Elastoplast Strap Smart Taping Course Program Number: 0062314

Sports Taping is an important skill for coaches, trainers, administrators, teachers, parents and players involved in sport. The Elastoplast Strap Smart course is run by an experienced presenter who is ready to help you develop your skills and knowledge in sports taping. This course offers the beginner technical and practical advice about strapping athletes and focuses on correct strapping technique to help prevent injury and assist in injury rehabilitation. Ankles, fingers and thumbs are covered in this course.

This course is suitable for athletes, coaches, trainers, teachers, parents, fitness leaders and includes theory components on anatomy, injury prevention and support and practical components including advanced strapping techniques for the knee and shoulder.

<u>Member Protection Information Officer (MPIO) face-to-face Workshop – Recognised by</u> the Australian Sports Commission (ASC) <u>Program Number: 0064244</u>

A Member Protection Information Officer (MPIO) is the person within your club responsible for providing information and options to an individual making a complaint or raising a concern, as well as support throughout this process. Having an MPIO in your sporting club/association will not only assist your sport to manage and resolve member issues and concerns, its greatest value is in the development of expertise that can promote and create a positive sporting culture for current and future members.

If you are interested in becoming a recognised MPIO for your club/association you first need to complete a free online training course followed by a face-to-face workshop. Registration for these is very simple. To start the online training simply click on the link https://learning.ausport.gov.au and look for the Play by the Rules – Member Protection Information Officer training button.

Once you have completed the online training you can enrol into your nearest face-to-face workshop. Details about the final face-to-face workshop being held in the Illawarra/South Coast region for 2013:


