Football Federation SA (FFSA) is the governing body of football in South Australia and a member of the national association, Football Federation of Australia.

FFSA is a competition administrator for all levels of the game including semi-professional and amateur men, women and junior competitions. In addition, FFSA provides administration support to all affiliated associations, who are responsible for conducting competitions for amateur men, women and juniors across South Australia.

Football Development is a key function of FFSA. Integral to football development is FFSA's commitment to service both community and elite player pathways through the implementation of participation strategies and talented player pathway programs.

In addition to player development, FFSA provides education and accreditation programs for the development of coaches and match officials. FFSA is dedicated to providing a holistic approach to the development of participants.

South Australia has a diverse multicultural population and FFSA is committed to creating opportunities for everyone to have access to football. The expansion of the game in regional areas of the state is a key pillar of FFSA's Strategic Plan.

Providing the best available facilities for the code is a priority of FFSA and the development of the Football Facility Strategic Plan aims to guide future investment by Federal, State and Local Governments to ensure that existing and future markets for football can be catered for.

- Provide access to Football Federation SA Facilities for local clubs and associations




- Establish and maintain partnerships with Federal, State and Local Governments to identify opportunities for greenfield site development and upgrade opportunities for local clubs/associations
