AFL Victoria's talent pathway

OPPORTUNITY, tuition and development are among the key planks in AFL Victoria's talented player pathway.

Ample evidence is found on many levels and tiers of the game in Victoria, most particularly at TAC Cup and Peter Jackson VFL level.

Providing the best possible environment in terms of infrastructure, resources and coaching expertise is a pillar of the resounding success of the TAC Cup now for 22 years.

It's well documented how the TAC Cup annually provides about 50 per cent of players selected at the NAB AFL Draft and the immediate success of graduates to step seamlessly into the game's elite level reflects on the players education and preparation.

Already this season we have seen Oliver Wines, a product of the Bendigo Pioneers who played for Vic Country in the NAB AFL U18 Championships, and former Eastern Ranges player Aaron Mullett, both be recognised with NAB AFL Rising Star nominations.

Before the season is over many other TAC Cup graduates will join Wines and Mullett to be in contention for one of the game's most coveted awards.

Under-pinning the progression of aspiring young players has been the various Academies AFL Victoria implemented – at Under 16, 17 and 18 age groups – and the accompanying specialized coaching and education on a raft of levels from diet, nutrition, injury prevention, rehab and time management.

Just last year AFL Victoria introduced the VFL Academy, which extended an opportunity for emerging young players to enhance their game.

It's worth noting that the initial VFL Academy included Dean Towers (North Ballarat), Jack Frost (Williamstown)

and Kyle Hartigan (Werribee) who were selected at either the AFL November or Rookie Drafts at the end of the year.

Former Geelong and St Kilda ruckman Darren Flanigan, who spent the best part of a decade as Dandenong Stingrays Regional Manager, is the new VFL Academy coach.

Flanigan has recently completed the arduous task of trimming down a prospective list of about 80 players to a squad of 18 after consultation with VFL club coaches, TAC Cup coaches and Talent Managers as well as AFL club recruiting departments.

Many of the VFL Academy are TAC Cup graduates from last season who could consider themselves unlucky not to have been selected at one of the various AFL Drafts while others are players who, for a variety of reasons, did not play in the TAC Cup.

An individual development plan will be tailored for each VFL Academy member in addition to the development experiences and the high quality coaching already offered at Peter Jackson VFL clubs.

It underlines the commitment of AFL Victoria to provide Victorian players the opportunity, tuition and development so they can maximize their talent and give them the chance to take their game to a new level.

FraneTic looking forward

AIDAN Franetic is a premiership member of Oakleigh Chargers most extraordinary TAC Cup Grand Final, but he's already locked that memory in a vault.

Franetic, one of the Chargers' stars from the match, is unsure when he will revisit that 'golden point' victory in extra time against Gippsland Power.

As much as Franetic is still amazed at how Oakleigh came back from two goals down with about five minutes to go, he's not allowing himself to live in memory lane.

He's not sure when he'll reminisce, but, it certainly isn't on the horizon this season.

"I'm not really trying to focus on the past, I'm just looking towards this year," Franetic said.

"There are a few players back from last year, but basically it's a whole new group of kids. We're trying to focus on this year and go back-to-back if we can.

"I'm not concentrating on the past. This group has to forge its own reputation.

"We can't live off what the team did last year. It's a different team."

What hasn't changed in season 2013 is that Franetic continues to be a pivotal play maker for Oakleigh as evidenced by his best-on-ground display against, you've guessed it, Gippsland Power.

Franetic again shut down the Power's prospects of victory with a brilliant game in his new midfield role in another thriller.

Chargers' coach Justin Wenke has pushed Franetic into the midfield although he's moving him forward for periods.

As Oakleigh emerged with a five-point win against Gippsland in its Round 2 clash, Franetic was awarded the maximum TAC Cup Coaches Award votes.

Franetic gathered 26 possessions, nine hand ball receives, laid five tackles, grabbed four marks and capped off his dominant game with two goals.

The new role sits well with Franetic, who enjoys his forays forward.

"I've been happy I've been able to hit the score board this year in most games," Franetic said.

"It's helped my game that I've been able to get the football and hit the scoreboard."

During pre-season Franetic spent time working on his strength, but in reality it's his first proper pre-season.

Last year he went to Germany for 10 weeks and it's hard to train in the snow, while two seasons ago he was troubled with a groin problem.

"It's the first time I've been able to get a bit of strength and fitness on me. I did a lot of work pre-Christmas in the gym," he said.

"I've noticed it's helped me in the midfield this year. I've got a lot more strength, it's given me more confidence around a contest, and it's made it easier."

Franetic will miss a 10-week chunk of the Chargers season as he fulfills his school commitments at Scotch College.

But, he will be back for the run home into the finals where he hopes Oakleigh can provide another memory.

From cricket to football for Merrett

ZACH Merrett causes headaches on sporting fields the year round.

Bowlers can't get the ball past his blazing bat and football opponents can't keep the ball out of his hands.

One day after he belted 89 for Melbourne Grammar in an APS match, Merrett backed up with a standout performance for the Sandringham Dragons in the TAC Cup season opener.

Merrett said he thoroughly enjoyed the cricket season, but now can't wait to immerse himself in football.

Merrett kicked two goals as the Dragons defeated Western Jets and he's been made a quick and seamless transition from cricket to football.

Sandringham coach Justin Plapp described as "scintillating" the opening to the football season by Merrett.

It followed on from an APS XI season where he scored 487 runs and that was just from 10 games!

Initially, Merrett was in Geelong Falcons' squad last year, but when he began to board at Melbourne Grammar he switched over to the Dragons as the travelling made it impossible for him to commute to and from Geelong for training.

What particularly impresses Plapp is the high efficiency rate Merrett runs at with his disposals. "It's somewhere in the 90s," enthused the Dragons coach.

"He's a highly talented left footer. He's been playing half forward and rolling through the midfield," Plapp said.

"Zach has explosive speed, has really good lateral vision and makes really good decisions. He's pretty exciting."

As the Dragons slugged out a draw, Merrett emerged as the recipient of the most votes in the TAC Cup Coaches Award votes.

Merrett collected 17 possessions, took seven handballs received, grabbed six marks and affected four tackles.

And, by his own admission, Merrett said he's not near his peak fitness.

"I'm hoping to run out the season better this year," Merrett said.

"I didn't really have a pre-season last year and I ran out of puff."

While he plays with the Dragons, Merrett, whose family comes from Cobden, is eligible to play with Vic Country in the NAB AFL U18 Championships.

It's a driving force for Merrett, who must return to school commitments later this month.

"I'd love to play for Vic Country and really just enjoy my footy," Merrett said.

And, we've seen what happens when Merrett enjoys his sport.

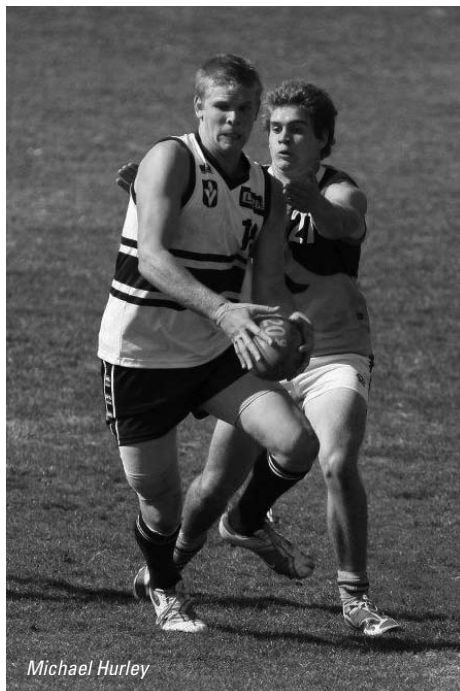
ROUND FOUR, 2008

Round four TAC Cup action saw four of the six metro regions take the points. Jack Fitzpatrick received the five votes in the TAC Cup Coaches Award with seven-goal performance for the Western Jets against the Northern Territory. Only one point separated the two sides at half time, before the Jets kicked 11 goals to five in the second half to take a 34-point win. Jordan Robbins, Jayden Post and Nathan Schroder were amongst the best for Western, while Mitch Banner kick three goals. For NT, Steven Motlop also kicked three goals.

The Eastern Ranges kept the Gippsland Power at arm's length all day recording six point win. Grant Lofthouse led the way up forward with six goals, whilst Leigh Kitchin,

Jayden Cass and Sam Blease all kicked two each. Amongst the best for the Ranges were Jordan Gysberts, Blease and Lofthouse, whilst for the Power, their best were Jaryd Blair and John Butcher.

The Oakleigh Chargers came from seven points down at three quarter time to continue their undefeated start to the season by beating Queensland by 24 points, with a seven goal to nil final term. Josh Scipione led the way for the Chargers with three goals, whilst Mark Weekes, Matt Kilpin and Luke Shuey were amongst their best.

Michael Hurley was the catalyst for the Northern Knights 43-point win over Dandenong, kicking six goals in a best on ground performance. The Knights trailed by 14 points at quarter time, but a 10-goal to four second term got them the lead which they never relinquished. David Zaharakis, Dylan Grimes and Kane Lambert were amongst the best for Northern, whilst Ryan Bastinac, Matt Clark and Michael Hibberd were named best for the Stingrays.

Iaccarino gains extra season

FOR David Iaccarino the news that he had the opportunity to play an additional season in the TAC Cup was one to be seized.

Western Jets' Talent Manager Shane Sexton delivered the news at the end of last season that Iaccarino had the chance to play the 2013 season as one of the club's 19-year-olds.

Certainly, Iaccarino didn't need much think music before deciding to take up the offer.

Jets' coach Torin Baker said Iaccarino, who was limited to just 10 games last season because of school commitments, hadn't received the same chance as many other players to showcase his potential.

Baker said Iaccarino showed enough quality when he did play last season to suggest that he would benefit from another season in the TAC Cup season.

Iaccarino endured a shoulder reconstruction in 2011 following the first intra-club match, which erased his 'bottom age' season with the Jets.

While he played 10 games last season, the Jets' coaching staff and officials believed Iaccarino, given his injury-

interrupted time would derive great benefit from another season in the TAC Cup.

"They felt I had not fully reached my potential," Iaccarino said.

"It was really good to know the club supported and had faith in me.

"Shane (Sexton, the Jets Talent Manager) was always supportive when I hurt my shoulder and he has always been positive.

"He pretty much told me straight away after the season that they wanted me back. I was pretty excited to come back for another year."

Iaccarino said he's not troubled by his shoulder and has the confidence to tackle any situation with thinking about how it will hold up.

Baker has Iaccarino playing midfield and it was in that role that he proved decisive in the club's two-point win against Calder Cannons.

Iaccarino collected 30 possessions, took nine handball received and as many marks and even had a hit-out in a performance that saw him awarded the maximum TAC Cup votes.

"In such a tight game, his ability to win the contested footy – he had 13 contested ball – and his use of the footy was fantastic as well," Baker said.

"He is just a guy who keeps going all day. He is fantastic in one-on-one contests and he is such a versatile player who can play down back and in the midfield and I'm sure if we threw him down forward he could kick some goals for us as well."

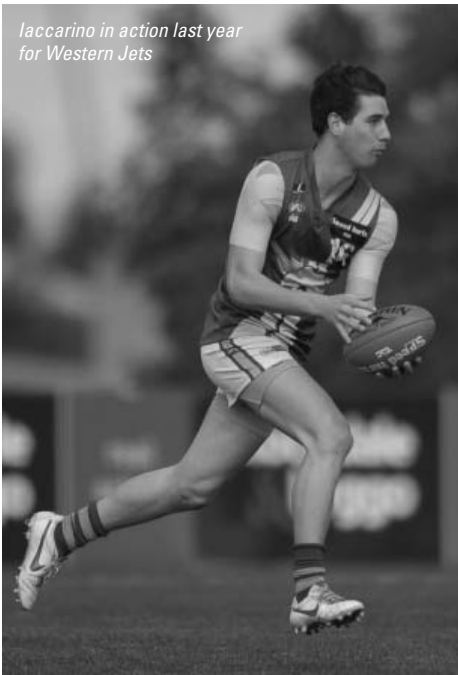
Certainly, Iaccarino's experience and physical strength has been telling in the early stages of the season.

"It was good to get a win over our rivals Calder and also get a few possessions at the same time," Iaccarino said.

"I was fortunate enough for some of my teammates to win the ball and feed it out to me. I've got them to thank."

Not to mention the Jets' hierarchy who believed in him to give him another TAC Cup season.

Mullett a Rising Star nominee



Former Eastern Ranges' player Aaron Mullett was the Round Two NAB AFL Rising Star nominee. Now with the North Melbourne Football Club, Mullett played two great games to open the season for the Kangaroos, with his game against the Geelong Cats - where he kicked a goal, had six tackles, five marks and 21 possessions – earning him his nomination.

Against Collingwood in Round One he also impressed with 22 possessions and a goal. The 21-year-old defender possesses an accurate left foot, great speed and is a strong overhead mark.

He played four of the first six games last year and after a strong season in the VFL with North Ballarat, was recalled to the North Melbourne team in Round 19 and again in Round 23. He started the 2013 season with nine career AFL games and has played in all of the Kangaroos matches this season.

North Melbourne coach Brad Scott said Mullett's good form is reward for the hard work which saw him elevated to the club's senior list.

"Aaron has had a really great pre-season this year and we're pleased with how he's developing and maturing as a player. He has worked hard to apply himself and improve on the natural skill and football attributes which he has," Scott said.

Mullett was selection 24 in the 2011 NAB AFL Rookie Draft. He was promoted to the senior list as selection 91 of the 2012 NAB AFL Draft.

He was recruited from the Mooroolbark Football Club and the Eastern Ranges. He represented Vic Metro in the 2010 NAB AFL Under-18 Championships.

Mullett won the North Melbourne's 2012 best clubman and community service awards.

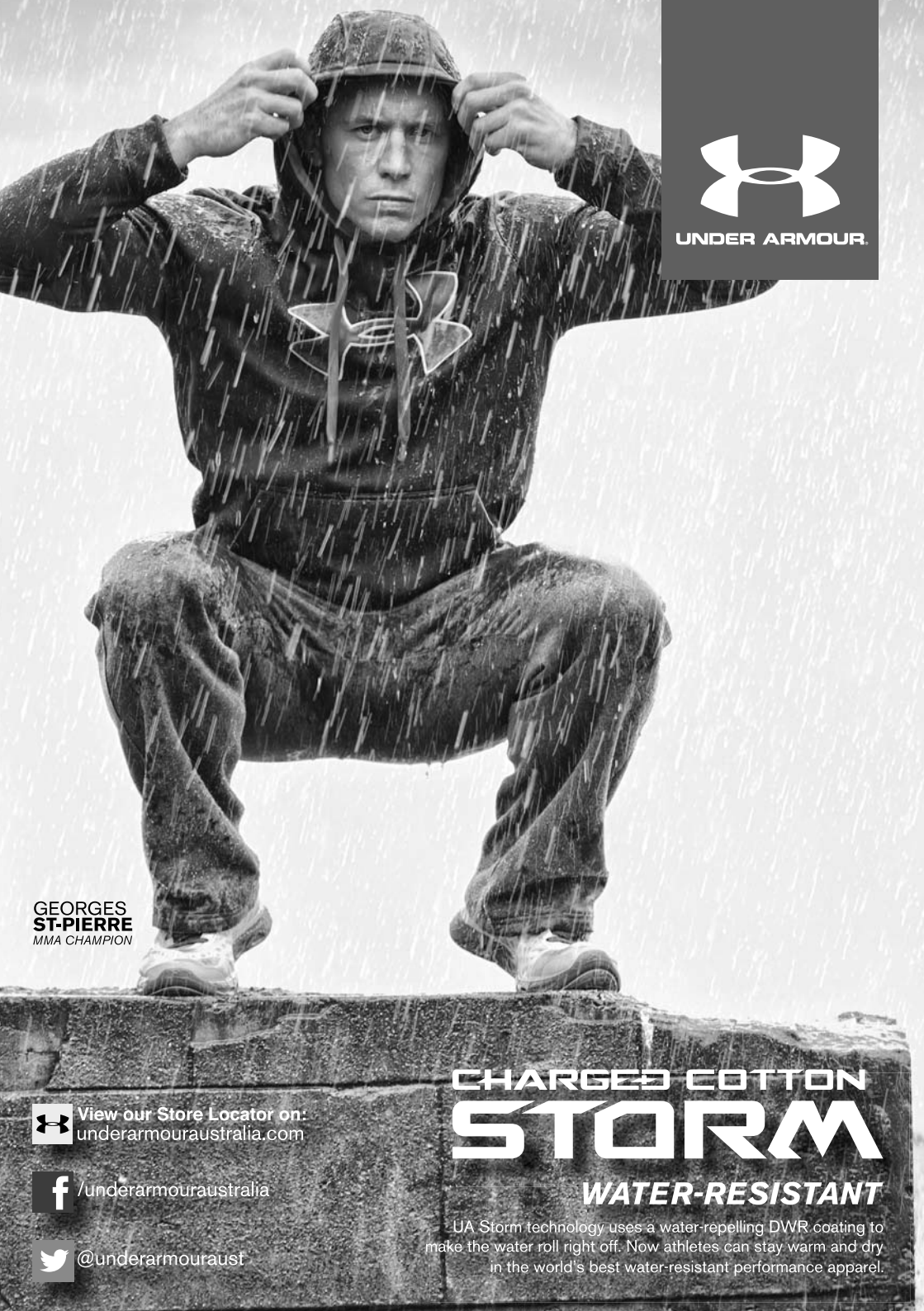
He is the second former TAC Cup player to receive a nomination in season 2013, with former Bendigo Pioneers player Ollie Wines receiving the Round 1 nomination.

Following each round of the home and away season, a panel of judges will select a NAB AFL Rising Star nominee. At the completion of the season, one of these nominees will be chosen as the 2013 NAB AFL Rising Star.

The 2013 NAB AFL Rising Star winner will be awarded the Ron Evans Medal and a \$20,000 personal investment folio and a dedicated personal banker, courtesy of NAB.

The TAC Cup radio team made the journey up the highway to the beautiful Queen Elizabeth Oval in Bendigo for the middle match of the triple header between the Murray Bushrangers and the North Ballarat Rebels. The weather was overcast, the temperature mild and a swirling breeze favoured the city end of the ground.

The first half belonged to the Bushrangers, they dominated the possession count and certainly dominated the scoreboard and the man leading the charge in both possessions and attack on the scoreboard was the Bushies number 3 in Jarman Impy. Impy started the match on fire winning the ball on numerous times inside 50 as well as setting up goals and getting a couple for himself. Key forwards Jydon Neagle and Dan Howe were proving great targets and capitalized on the good work upfield. The Rebels weren't without good players, with Louis Herbert at CHB and Kyle Hendy in the ruck doing their utmost but their inexperienced team mates were having trouble penetrating the defence and the Bushies took a 47 point lead into half time 7-9 to 0-4.

The Rebels came out after half time and found their game and with the aid of a breeze that had picked up and the move of Herbert into the midfield were able to win the third quarter 4-2 and put some respectability back on the scoreboard.

With the wind at their tails the Bushies were able to comfortably close out the game in the last quarter winning by 46 points. Murray were led by their captain Michael Gibbons who never dropped off all day, consistently racking up the possessions through the middle and Impy and Neagle who both finished with four goals each. The Bushrangers were impressive but the Rebels showed enough in the second half to suggest that when they get some of their players back, the wins won't be far away.

After the votes were tallied in the commentary box it came down to Michael Gibbons and Jarman Impy, and the skipper Gibbons got the nod by 1 vote over the electrifying Impy.

Umpires join Mates Program

Seventeen young umpires have been given the chance of a lifetime after being inducted into AFL Victoria's 2013 'Mates' Program.

The program, now in its eighth year, pairs AFL field umpires with up and coming whistle blowers to help in their development and provide them with a first-hand look at what it takes to officiate at the elite level.

AFL umpires' coach Rowan Sawers launched the program at a special function recently which gave the seven participating AFL field umpires a chance to meet the budding umpires who they will be mentoring in 2013.

Over the duration of the season, the young officials, who range between the ages of 16 and 25, will speak regularly with their AFL mentor and develop their umpiring game plan.

Sawers, who has been the AFL Umpires' coach for 16 years after retiring with 431 senior games under his belt, said the program was extremely beneficial for all parties involved.

"The feedback we get from the 'Mates' Program is always really positive," Sawers said.

"The best example is Troy Pannel, who has been involved for a number of years and sees it as a great opportunity to give back to grass roots football."

The AFL umpires will get together with their 'mates' four or five times for the year and speak to them regularly about all facets of umpiring and the challenges that come with it. Along with Pannel; Ray Chamberlain, David Harris, Shane McInerney, Shane Stewart and Jason Armstrong will be involved this year, passing on their experience to a new group of eager young umpires.

"I think having someone with experience at the highest level to help guide you, and teach you along with your umpiring coaches, is a terrific opportunity," Sawers said.

McInerney, a veteran of 355 AFL games, said he was thrilled to be involved in the program again.

"This is my fifth year as a mentor and it's great to be working with guys who are just starting their umpiring career," he said.

"The young guys have been nominated by their leagues as umpires who have potential and are always really enthusiastic.

"Not only are they prepared to listen to the advice you have but more importantly prepared to put that advice into action."

One of McInerney's 'mates' this year is Martin Rodger from the Northern Football League, who is about to embark on his second season of umpiring.

The 16-year-old said it was a privilege to be able to learn from one of the best umpires in the country.

"There are a lot of people who would love to have this chance and it's great to be chosen to be part of the program," Rodger said.

"Going into my second year I'm taking my umpiring more seriously and this is a fantastic opportunity to see first-hand what an AFL umpire goes through.

"It wouldn't be easy trying to balance a full time job with umpiring in the AFL and I plan to learn as much as I can from Shane over the year."

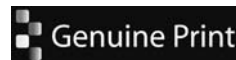

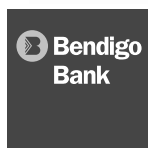

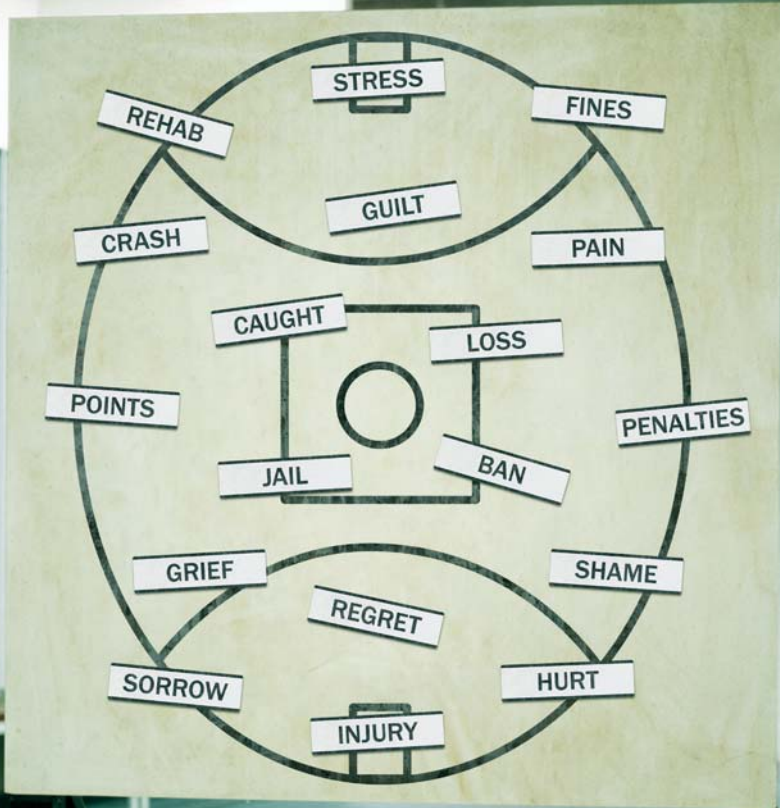
