1. Club Grants Funding – Category 3

Club Grants funding up to \$12M for sports clubs

Minister for Sport and Recreation, Gabrielle Upton, has encouraged sporting clubs with medium to large infrastructure plans to apply for funding as part of the Club Grants Category 3 Program, which was announced by Minister for Hospitality, Geroge Souris.

"This is an opportunity not to be missed for sporting clubs and other recreational organisations to get access to a level of funding that will allow their dreams to become a reality", Minister Upton said.

The Minister for Sport and Recreation, Gabrielle Upton, has reminded eligible sports clubs with medium to large infrastructure plans that Expressions of Interest for funding through the ClubGRANTS Category 3 Fund must be lodged by Friday 4 April.

Minister Upton said the fund, totalling \$12 million, will provide grants between \$500,000 and \$2 million to support infrastructure projects.

"This is an opportunity not to be missed for sporting clubs and other recreational organisations to get access to a level of funding that will allow their dreams to become a reality.

"Whether it is for a new clubhouse or grandstand, or an upgrade of playing or training facilities, this represents a significant funding opportunity," said Minister Upton.

Expressions of Interest must be lodged by 5pm on Friday 4 April 2014. Application forms and supporting documentation must be received by 5pm on Thursday 10 April 2014.
