hawks will rely heavily on its



Hawthorn list. One added bonus is that former Frankston captain Shaun Pollard is ready to resume after missing all last season through injury. He'll stiffen up the VFL Hawks' defence. Virtually all its new players are youngsters in their first year out of the TAC Cup and it can take a season or two for them to adjust to playing against bigger bodied, more experienced players.

Snapshot: Casey welcomes back captain Kyle Matthews after his sickening assault during last season's preseason, which robbed him of all the '10 season. Matthews is an inspirational player and it's to be hoped he can return to his best form. Another comeback player is the talented Michael Stockdale, who's still young and good enough to make it to the AFL. The Scorpions have lost prolific possession winning midfielder Ben Macreadie, but they still have a strong core of VFL players led by James Wall, Evan Panozza and Tim Mohr. Last season the Scorpions caught most clubs unaware and its ability to win close games - 8/2 in games decided by 15-points or less



- guaranteed them a top four finish. But, Casey was bundled out of the finals in straight sets, underlining its inexperience in a crunch. Certainly, Melbourne's emerging list will have a strong say in just where the Scorpions finish, but finals shape to be in the equation.

And, Coburg Tigers inability to consistently kick big scores continually put them under the pump. For the fourth time in four years, Coburg Tigers have a new coach, but at least Adam Potter takes charge of a list that has seen little movement over the off season. Importantly, Coburg Tigers retained captain Nick Carnell. Sam Power. Damien Ravson, Rhett Jordan, Andrew Duhau and Ben Clifton. The VFL Tigers have added some experience with Jamason Daniels, Nick Lynch and Luke Cartelli and Michael Tanner from Williamstown. Certainly, Potter has enough VFL talent coupled with an untapped Richmond list to suggest

Coburg Tigers won't under achieve in 2011.

Collingwood has chosen not to recruit an elder statesman like they did with Damien Peverill and Nigel Carmody in previous seasons and what that does is expose a sea of young, fresh faces to a most competitive competition. Winning the VFL premiership is not high on the Pies priority list with the club more focused on developing its young players into AFL quality players who can play the brand of game that netted the club the 2010 AFL flag. Having said that, Collingwood made it to a VFL Preliminary Final two seasons ago. Energetic, enthusiastic young players are always capable of surprises and that's why Collingwood cannot be discarded.

The Dolphins lost its next 15 games to finish a long and lonely last with the opposition scoring twice as many points as they did. It was not altogether surprising given the mass exodus of players from the club at the start of the

2010 season Coach Simon Goosey put all his faith in young. local kids and they certainly found the step up to the semiprofessional ranks of the VFL a quantum leap. Importantly, Frankston has retained most of its list and with a season behind them, Frankston will be better equipped to be more competitive, but to what extent will only be determined as the season pans out. Once again, Goosey has concentrated on an influx of young players from the TAC Cup and local leagues in a bid for the club to firstly end its losing streak, climb out of the cellar and again become a competitive force in the competition.

The Cats' undoubted highlight was a win against subsequent premiers North Ballarat, but apart from that its wins were against Frankston. Werribee and Gold Coast. who ended up below or just ahead of them on the ladder. Geelong has bolstered its VFL ranks with the signing of ex Brisbane Lion Troy Selwood and Jaxson Barham, who played with Collingwood. It certainly provides some much needed experience to lead what again shapes as a youthful, inexperienced team. Geelong's status in the VFL will again be dictated to a large extent by the injuries incurred at the top end of its list. If Geelong can maintain a healthy list it will help its VFL team, which has the added advantage of playing many of its home games as curtain raisers to the AFL Cats.

FitzGerald has the innate ability to prize the maximum ability from all those who play under his regimented and processed format What will make the Roosters task all the more challenging is that it has lost so much experience. Captain Shaune Moloney, Liston Trophy winner Stephen Clifton and the under rated, but highly effective Dan Feery and Stevie Dinnell are significant departures, so, too the loss of North Melbourne players Corey Jones, Josh Smith and Leigh Harding. Jones and Smith were the prime goal kicking targets, so North Ballarat need to find two new players to supply 100 plus goals a season

 not an easy ask. It's not all doom and gloom however. North Ballarat still has a very good list and just as importantly the best coach in the competition.

Adrian. Add to that mix a Carlton list that is deep in talent and it augurs well. The

Bullants lost David Teague, who coached the club to the past two Grand Finals, but replacement Darren Harris has led clubs to premierships both in Victorian country as well as in West Australia, where he also worked with John Worsfold. Northern Bullants will again be a leading contender for the flag.

The Borough was without captain John Baird throughout the season and best and fairest winner Sam Dwyer was reduced to a cameo role also through injury. Both players are ready from the get-go this season. And, while ruckman Dylan McLaren is a significant loss, Port has recruited well.



Lovett takes over a club that will be without goal kicking goliath Nick Sautner, who, through work commitments, couldn't meet Lovett's strict, nonnegotiable training regimen. It will be interesting to watch Sandringham post Sautner and how they construct their avenue to goal. Lovett has brought with him a team-orientated discipline that saw Frankston reach lofty heights few expected. Interestingly, several former Dolphins have joined Sandringham, which already boasts a number of players Lovett coached at Frankston. Expect Sandringham, favoured by a kind draw, to be more

competitive than in previous seasons and look for the Zebras to be finalists once again.

Harris is a premiership coach in the WAFL as well as in country Victoria.

Paul Satterley is the new coach of Werribee. Satterley is a local product and won the 1995 Liston Trophy when playing at Werribee under the legendary Donald McDonald.

PLAYER RULES

Following the success in recent seasons of the 23rd player rule, it has been expanded in season 2011 to include all home and away games as well as the finals. Clubs are able to use a 23rd player to promote a TAC Cup graduate from the 2010 season or to allow a TAC player from the aligned club to experience VFL football.

FOXTEL CUP

Invited clubs from each State League around the country will compete in the inaugural Foxtel Cup, which will be staged throughout season 2011. Reigning premiers North Ballarat, runner-up Northern Bullants and minor premiers Williamstown are the VFL clubs competing. The Foxtel Cup is a knockout competition - only the winners advance to the next round -played at various venues around the country. North Ballarat and Williamstown play their respective first matches at Patersons Stadium, Subiaco while Northern Bullants will play its opening match at the MCG. All Foxtel Cup games will be televised in a two hour package

on Foxtel.

Venues for the Qualifying, Semi and Grand Finals have yet to be finalised. The Grand Final is on Saturday, August 6.

2011 Foxtel Cup Preview

Not content with a cabinet bursting with silverware, North Ballarat wants to add two more Cups this season to its bulging collection.

OBVIOUSLY, a record equalling fourth successive VFL premiership is the priority, but right behind that is the inaugural Foxtel Cup.

North Ballarat coach Gerard FitzGerald views the Foxtel Cup. which brings together clubs from every State and Territory, as an "exciting addition" not a distraction as other clubs in other States may perceive it. The Roosters, Northern Bullants and Williamstown are the three invited VFL clubs to compete in the 16-club knockout competition, which begins this Saturday when North Ballarat travel to West Australia to play East Perth at Patersons Stadium, Subjaco, Williamstown also heads west to play Swan Districts, also at Patersons Stadium, on April 9 while Northern Bullants takes on Kevin Sheedy's Greater Western Sydney at the MCG on April 30. Other clubs in the competition

are Morningside, Labrador (Queensland), NT Thunder (Northern Territory), West Adelaide, Port Adelaide Magpies, North Adelaide (South Australia), Ainslie (ACT), Clarence (Tasmania), Claremont (West Australia), East Coast Eagles (AFL Sydney).

The Foxtel Cup follows a simple format: win and advance to the next round, lose and you're eliminated.

All Foxtel Cup games will be televised in a two hour package on Foxtel and telecast on the day of the match. Most games will be shown on Foxtel between 5pm and 7pm or 6pm and 8pm leading into a live AFL match. Venues for the Qualifying, Semi and Grand Finals have yet to be finalised. The Grand Final is on Saturday, August 6. FitzGerald said North Ballarat jumped at the chance to participate when the competition was mooted late last year.

"We would have said 'yes' within a minute of the invitation being here. We didn't even need to have a committee meeting or whatever to discuss it," FitzGerald said. "For anyone at the club whether it is the coach, the administration, a player you would have to be excited by it.

"It's a great chance to showcase not only your State, but also your club."

FitzGerald said the advent of the Foxtel Cup changed the emphasis in how the club approached the pre-season. He said pre-season normally gives him a chance to reward players for their training regimen over summer or see if a player could develop into a particular role, the focus this year had been to prepare for the Foxtel Cup, which in effect is the club's first game of 2011.

"It's changed our mindset of how we treated the practice matches," FitzGerald said.

"It's cut-throat. You could play really well and just come up short, but it's the end of you. We will be taking our best possible available team. We will have an emphasis on players who are extremely fit and can cover the ground. "Players who may have been very good players over the journey, but who are not right to go, well, we won't be taking them.

"There is a lot more urgency in this game for us than there would normally be in Round 1." And, that would suggest trouble for any team that encounters North Ballarat in the Foxtel Cup.


