Jimmy was dominant in the ruck, and was able to drift forward a couple of times and take some strong marks in front of goal. Down the other end of the ground Byrnsey was rock solid as the last line of defence and was also taking some strong overhead grabs. By the end of the first quarter the Wolves were a couple of goals up and there was no doubt in any spectators minds that the Wolves had come to play...all 16 of them.

The second quarter was another very good one for us, with the lads continuing the run of good play that they had created in the first quarter through effort and commitment. Jimmy was busting packs was on fire! Danny was amassing possessions all over the ground and setting up his team mates with silky disposals, and along with Clem were providing a stack of run all over the paddock. Both



lads were also taking some screamers of their own and creating some exciting ball movement from one end of the ground to the other. By half time the Wolves held a couple of goals break over the Jags. Decklyn was working hard and providing lots of run from the backline up the ground and Tom was tackling everything in sight and was instrumental in repelling many attacks from Jindalee. The lads played extremely well, there were many fine individual performances and some of the marking, team work and ball movement was exciting to watch, and definitely very pleasing from a coaches perspective. There was so many positives to take away from this and the team has set themselves a high benchmark for the rest of the season, which should see many more cracking games ahead. It was also really satisfying to see the boys in very good spirits despite the result, which tells me they enjoyed themselves and can be well satisfied with their efforts.

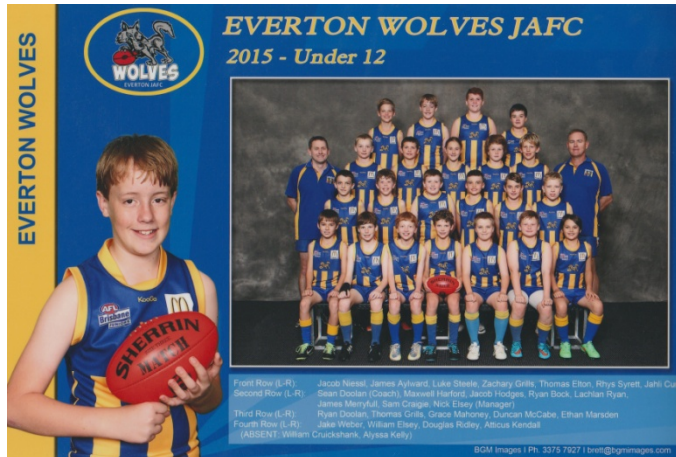
