WEEK TWO UNDER THE BELT

Apologies for the late distribution of the second issue of the Mid-Week Newsletter! Honestly we've been flat-out busy. But we're starting to get things under control and back in routine.

PLAYERS PLAYING IN MULTIPLE GRADES

You may recall that I mentioned on the WBA website and emailed out to all team contacts about players who play in multiple grades (most of whom have been identified) and for these players they will need to decide after Week 3 if they play up or stay down.

This stemmed primarily from teams' feedback that participated last year that there were teams stacking better players from the top grades.

However, thanks to the feedback from some of you in this current league a compromise will be made. We will allow players to play in multiple grades in this current Term 1 except for the following:

 If you are playing in A/B-Grade you CANNOT play in the D-Grade. This will be effective immediately.

We're aware of the players that will be affected by the above clause, which by the way it's a minority, so please make up your mind before the week kicks off on Week 4. Score sheets will reflect the players by their name being colour coded so we can approach you for your decision.

It also helps that the draw is set in a way that the initial rounds were "grading" rounds, allowing more even teams to be competing each other leading up to the playoffs. This is the format we will be using for all future competitions going forward.

We are at the venue every night and totally approachable for any questions or guidance.

UNIFORM REGULATIONS

It's good to see that teams are starting to tidy up their team uniforms. Word is a few teams have ordered their kits so we can't wait to see their "flash" new uniforms.

Remember next week is the last week to ensure that your uniforms meet the regulations. Namely:

- No T-shirts under the playing singlet (unless you have a medical certificate and if that is the case the T-shirt must be the same colour as the playing singlet).
- Numbers front and back of your playing singlet if teams are working towards this please let us know
- No jewellery of any kind to be worn while playing no bling-bling's!
- No skin tights worn under the uniforms (unless a medical certificate is provided. Under no circumstances are <u>track-suit pants</u> to be worn during a game - playing shorts only.

We can provide limited sets of uniform tops to hire for the season at \$30.00 or on the night \$10.00. If you lose a shirt it's a \$100.00 (to replace the set). There are many good suppliers of uniforms available so feel free to contact us for more information.

TEAM FEES

Team Fees are due by the end of Week 4, Thursday 28 February as per the invoice from WBA that you would have received.

It's very important that you make contact or come and see me if you feel your team may require a little bit more time to make full payment of the fees.

PLAYER OF THE MATCH "AWARD"

Something new that we're implementing is this popular awards system. Each game will have a "Player of the Match (POM)" acknowledgement given (worth 1 point) which will appear in each weekly newsletter as part of the game reports. From the list of "POM" acknowledgements, a "Power Player Rank" award will be announced and presented each month. The award will also be a factor in determining the Most Valuable Player at the end of the Grand Finals.

The criteria are as follows:
