Clubs in the league have trained hard and long over summer and the big question is who will knock league powerhouse Narre Warren off their lofty perch?

## Family donates organs of teen killed in road smash



The Brennan family remains shattered at Mitchell's death.

They said he was a loving and popular boy who put his family first, especially since his father John, died of a brain injury in 2005.

"He should have been starting year 12 this year, his life was only just beginning and has been cut short and left us devastated beyond words," was how Melanie put it in an email to the Leader.

And the circumstances of the accident nag at them. Why had he braked 15m before hitting the tree? Had another car pulled out of a side street? How had he been injured so badly when the passenger side of the ute took the impact? And how could a collision involving such a small tree, a mop top, create so much damage?

But she said it was a comforting thought that in death, he saved the lives of four people.

His heart, lungs, right and left kidney, pancreas and liver were donated.

A young girl received his liver and kidney and a young father took his heart.

Sonja Brennan said her son gave people the ultimate Christmas present.

The Brennan family is continuing to promote organ donation and create community awareness.

On Sunday, April 3 at Keysborough Football Club, Mitchell's sister Chloe and her Keysy team-mates played Gembrook for the inaugural DonateLife Shield.

Mitchell played for Keysborough's Under 18s and supported the women's side for which Chloe his sister is team manager this year.

He went to training, helped in the canteen on game days and socialised with many of the girls.

About 80 per cent of the Keysborough players have already signed up as organ donors. Members of the DonateLife team were at the Shield match to answer questions about organ donation and provided registration forms.

### Family Tragedy

MITCHELL Brennan was being a good brother.

On December 2 last year he dropped off his nephew Harrison at his sister Melanie's house in Narre Warren South and stayed around to help with her baby, four-week-old Oliver, who was delivered by caesarean.

An hour later, the 18-year-old, who'd had his licence for 44 days, got in his ute and headed for home. He never made it to Cranbourne.

Not far from Melanie's house his vehicle left the road and struck a tree. There had been a quick-descending thunderstorm and the road was wet, but investigators are unsure exactly what happened.

Shortly after the accident police visited Melanie Plant to make a road-toll call. "The knock at the door still haunts me," she said.

Later that day, at The Alfred hospital, doctors told the Brennan family Mitchell had suffered brain damage and his injuries weren't "sustainable for life". Then medical staff raised the idea of organ donation. Given that Mitchell always wanted to be an ambulance officer, they agreed.

"We asked for an hour to get our heads around it, but in our hearts it was something we wanted to do," his sister Hayley, said.

## The Interleague Experience: V/Line Cup

At the time of writing, we are in the thick of the V/Line Cup Under 15 Carnival at various venues in and around Melbourne including, for the first time, 5 games played regionally on Saturday and Sunday to kick off the 2011 Cup in Ballarat and Bendigo.

Nearly 550 of the best Under 15 footballers from across the VCFL have represented their region and have now returned to their home clubs for matches this weekend.

Some 272 WorkSafe VCFL clubs have been represented by players across the carnival.

A few of the fortunate (and deserving) ones would have returned home as Divisional champions after holding the trophy aloft after the Final day's play. It is a trophy steeped in history. The engraving on the Divisional 1 Cup goes back to 1949, where it is engraved that the Goulburn Valley won the inaugural carnival.

From then until now, every football region of the state is represented on it. The mind boggles at 62 years of tradition and football pedigree engraved on that cup, of the bush legends and those that went on to great heights in the VFL/AFL that have played in those teams.

History shows that nearly 60% of the players in the 2011 V/Line Cup will get a chance to join with TAC teams over the next few years, and from there, to the national Under 18 teams and a chance to be drafted through the National Draft Camp into the AFL.

This year we have seen Gippsland V/Line Cup representative Dyson Heppell stamp himself on the AFL at Essendon as a first year player. Bulldog Andrew Hooper is a two time V/Line Cup representative. Current captains Luke Hodge and Jonathan Brown were V/Line Cup players. Joel Selwood, Steele Sidebottom, Shaun Higgins and Patrick Dangerfield are AFL stars that got their first chance to impress at the V/Line Cup.

We have no doubt that all the young players in the 2011 V/line Cup will return home with football memories and valuable experiences that they can both cherish and pass onto their team mates and clubs.

For many footballers, the experience of interleague football may rank as the highest achievement in their playing memories. The chance to join the best players in the competition to take on a common opponent is a special experience as a sportsman. The experience – whether you are an Under 15 V/Line Cup player or a Senior State player has a similar impact.

Every representative player could describe the nerves as they wandered into the change rooms for the first time and meet those guys that have been opponents up to that point; the feeling as you come together in a huddle before a new coach as a group for the first time; the sense you get as the ball flicks around at training and you notice the rise in the tempo and intensity.

It may be hard to quantify the value in watching how other guys prepare themselves for the matches and how they go the extra mile to get the best out of themselves, but it is a common thought we hear from players after their representative campaigns.

The next time you meet your 'teammates' it is likely to be as opponents again on your home ground. You can't help it, but win, lose or draw you have a connection with these guys – and you will have this for the rest of your playing days.

We congratulate all the players, coaches and support staff that has made the 2011 V/Line Cup Carnival such a success; we wish you all the best for the rest of your football seasons. We hope that we will see you progress through the interleague program of the WorkSafe VCFL in the years to come. We also say the same for all the WorkSafe VCFL umpires that have had the honour of officiating at the 2011 V/Line Cup.

## Who will challenge the mighty Pies?

NARRE Warren reclaimed its mantle of Casey Cardinia League king in a 2010 grand final rout of warm favourites Beaconsfield and the question that all throughout the district has been asking since is - who can knock the 'Pies off their lofty perch?

Well, after a tumultuous off-season that saw over half the senior grand final side depart the Perc Allison Oval, it will not be last year's runners up-that's for sure.

So the door is open for a new challenger to take it up to the Magpies and just which one of the remaining nine sides on the list it might be, will become a little clearer after this weekend's opening round.

There has been a significant turnover in both on-field and coaching personnel over the break with seven of the 11 clubs under the guidance of new senior coaches. The continuing strength of the league is confirmed by the fact that there are former AFL players at the helm of five clubs with Greg Tivendale (ROC), Dean Rice (Berwick) and Rod Keogh (Devon Meadows) joining 2010 incumbents Austinn Jones (Beaconsfield) and Doug Koop (Cranbourne).

Beaconsfield has the opening round bye and, while it is always difficult to make predictions from pre-season form, the round one match-ups should provide plenty of interest to all local football fans.

### Narre Warren v Berwick

There is no love lost between these two bitter rivals and nothing would make either debutant coach happier than to secure bragging rights over the other in round one.

Former Carlton premiership player Dean Rice is the latest to ride the Berwick coaching merry-go-round and he has secured a host of recruits including 2010 Casey Cardinia League Young Gun winner Vergim Faik from Doveton, together with seven new faces from the Eastern Football League. However those off the Wickers roster include stars Dale Robinson, Jason Heath, Jack Sheppard and Riley Heddles.

The league yardsticks, Narre Warren, will be coached by Chris Toner who returns to his old club after a successful stint at the helm of Ellinbank League club Cora Lynn. The main ins are youngster Brandon Mather from ROC and Andrew Hunter from Beaconsfield, but this is not an issue because the Magpies have so much emerging young talent from the juniors that competition for a place in the side is already at a premium. Those off the list include Chris Potalej, Tim Werner and retiree Steven Kidd.

The Magpies have cruised through a largely smooth pre-season and will unfurl another pennant in front of their home crowd before the game. After that build up it will take a mighty effort from the Wickers to cause an early upset.

### Cranbourne v Doveton

Cranbourne blew the cobwebs out against Devon Meadows last weekend, and unveiled a few likely new faces at the same time. Young forward Rian Healy booted five goals in a promising effort, while top line recruits Caleb Tiller and Lawrence Angwin had their first taste of Casey Cardinia League football. The Eagles 56-point win in wet conditions was even more ominous given they had the goal-kinking 'yips' for almost the whole match.

# Football Preview

Doveton, again under Mark Ladgrove, will be without young departees Vergim Faik, Cory Phillips and Cody Gunn but have improved both their skill level and depth with the inclusion of experience in the form of Aaron Henwood, Jason McCloy, Kory Grant and Pakenham playmaker John Atwell.

New Doves president Stuart Batten has set about guiding the club back to the finals in 2010 and they must be competitive all day for that to become a reality. That said, Doug Koop's measure of success for Cranbourne this season is a top two finish followed by a grand finals berth. That should make for a huge contest. This game is played for the Mitchell-Garrett Cup and that piece of silverware will again sit proudly in the Cranbourne trophy cabinet at the day's end.

### Devon Meadows v Hampton Park

It was a completely different looking Devon Meadows that took to the field for the first time last week and produced a less than impressive result. New Panthers coach Rod Keogh would have been pleased with the form of debutants Adam Brander, Damon Kirkwood and Nathan Demergue, together with star big man Adam Jago, however the overall performance was well short of that required to push the top teams this season.

Hampton Park's incoming coach, Clint Evans, would have noted that and marked down this weekend's game as a must-win. Evans has already stamped himself as a hard task-master at the Booth Reserve and will be expecting an immediate impact from recruits including Kerem and Kain Baskaya, Jack Besley, Cory Phillips and ex-Panther Brett Armitage. He will be hoping they more than cover the departure of Brady White, Ryan Simpson, Josh Taylor and Glenn Rees.

At the Glover Reserve the Panthers will probably go in as slight favourites, but what people think before a game rarely matters. In fact it often acts as an incentive and the word from Hampton Park is that expectations are absolute with finals the only aim. That being the case, a solid and emphatic victory this weekend can be the only acceptable outcome.

### Keysborough v Tooradin

Astute Keysborough coach Brad Canavan, with the benefit of a season in the Casey Cardinia League under his belt, will be expecting a vast improvement in his side's fortunes this year. There has been a fair player turnover at the Rowley Allen Reserve with big outs in

Nigel Scott, Greg Walker, Dean Gentle, Daniel Born and injured star Matthew Freeman. That has been tempered by the inclusion of five top-line recruits from Noble Park together with Pakenham youngster Shannon Dart and lanky basketballer Matthew Witherden.

Keysborough's opponent, Tooradin had a turbulent break with former league best and fairest winner Beau Miller assuming the senior coaching role after Chad Liddell departed the club in sudden circumstances before Christmas. Miller lost solid contributors in Jack Cole, Mark Griffiths and Troy Allan, but has gained some class with the addition of Daniel O'Sughrue from Pakenham, David White and Jack Coutts from Clayton and Queenslander Ryan White.

This will be a very competitive game because the loser's finals ambitions will take a big whack, while the winner will gain significant momentum for 2011. At home, Keysborough is usually a much better side and that is the only basis on which to select a Burra victory this week.

### Pakenham v ROC

Pakenham boasts the luxury of the return of 2009 premiership coach Michael Holland to the top job and hopes are very high that the maestro can repeat the feat in 2011, starting with a big win over traditional rivals ROC in the Shanika's Cup clash.

The Lions have lost some quality with the departure of John Atwell, Daniel O'Sughrue, Nathan Brown, Jeremy Everett, Daniel Fry and Jared Goldsack, but replaced them with ROC foursome Dane Roy, Kym Jones, Michael and James Brown, together with young Catani star Russell Lehman.

ROC, under the guidance of Greg Tivendale, will rely on the development of their promising youngsters along with newcomers Damien Stafford, Matt Robinson and Brad Snooks.

Pakenham has had a solid pre-season and will be ready to fire. The Kangaroos, on the other hand, are starting from a low base and, on paper, it will take a huge effort to be competitive this season, let alone win their share of games. Beginning the season against one of the sides widely tipped to be among the top three premiership contenders is not ideal and the result will likely reflect that fact at day's end.



## A TALE OF TWO SIDES

There were two distinct sides to the Casey Scorpions at TEAC Oval on Saturday.

The first appeared in the first half, a fumbling, uncertain unit that committed a catalogue of errors against Port Melbourne which ultimately cost it the Round 2 match.

But after half time came the skilled and spirited Scorpions as they set about reducing a 46-point third-quarter deficit.

Moving the ball quickly with a wind to the Williamstown Rd end, and with Michael "Juice" Newton (six goals) making a trusty target, they got to within nine points late in the last term, forcing Port into time-eating short passes.

It was a commendable comeback. But too much repair work was needed after the dismal opening.

Coach Bradley Gotch lamented four 50m penalties that gifted Port goals, two to Dan Keely in the first quarter. "I reckon we gave up eight to 10 goals with free kicks," he said. "That hurt us big-time. It cost us"

"But to our credit we never gave up the ghost. At half time they had us under control but in the third quarter we kept coming and then went at them really hard in the last quarter." Casey's worst was on show during a passage early in the second term. Matt Fieldsend, now a good player at this level, made a pinpoint pass, not to a teammate, but a Port player.

The ball went to the Port forward line, where Tom McDonald won back possession for the Scorpions. Going across goal, his kick sailed out of bounds on the full (to complete the outbreak of blunders Dean Galea accepted the free kick and then himself kicked out on the full).

Soon after James Strauss took a kick-out and drilled a pass straight to man-on-the-mark Patty Rose. Honestly, it was a wonder the Scorpions got as close as they did.

But they showed far more endeavour in the third quarter (Gotch said his half-time talk was "nothing over the top") and found more run and took more risks. Joel McDonald, Addam Maric and James Wall were at the heart of the resurgence.

Two goals in a minute from Matthew Bate had them in touch at the last change and they had the wind in the final term. But they'd left themselves too much to do.

Maric was Casey's best with his pace through the mid-field and three goals, shading acrobatic, athletic Newton.

Young Michael Riseley was given the task of playing on dangerous Port forward Rose and he did it well, holding him to one goal

The Scorpions visit reigning triple premier North Bal-larat on Saturday, and they will be without Newton, who on Monday accepted a one-match suspension for a late hit in the third quarter.

Meanwhile Brenda Fevola made his first appearance for the Casey Scorpions in the reserve grade against Port Melbourne.

His 10 possessions brought him three goals, and his every move was captured by the camera crew assembling footage for a Ben Cousins-type tell-all.

His father, Angelo, watched from the grandstand.

Casey reserves coach Steve O'Brien thought Fevola serviceable. "Yeah, he's still a bit under-done. We've got to get some game time into him, and he's got some work to do, but he's kicked three out of nine," O'Brien said. "He presented well."

# Cyber Bullying Policy

Today's society is consumed with multi-media and technology that enhances our lives in many ways, however with the integration of these methods of communication into our lifestyle, misuse and a lack of education as to the hazards of these technologies is sometimes overlooked. The WorkSafe VCFL has in recent seasons experienced the misuse of various forms of social media extending into the sporting environment. The ever increasing use of mobile phones and social media (Facebook, Twitter etc) has also been experienced in club, league and umpiring group environments. The WorkSafe VCFL Board, recognising the serious aspects of inappropriate use of social media, websites, etc, have decided to introduce WorkSafe VCFL Rules and Regulations to cater for investigating and penalising the proven misuse of social media when it relates to the WorkSafe-VCFL environment. Leading Cybersafety expert Susan McLean was engaged by the WorkSafe VCFL to present to the 2011 League Seminar in December 2010.

Following Susan's presentation it was unanimously agreed that the WorkSafe VCFL should develop a cybersafety policy to address the misuse of technology and social media at club, league and umpiring group level. The policy was developed in conjunction with Susan McLean, the WorkSafe VCFL Rules Committee and has been ratified by the WorkSafe VCFL Board. The attached policy's implementation is mandatory across all WorkSafe VCFL affiliates and relates to all players, officials, umpires, clubs, leagues and umpire groups and associated personnel. The policy has been developed to protect all affiliated members of the WorkSafe VCFL and will take effect from April 1, 2011. The WorkSafe VCFL Board will review the policy as it sees fit and

requires all clubs, leagues and umpire groups to make certain their playing and non-playing members are not only aware of the policy, but understand that breaches of the policy will be dealt with in accordance with the procedures outlined within the policy, which in turn will result in penalties ranging from suspension to de-registration if breaches are proven.



While the development of a policy was seen to be an important demonstration of leadership from the WorkSafe VCFL, the policy must also be coupled with education. Susan McLean, in conjunction with the WorkSafe VCFL will conduct (4) Cybersafety Education Sessions throughout WorkSafe VCFL affiliates across the months of April & May (refer details following). The WorkSafe VCFL implore all affiliates and associated personnel to read and understand the policy and make it a priority that you attend one of the education sessions referred to below. Technology is part of our everyday lives and the misuse of such, whether it is intentional or not, will not be accepted by the WorkSafe VCFL. We trust you embrace this policy and thank you in advance for your assistance in making all WorkSafe VCFL players, officials, umpires, clubs, leagues, umpire groups and associated personnel aware of their responsibilities when it comes to the use of technology and the social media.



## A Reminder of the New Rules for Season 2011

### Players Exceeding Permitted Number

Where a Team has more than the permitted number of Players on the Playing Surface, the following shall apply:

- a field Umpire shall award a Free Kick to the captain or acting captain of the opposing Team, which shall be taken at the Centre Circle or where play was stopped, whichever is the greater penalty against the offending Team;
- a Fifty-Metre Penalty shall then be imposed from the position where the Free Kick was awarded; and
- the matter will be referred to the League to investigate and ultimately determine the outcome as they see fit - note that the offending team does not lose all points scored in the Match up to the time of the count on matchday.

### Bumping a Player with his/her head over the ball

Player who elects to bump in any situation is liable if he makes forceful contact to the head, unless he was contesting the ball or contact was beyond his control.

Simplifies definition and makes consistent with head down over the ball rule, so that a player who elects to apply a bump in any situation is liable if he makes forceful contact with the head, unless:

The player was contesting the ball and did not have a realistic alternative way to contest the ball; or

The contact was caused by circumstances outside of the control of the player which could not be reasonably foreseen.

## The Advantage Rule

Where the field Umpire intends to or has signalled that they intend to award a Free Kick to a Player, the field Umpire may, instead of awarding the Free Kick, allow the play to continue if the Player of the Team who receives the Free Kick has taken the advantage.

Updated wording to clarify change in the law which now sees players determine whether "advantage" is called by the umpire.

## Deliberate out of Bounds

Stricter interpretation of deliberate out of bounds (player walking ball over the line).

Trend has emerged where players are absorbing tackles and conceding the ball over the boundary line for a throw-in without being penalized.

This action is counter to the spirit of keeping the ball in play and should be penalized accordingly.

Stricter interpretation will focus on less benefit of doubt for the player who has the ball and walks over the boundary line.



Welcome to 2011 season of the Casey Cardinia Netball League. Even before the first centre pass can be taken, this season is shaping up to be unlike any other. The 2011 season may very well be defined by who won't be lining up rather than the inclusions for each club.

Reining premiers Beaconsfield have lost half of their premiership team from 2010, losing Regan Brokenshire and Rebecca Pryor from the goal ring along with Sarah Hogan, Kim Kennedy and Bridget Gargan from the defensive end. Not to mention losing two time premiership coach Shona Osborne there are some big shoes to fill for former Berwick coach Jess Brady who has taken over the reins at Beacy. This season sees the return of Sarah Murphy which will fill at least one of the gaps left vacant but she may appear in the defence end rather than the goal ring where she normally feels at home. Beaconsfield has an enormous amount of depth however with some talent B grade and up and coming 17& under players to draw from and will remain a premiership contender.

Berwick also will be missing a big name in Melissa English travelling overseas which leaves a gaping hole in the goal ring. It would be expected that Taylor Shannon will fill this position as she intends to play only seniors this season even though she is still eligible for 17& under. The question remains can Taylor Shannon and Lyn Moyes strike up a quality goaling combination like the one English and Moyes have taken years in the ring together to perfect?

ROC will be without goaling stalwart Nic Robbins following surgery in the off-season. Mel Overdyk had a baby girl, Jasmine, only weeks ago so the question remains whether she will make an appearance on the court later in the season. From watching the ROCers at the pre-season tournament it seems they have picked up a tall defender but noticeably Laura Quinn was

absent. The side will need to rely on their dependable mid-court of Amy Tivendale, Jacquie Dwyer and the much under-rated playing coach, Michelle Cranston.

A lack of goalers will have a huge effect on Pakenham this season losing Melanie Elston, Rachel Priestly and Michelle Webster. A big congratulations to Stacey Deayton on her pregnancy but this will rule her out for the season also. The return of Dani West, who we must also congratulate on her marriage and is now Dani Williams, will be welcomed but filling the goal ring will be a mission for the Lions throughout the season.

Tooradin's notoriously strong defensive line-up will be vulnerable without club stalwarts Alison Allan and Michelle Barnes this season. The goal ring will also be hampered without Sharna Wadeson. On the up side for the Seagulls the mid-court will be strengthened with the return of Shona Wells after having a baby last season and Sarah Kernot.

With so many teams missing big name players where does that leave the League for 2011? Hopefully, this will bring the gap between the 'have's' and the 'have nots' closer together.

The team to watch this year would have to be Keysborough. With no notable changes in their line-up from 2010, this team should improve on their 2nd ladder position. With quality players like Jo Amott and Fiona Smith expected to line-up again I'm not sure which team will be able to topple this side from top spot this season.

Hampton Park seemed to have a lot of potential last season but sadly lacked a consistently strong side week in week out to really make an impact. The Redbacks rotated 17 players through their A grade last season making each week an unknown prospect not only for their opposition but for themselves as well.
