WRFL Media and Communications manager Kristen Alebakis caught up with all the Division 1, 2 and 3 teams playing Finals Footy this weekend. Find out what they have to say below:

DIVISION 1



DEER PARK

"There's no doubt that playing September footy was the benchmark this year," Tim Quick said.

"We have a massive opportunity to create history with a fourth consecutive flag, and without looking too far ahead, it would be a great representation for all the hard work that has been put in, both on and off the field.

"It's the most exciting time of the year for local footy and we believe we've got the winning formula in place to give back to the club, supporters, and the players, in the form of another premiership."



HOPPERS CROSSING

"We are really excited, we have had a pretty good season, we have given ourselves a really good shot at going deep into the finals, so we are really looking forward to it," Matt Ryan said.

"It would mean everything (to win the premiership), we had a long pre-season, we train really hard. This is what we play footy for, so we are really looking forward to setting up ourselves this week and going deep into the finals."



WERRIBEE DISTRICTS

"Our season has been a bit inconsistent than what we would have liked, it has been up and down, but we think we have a strong team that can take us into finals," Brent Morrow said.

"We are definitely after some retribution, we can't think about getting there (the Grand Final), we just need to win the first week and keep chipping away."



ALTONA

"It is always great to be playing at this time of the year, every team aims to make finals firstly and then go as far as they can," Joel

Magnabosco said.

"We are playing Spotty this weekend and that's our first goal to knock them off and see how far we go."

"At the start of the season we said we wanted to do better than last season, we had eight wins last year, we got nine this year, finished fifth last year, fourth this year, so we are in a good spot."



SPOTSWOOD

"It is a bit of the unknown, we are quite a young list, we are going to take it week by week, it is a pretty standard response, but everything is do or die for us, we play Altona this week, we can hopefully get through that and either face Hoppers or Werribee," Murray Boyd said.

"We haven't been as consistent as we would have liked, but in saying that we have built some momentum, we have had four wins a row now and that's all you can ask for heading into finals."

DIVISION 2



NORTH FOOTSCRAY

"It is a great feeling, we set ourselves the goal of finishing top two at the start of the year, we knew we picked up a few handy players at the start of the year, so that was the aim. We are looking to go all the way now," Sam Kater said.

"Finishing top two gives us that double chance, but obviously the main aim is to win it. We want to win this weekend and have the week off and wait and see who we play from there."



2016 WRFL ROAD TO GLORY FINAL 4 SYSTEM





BIG WIN GIFTS ALTONA SECOND SPOT

CORY Connor's eight goals helped Sunshine romp to a 17.12. (114) to 3.3. (21) over Wyndhamvale last weekend.

The big win ensured Sunshine of its place in the top four, finishing a game ahead of fifth-placed Deer Park.

For Wyndhamvale, the 93-point loss brings to a close its horrendous season, as they finished last, winning zero games and finishing with the competition's worst points scoring for and against.

The Roos ended the season in fourth place, as they did in 2015, despite one more loss.

Sunshine will battle it out with the Lions in an Elimination Final at Burbank Oval in Williamstown, with the loser's season and hunt for the premiership over.

Ahead of its clash with Sunshine, Deer Park thrashed St Albans, despite a half-time lead of just 24 points.

Fourteen second half goals for Deer Park highlighted the gulf between those playing finals and those watching them.

The 20.14. (134) to 4.8. (32) victory was the Lions' ninth of the season, a three game improvement from last season.

The Saints showed why they finished five wins behind the last finals spot as they were outworked and showed little motivation to finish its season on a high note.

Particularly disappointing would be its drop off from last year, as the Saints won eight less games than 2015 and finished three spots lower on the ladder.

Altona's massive 24.9. (153) to 2.2. (14) win over Albion has helped it leapfrog the Werribee Districts and finish the 2016 regular season in second place.

Four Vikings players individually kicked more goals than the entire Cats side, showing just how dominant the home side were.

Albion won one more game this year than last, finishing in eighth in both seasons.

The 139-point mauling gives Altona five more wins than last season and a final against the aforementioned Districts, as the two sides will fight it out at Avalon Airport Oval for the right to face Hoppers Crossing in the second week of the finals.

The Districts will enter its matchup with Altona on the back of a comfortable 9.11. (65) to 5.8. (38) win against Spotswood.

Six goals over the second and third terms was enough to seal the win for the Districts, who improved its season record from 2015 by one win.

The Woodsmen ended its disappointing season as they did last year in seventh place.

THE final weekend of the regular season saw some teams make a statement heading into the WRFL finals.

Tarneit solidified their minor premierships by thumping the Braybrook Bombers to the tune of 119-points.

Their victory saw them finish atop the ladder, two games clear and in the driver's seat for the knockout stages of the year.

Losing just a solitary match for the whole of 2016, Tarneit are deserved minor premiers and will be very difficult to topple in the coming weeks.

They fired a warning shot to the rest of the contenders, defeating Newport Power by 75-points.

JUST the other day, one of the observers for the WRFL umpires had mislaid his new pair of binoculars. After looking in all the usual places, he still couldn't locate them.

In desperation he dug up his late father's old binoculars that had been in storage for the last seven years.

They were twice as big and three times the weight as his own pair, but they provided a clearer and closer view. Sometimes the old is better than the new.

Last week the WRFL umpires had a reunion. It was great to see so many past and present umpires attend.

One long time goal umpire actually attended the night wearing his old white umpiring lab coat, his old white battered hat and carrying his heavy wooden flags from the early 1980s.

His appearance reflected the attire of the FDFL goalies at the time that the umpiring fraternity was just settling into their new home at Scovell Reserve.

Included in the crowd of about 80, former FDFL and present WRFL umpires were Bob Madigan, Terry McGarity, Peter Starford, Roy Hamilton, Henry McFerran, Terry O'Donnell, Paul Claughton, Graham Saville, Paul Benson, Phil Snow, Paul Saville, Richard Watt, John Sutton, Paul Battaglia, Shane Carland, Graeme Hodgart, Michael Saunders, Gordon Watt, Steve Sutton, Leo Keating, Kim Bright, Bob Gulliver and Andrew Fregonese.

There was much conversation and the tales told about the good old days clearly proved, at least in the eyes of some, that the old is much better than the new.

Part of the night was dedicated to the umpires' Hall of Fame which has been operating since about the year of 2000. Ashley Borg, now living and umpiring in Singleton in New South Wales, and Leo Keating, presently an observer of WRFL goal umpires, were both inducted into the Hall of Fame.




