We had two big events for the Oceania region last year and earlier this year being World Swimming Championships in Istanbul, Turkey in December at which a number of Federations were represented. January this year was the Australian Youth Olympics held in Sydney at which a combined Oceania team competed.

The Oceania Executive, selected, after

receiving nominations from the Federations of Oceania, the following swimmers to represent the combined Oceania Team at the event.

They were:

Girls: Cheyanne and Adele Rova from Fiji, Noeline Laughlin and Mehani Bernadino, Tahiti, Maeva Parayre and Emma Terebo New Caledonia.

Boys: Kenuske Kimura Northern Marianas, Alex Buvry and Maruiki Aitamai Tahiti, Meli Malani Fiii. and Nathan

Barberis & Jeremie Dufourmantelle of New Caledonia.

Paul Lang of Tahiti was selected as Head Coach, and Suzie Schuster (Samoa) as Coach/Manager. Further we were also able to secure the services of Darren Howard (NSW Swimming Development Officer) to assist as team manager.

The meet was of high standard and our team members represented us well throughout the competition. I have included several photos here and some more on the website.

Unfortunately Meli Malani from Fiji was unable to travel at the last minute due to an issue from the Australian High Commission not issuing the travel visa in time. Despite ours and the Australian Olympic Committees efforts we could not get the issue resolved in time for his travel.



All team members were given full accommodation at Sydney University and attended the very enjoyable opening ceremony with exciting entertainment. At the event we had entered and given opportunity to swim as many events as possible in the program. The last relay saw support from the Japanese team to fill a gap in the backstroke as part of the team needed to head to the airport.

I understand some questions were asked in Turkey about the selection process for the team. The Executive developed a template based upon FINA point score to enable the selection of the most competitive group for the team. Whilst recognizing that this is not always possible to achieve we included all Federations that normally compete at Championships. This of course includes some federations who are currently not direct members of Oceania but are our neighbours. The team size was determined based upon the likely travel costs. Also it was not based just on an individual time for an event as some of the information was not as full as we would have liked the selection panel looked at the broad range of events as the basis to ensure maximum use of the event for those selected.

If any Federation has concerns or wishes to express ways of improving the selection process would be happy to hear from you.

It is important to note that Swimming Australia provided finance to cover the cost of the tickets for all the team members and Coaching staff who attended. This is a significant cost that Oceania would not be able to meet on its own. Further NSW Swimming provided Darren Howard to manage to the team which gave local knowledge but also allowed Paul and Suzie to concentrate on the coaching aspects.

It should also be noted that a number of parents travelled to the event at their own cost to support the team and were active in the vocal support throughout the meet. The Coaches also gained great experience from the event and certainly looked after the team in ensuring participation.

FIJI is inviting all swimmers to participate in their Fiji Nationals, short course and long course every year. In early 2012, swimmers from the FSM and Samoa competed. Representing Fiji at the World Short course in Turkey were Caroline Puamau, Tieri Erasito and Paul Elaisa. Douglas Miller is now going to school and competing for lowa Central College.

At Fiji's recent Annual Awards, congratulations go to Fiji Swimmers of the Year Matellita Buadromo, Douglas Miller and Paul Elaisa, also Coach of the Year awards to Paula Cokanasiga and Team of the Year the Suva Tritons.

The REPUBLIC OF THE MARSHALL
ISLANDS held their first National Swimming
Championships over the Thanksgiving
holiday. The Federation sent Giordan Harris,
Angela Kendrick and Annie Hepler to the
Worlds in Turkey. The RMI also notes that
Giordan Harris is currently attending school
and training at the Spire Institute in Geneva,
Ohio.

The NORTHERN MARIANA ISLANDS sent three swimmers to Turkey, Rezne Wong, Victoria Chensakova and Kenuske Kimura. They have conducted local meets and open water swims for the two swim clubs and visiting guests. The Saipan Swim Club invites swimmers, age group and masters to their annual Saipan Invitational Swim Meet and Saipan Ocean Swim March 23 and 24, 2013.

GUAM hosted USA Coach Rick Powers for a short visit on his way from Palau. Guam plans some great upcoming meets and the best is a Pentathlon Meet scheduled for April 6, 2013. In this event, every swimmer swims the four strokes of an IM, plus the IM. Winners are the swimmers with the best overall results. When Bill Sakovich coached Saipan, he stated this meet was the highlight of the season, competitive and fun, and Guam is inviting swimmers from the region to participate in this competition. Guam sent Amanda Poppe, Danielle Atoigue, Johnny Rivera and Chris Duenas to the World Short Course.

<u>PALAU</u> sent three swimmers to Istanbul, Sean Wallace, Roylin Akiwo and UB Misech. Palau Swimming is promoting swimming throughout the islands with their "Bemesemau" program, a series of competitions from beginner events to standard course events. Plans are to take swimmers to compete on Guam in May next year. PSA invites visitors to the annual Palau Pacific Resort Open Water Swim June 9, 2013. Rick Powers conducted a successful FINA Development Clinic last month.
