Happy Birthday to Fiba Oceania



Last Month FIBA Oceania celebrated its 44th anniversary. Let's take a quick look at how it all began.

In 1968, the Oceania Basketball Confederation – as it was then known – had been several years in the making

thanks, in large part to Australian Al Ramsay and the late Sir Lance Cross from New Zealand.

In spite of only five countries from the Pacific region being members of FIBA at the time (Australia, New Zealand, Tahiti, Papua New Guinea and Vanuatu), Ramsay and Cross believed in the potential of uniting under a broader Oceania organisation, including almost 20 basketball associations from the South Pacific Sports Council, all of them with active Basketball Associations.

Marks moves into Spurs executive role

New Zealand's first ever NBA player Sean Marks who played 11 seasons, has been appointed as director of basketball operations for the San Antonio Spurs, and general manager of D-League affiliate the Austin Toros.

Only a year ago the San Antonio Spurs started Marks on a front-office apprenticeship as a basketball operations assistant.

Marks now is only behind General Manager R C Buford and his No 2 Scott Layden in the front office pecking order.

Penney on target in Turkey

Tall Black Kirk Penney was dialed in from long distance, hitting five three-pointers to help his TED Kolejliler to victory over Turkish Basketball League cellar dwellers Gaziantep.

Penney had 23 points (8/11 FG, 5/7 3pt, 2/2 FT), as his side led from the start and put their opponents away with a 27-17 third quarter. The Kiwi is now third on the league's scoring rankings, averaging 18.7 points for a club that now sits in fourth equal (2-1) on the table.

In the United States, Steve Adams logged his first minutes for the University of Pittsburgh, as they defeated Indiana University of Pennsylvania 69-54 in their first exhibition game of the new college season.

The young Wellingtonian had a basket in a 7-0 run that put the Panthers 21-16 up at halftime and finished

with six points (3/8 FG), six rebounds (five OR), two blocks, an assist and a steal in 23 minutes.

Pittsburgh next play against Hawaii-Hilo on Friday and open their regular season at home against Mount St Mary's on November 9.

Other Kiwis opening their college pre-season programmes this week include Tall Blacks Isaac Fotu (Hawaii v Hawaii Pacific) on Friday and Rob Loe (St Louis v Rockhurst) on Saturday, and Tall Fern Jordan Hunter (Southeast Missouri v Southern Indiana) on Sunday.

Meanwhile, Cantabrian Caleb Harrison made his coaching debut with Dickinson State University, guiding their women's team to a pair of wins over University of Manitoba. The Blue Hawks, including WBC Most Valuable Play-

er Jess Bygate (Nelson), face Black Hills State University on Saturday.

In the Australian WNBL, Tall Ferns captain Natalie Taylor led Logan Power to an 87-79 road victory over Sydney University, scoring 24 points (8/13 FG, 1/3 3pt, 7/9 FT), grabbing nine rebounds and blocking two shots. The following day, Logan (2-3) fell 68-71 to Canberra Capitals.

Meanwhile, Kiwi point guard Angela Marino earned bragging rights over national team coach Kennedy Kereama, when her Adelaide Lightning (4-1) overcame West Coast Waves 75-65 in Perth.

Marino had nine points, five rebounds and three assists, while Ferns guard Toni Edmondson put up seven points, five rebounds and five assists for the Waves (1-4).

News Around the Country

The New Zealand Breakers have started their quest for three consecutive ANBL titles nicely with three wins out of four to begin the 2013-14 season.

Tall Blacks forward Mika Vukona has been a stand out for the Breakers, winning Round Three player of the Week for his 15 points and 15 rebounds in a win over the Townsville Crocodiles.

In the New Zealand League, assistant coach of the Tall

Blacks Pero Cameron has resigned a one year deal with the Wellington Saints for next year's season.

This will be Cameron's fourth year as Head Coach for the Saints, leading the franchise to three straight finals winning two titles.

Southland Sharks have also made a couple of signings, securing import Kevin Braswell who will be returning for his third season and young forward Morgan Natanahira

who has opted to follow coach Paul Henare from the Bay Hawks.

Braswell is still looking to become a New Zealand citizen, which will enable the Sharks an opportunity to have add two imports.

Taranaki Mountain Airs have secured 2011 scoring champ Jack Leasure for his fourth season with the franchise. Leasure will share the two import spots with big man Suleiman Braimoh who has

Rules Interpretations

Ball returned to the backcourt (Art 30)

We have a number of referees confused about the backcourt violation. This is largely due to the fact that when changes were made to the rule in 2010, the interpretation that was published centered on the dribbler. In addition to that the rule with regards to the ball being considered in the frontcourt is actually found within the eight seconds rule (Art 28.1.2) rather than the backcourt rule.

When a ball is returned to the backcourt there are three points that must happen for it to be considered illegal:

1. The team must have control of the live ball
2. A player from this team must be the last to touch the ball in the front court
3. A player from this team must be the first to touch the ball in the team's backcourt.

If ALL three points do not occur, then this is NOT a backcourt violation.

We had previously been advised that during a dribble from the backcourt to the frontcourt, both feet of the dribbler and the ball must be fully in the frontcourt before the ball is considered committed to the front court. When not dribbling, the ball is not considered to be in a team's frontcourt until the ball touches or is legally touched by an offensive player who has both feet completely in contact with their frontcourt. In effect it is legal to receive a pass from someone in your backcourt whilst you are straddling the center-line and pass the ball back; or a player can receive a pass from someone in their backcourt, in their backcourt, place one foot in the front court, and then return it to the backcourt. Remember the eight second count does continue until the ball is fully committed to the front court.

Pirates Pull Out



James Blond Auckland Pirates will not defend their Bartercard NBL title next season.

After much deliberation, Basketball Auckland (BA) has decided that it will not be entering a team in the 2013 National Basketball League.

BA undertook a thorough review of the on and off-court operation of the Pirates, and found the finan-

cial model, in particular, to be unsustainable in the short term.

While the players, coaching staff, team management, sponsors and supporters have every reason to be disappointed with the decision to withdraw the Pirates from the NBL, it has been made in the best interests of basketball in Auckland.

Pirates were in the league for two seasons, replacing Auckland Stars who pulled out in 2009.
