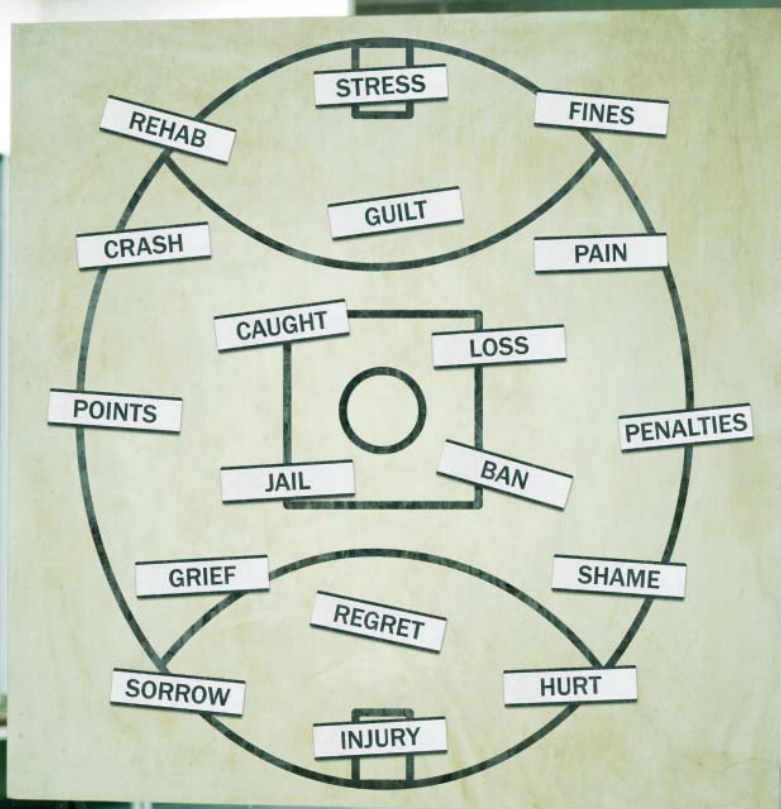

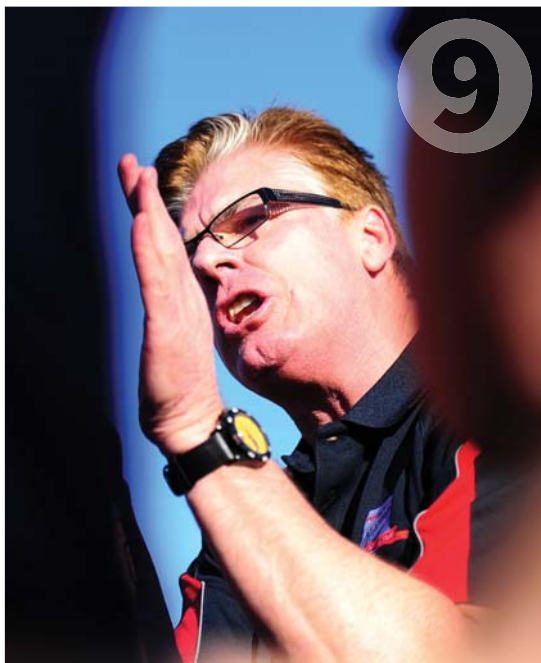

Women take centre stage

Women's football took centre stage last weekend, with the start of the Victorian Women's Football League finals and the fourth AFL Women's Exhibition game.

The AFL game between the Western Bulldogs and Melbourne, featuring 22 players and numerous coaches and staff from the VWFL, was judged an overwhelming success from the standard of football to the media coverage given to the first women's game to be broadcast on national television.

It was a landmark day for women's football, with 175,000 Victorians watching the broadcast on Channel 7 and over 7,000 people viewing the game live at Etihad Stadium.

Peter Jackson VFL broadcast partner Channel 7 should be commended for its role in promoting women's football to the masses, with Jason Bennett, Chyløe Kudas, Julia Price and Sam Lane providing quality coverage of the game.

Such was the mainstream media coverage of the match, you could not avoid knowing that the game was on – which can only help raise the profile of the female players involved.

In its third year, the game is starting to be more than just an exhibition of women's football, but a match that the general public looks forward to on an annual basis as they learn more about the stars of our game.

Names like Daisy Pearce and Katie Brennan are now regular features of the match and both displayed their star qualities in the game. Pearce, Melbourne's captain, collected 30 disposals and 221 Champion Data ranking points while Brennan almost kicked her side to victory off her own boot, adding the first four goals for the Bulldogs to get them back into the game.

They were joined by the next generation of stars like Youth Girls All Australian player Brit Bonnici and former Matildas goalkeeper Brianna Davey, who made their AFL debuts last weekend to show the future is looking bright.

The wheels are now in motion to take the next step from AFL Women's Exhibition games to a proposed national competition. AFL CEO Gillon McLachlan said it is now a matter of when and not if regarding the national competition for women, explaining post-game that AFL clubs have been canvassed for their interest in following the lead of the Western Bulldogs and Melbourne in forming women's teams.

It is certainly exciting times for women's football, especially with the majority of the VWFL players in the AFL Women's Exhibition game, who will be returning to the field back at their local clubs in the final round of Premier Division football before their finals begin next weekend.

It's a great opportunity to further support our future stars of the game.

Finally, this week in the Record we recognise key achievements by people within two TAC Cup clubs. Congratulations to North Ballarat Rebels head trainer Peter Henderson who this week brings up game 400 and to Western Jets life member Alan Hales who will conclude his variety of match-day roles at the end of the season. Well done to both on their support of up-and-coming players in the competition.

Curtains for captain Carnell



The longest-serving captain in Coburg Football Club history will hang up his boots at the end of the club's 2015 Peter Jackson VFL campaign.

Nick Carnell has led the Lions for seven of his 10 years at the club, establishing a reputation as one of the most respected and uncompromising leaders in the competition.

The 28-year-old has played 167 matches but recently started to find it difficult to balance the increasingly professional demands of playing in the VFL with his career outside football as a construction manager.

"It's something I've been dealing with the last couple of months," Carnell said.

"The VFL's moving at such a speed now where the demands on your time and your body are so great that it's very difficult to sustain.

"I think it's the right time – I feel the club's in a position now where it can quite easily stand on its own two feet from a leadership point-of-view with a lot of the guys we've got around.

"We've got a really good culture and a really good group of guys who can take the club forward now."

However, Carnell's leadership ability doesn't look like being lost to the game.

In his 13 matches for the Lions this season, the four-time club leading goalkicker has acted as an on-field coach for the forward line group and said coaching was a role he was thinking about exploring in the future.

"It's something I've really enjoyed," Carnell said of his role this season.

"We've found it really useful from a team perspective, as I've got a really good handle on where things are at on the ground and I know what the guys want up in the coaching box.

"I'm going to take some time to miss footy a little bit

– get away from it for a touch – but there'll be some sort of footy involved next year.

“Coaching is something that's in my future, but the time commitment you need to spend on coaching is just as much as playing, so that's where the difficulty lies.”

Carnell requires a shoulder reconstruction once the season is over and said after taking some time off to refresh his body, he wouldn't be going too far from the club both he and his wife love to be part of.

But he would, however, miss some of the day-to-day things associated with being a player.

“(I'll miss) the showers – having a shower after training or a game and talking to the boys in there, and the change room banter,” Carnell said.

“My old man still drives me to every game; he picks me up in the morning and it's just a good opportunity to catch up with him.

“That's a little thing I probably take for granted at the moment, but I know I'll miss that interaction.”

Carnell said playing in the 2007 Grand Final in his second season, when Coburg lost to a powerful Geelong outfit, was one of the best moments in his career – even if he didn't appreciate it as much as he thinks he should have.

Other moments will probably be told to the grandkids for different reasons.

“I kicked seven goals against Frankston one day with a broken hand – that's always a good little story to tell,” Carnell laughs.

“I broke it in the first quarter but I didn't know until I had an X-ray.”

The Greensborough product thinks he was playing his best football in his early 20s, when then-coach Andy Collins played him as a tagger on the opposition's best midfielders.

“I just enjoyed the contest and the competitive nature that comes with having that role and the challenge of trying to beat the best players in the league,” Carnell said.

“It was a really good challenge and I set myself every week for it – to hold them to 10 or 12 touches and get 20 of your own was a real win for me.”

Since that time, Carnell has experienced life in both an AFL-aligned and standalone VFL club after Coburg's partnership with Richmond ended ahead of the 2014 season.

He said the Lions' first victory as a standalone club in Round 5 last year meant a lot to everyone involved.

“That was a highlight for us, because no one backed us in,” Carnell said.

“It was good to get that one out of the way – it gave us confidence in the weeks after to keep winning games of footy, which was really important for our young group.”

That group has kept developing in 2015, to the point where it's possible that Carnell's farewell match could now be in September's finals series.

While he would “give anything” to play in another Grand Final, Carnell is just happy to have added value to his football club during his time there.

“A couple of years ago I was tossing up where my future was at and whether or not it was at Coburg, and the underlying factor in why I stayed was that I wouldn't be leaving the place better than I found it,” he said.

“We're now standalone and in a really healthy position, we've got some really good people in place now who can take the club forward and we have a really good culture.

“I take comfort now in the fact that the club would almost be better off without me.”

End of the line for a Jets stalwart

Western Jets life member Alan Hales will make his last train trip to watch the club play when the TAC Cup home-and-away season concludes next week.

Hales has caught the train from Craigieburn to work at the club since 2001, in the role of a full-time office assistant until 2006 and in a variety of match-day roles throughout his tenure.

But his time in footy – which includes periods spent as the secretary of several Western Region FL clubs during the 1990s – will come to a close when Hales retires after Western's last match for 2015 against the Calder Cannons at Rams Arena next Saturday.

Talent Manager Shane Sexton said Hales had made an enormous contribution to the club and was named a Jets life member in 2005 on the basis of the work he'd done in just five years there.

"He'd come over from Craigieburn every day, he'd get to the club about 8.30am or 9 o'clock and he'd basically jump on the last bus or train on the way home," Sexton said.

"He did that for probably about seven or eight years, I reckon.

"He's just a super guy who had the kids at heart, wanted to see them succeed and wanted to see the club succeed.

"Everybody would have a soft spot for Al over the journey and he's dealt with some pretty impressive names over the period."

Hales said being involved with well-known Western coaches such as Garry Hocking (2003), Mark Neeld (2005-07) and Steven Kretiuk (2008-12) was a great experience.

"The biggest thrill for me was being involved and being able to help the boys to meet their full potential," Hales said.



400 up for Henderson

North Ballarat Rebels head trainer Peter Henderson is showing the kind of longevity he's helped current AFL champions achieve.

Henderson will be involved in his 400th TAC Cup game on Saturday when the Rebels face the Calder Cannons at Eureka Stadium.

He started volunteering at the club in 1993 and has treated and assisted AFL players such as Sydney 367-gamer Adam Goodes and North Melbourne 287-gamer Drew Petrie.

North Ballarat's Talent Manager Phil Partington paid tribute to Henderson's contribution to the club.

"Not only has Peter acted as our head trainer and U16 Development Squad head trainer, he has also played an enormous role in the development of past and present players due to his knowledge and understanding of the TAC Cup," Partington said.

"He is highly regarded within the TAC Cup community and the Rebels are extremely grateful for the outstanding work and service Peter has put in over the past 23 years."

The Borough's silver lining

Due in part to a crippling injury crisis, Port Melbourne looks set to miss the Legendairy VFL Finals Series for the first time in coach Gary Ayres' eight-year reign, but there are still positives to come out of 2015 at North Port Oval.

The Borough's heartbreaking three-point loss to Footscray at VU Whitten Oval on Saturday consigned it to a 6-10 record, and its percentage relative to the eighth-placed Casey Scorpions (8-8) has effectively eliminated it from finals contention with two rounds to play.

Coach Gary Ayres lamented his team's injury toll, but said he had been able to expose several talented youngsters to senior action earlier than expected.

"We've probably had some guys who are getting a taste of senior footy a bit before their time and you'd like to be bringing them in when you have a healthy nucleus of your side, but we haven't had that," the 2011 premiership coach said.

"It's good in that they get exposure, but they also need that experience around them to make their transition a bit easier."

After starting 2015 brightly with a record of 6-4, an 11-point loss to Essendon at North Port Oval started the Borough's current chain of seven consecutive defeats.

Ayres said 20-year-old small forward Blake Pearson had been a "shining light" in the early part of the season, kicking 20 goals in his first nine games.

22-year-old Sam Gilmore is another youngster who Ayres said had stepped up, with the third-year ruckman sitting ninth in the league for total hitouts despite playing five games in the Development League.

Others have performed admirably after coming to the club during the off-season, such as key forwards Jordan Lisle (ex-Hawthorn and Brisbane) and Khan Haretuku (ex-Casey and Frankston), as well as key defender Lucas Cook (ex-Melbourne and North Ballarat).

But there's no denying the club's worrying record during its seven-match losing streak of conceding 33 goals in fourth quarters while scoring only 11 itself is due in part to missing hardened, experienced bodies on the field.



"We haven't had a great run with our injury count," Ayres said.

"Some of them are unlucky – as we know, this game is about collisions and we've had ligaments in the wrists requiring operations, broken bones, ACLs.

"You do come back to the field as a standalone VFL club when you've got six or seven of your best 12 not playing."

Among the bigger names to have missed chunks of the season are Chris Cain (eight games played), James Magner (two), Shannen Lange (two), Hugh Sandilands (11), Josh Scipione (five) and AFL recruits Leigh Osborne (10) and Dylan Van Unen (13).

Considering the off-season exodus of veterans John Baird, Sam Pleming, Shane Valenti and Marcus Marigliani, in addition to leading goalkickers Julian Rowe and Daniel Connors, 2015 was always going to be a year of transition.

But with an eye to the future, Ayres is remaining philosophical.

"There's a few things we really need to take stock of once the season's finished, because a VFL standalone team cannot have upwards of 20-odd players missing on a regular basis – it just cruels your chances," he said.

"We probably used all our luck up over the last eight years."

Chris Jones made some sort of senior debut for the Box Hill Hawks in their 50-point win over Geelong at Simonds Stadium on Saturday.

They'll be keen to end Coburg's bid for September action this weekend, but failing that, they'll still have one last chance to secure a finals spot for themselves next week against Sandringham at Trevor Barker Beach Oval.

Cockie a wounded Zebra

Sandringham captain Adam Cockie is in a race against time to be fit for the Zebras' impending finals campaign after recently suffering a serious hamstring injury.

The 26-year-old had just missed two matches with an ankle injury before tearing the hamstring at training in the week before Sandringham's Round 17 win over Port Melbourne.

Cockie will likely miss the Zebras' remaining home-and-away games against Geelong and the Casey Scorpions as they attempt to sew up a top-four spot and a double chance in the Legendairy VFL Finals Series.

According to the club's estimations, the worst-case scenario involves the former West Coast AFL player missing the first two weeks of finals.

Cockie has played 10 matches and averaged almost 23 disposals per game in 2015, last pulling on the Zebras jumper in Round 13 against Coburg.

His injury is another blow to a Sandringham midfield also missing the grunt of St Kilda hard nut Tom Curren, who could miss the rest of the season with an ankle injury.

Which of your club's AFL-listed players still need to qualify for the Legendairy VFL Finals Series?

Below is a list of AFL-listed players from finals-contending clubs in a position to qualify or be ruled ineligible for playing in the VFL finals in the remaining two rounds of the home-and-away season.

These players either need to play one or both of the remaining two matches, or cannot play another AFL match.

Round 16 Highlights

The races for the minor premiership and the last spot in September's finals series are well and truly alive after Round 16 of the TAC Cup.

The Dandenong Stingrays drew level on points with the top-of-the-table North Ballarat Rebels after defeating the Oakleigh Chargers by 42 points at Shepley Oval.

The Chargers may have been sitting in the top four before Saturday's match, but the Stingrays blew their quality opponents away with five goals to one in the second quarter to set up the win.

The Rebels have held top spot since Round 7, but in giving up a 37-point half-time lead to lose by 13 points to the Gippsland Power at Morwell Recreation Reserve, they opened the door for Dandenong to swoop in the last two rounds of the season.

Meanwhile, the finals hopes of the Sandringham Dragons are still alive after they accounted for the Western Jets by 35 points at Trevor Barker Beach Oval.

The Dragons are one game and percentage behind the eighth-placed Calder Cannons with matches against seventh-placed Gippsland (Morwell Recreation Reserve) and the fourth-placed Eastern Ranges (Rams Arena) to come.

Sandringham will need to win both those games and hope Calder loses both its clashes with North Ballarat (Eureka Stadium) and bottom-of-the-ladder Western (Rams Arena).

The Cannons had a chance to sew up their spot in September against the third-placed Murray Bushrangers at Wangaratta Showgrounds, but couldn't convert a three-point lead at the last change into the four premiership points, losing by 20.

In Round 16's other matches:

- Eastern recorded a big 124-point win over the Bendigo Pioneers at Box Hill City Oval to boost its percentage and grab fourth position from Oakleigh; and
- The Geelong Falcons kept themselves even on premiership points with Eastern and still in the race for a top-four spot by beating the Northern Knights to the tune of 52 points at Simonds Stadium.

12 Blake Hardwick has all but sewn up the 2015 TAC Cup goalkicking title after snagging 12 goals for the Eastern Ranges in their big victory over the Bendigo Pioneers. The 181cm forward has a 16-goal lead on Dandenong Stingray James Freeman with two home-and-away games to play and has now booted bags of 12, 10 and eight majors this season.

5 So how did the Gippsland Power overcome the ladder-leading North Ballarat Rebels on the weekend? Well, they simply didn't allow the Rebels to get their hands on the ball. The Power had five players collect more than 20 disposals – Aloysio Ferreira (27), Connor Amblar (26), Jackson McMahon (26), Nash Holmes (25) and Kade Renooy (25) – while North Ballarat didn't have any.

35 Clayton Oliver was named Murray's best player in the Bushrangers' comeback win against the Calder Cannons and it's no surprise why. The Mooroopna product collected 35 disposals (14 more than any teammate), had 12 clearances (eight more than any teammate) and drove the ball inside 50 six times (an equal team high).

Metro best announced

The AFL Victoria Metro Academy revealed its best and fairest player recently, with Northern Knight Jade Gresham the runaway winner.

The Vic Metro NAB AFL U18 Championships MVP finished on 60 votes, 26 ahead of Sandringham Dragon Harley Balic.

Gresham polled in all five of his U18 Championships matches, averaging 23 disposals per game and earning best-on-ground honours in the final three games to clinch the title.

Accepting the award, the Northern Knights captain said he was privileged to represent Vic Metro and meet new mates from other regions, enjoying “the challenge of playing against the best players from around Australia”.

With the Knights out of the finals race, Gresham will look for consistent form to finish the year strongly before aiming to impress at the NAB AFL Draft Combine in October.

In the other major award announced on the night, the Eastern Ranges’ Ryan Clarke walked away with the Dairy Australia Legendairry Coaches Award.

Clarke polled 22 votes in the Vic Metro best and fairest, finishing in fourth spot after averaging 19 disposals per game in his five matches.

Clarke simply wanted to have a consistent carnival in his U18 Vic Metro debut.

“It has been a great season and I have learnt a lot from this experience,” Clarke said.

“The experience that I now have from the bigger ovals and the harder opponents, I have definitely brought that back to the Eastern Ranges and school football.”

Clarke will join Gresham at the October Combine, but prior to that will help the Ranges go as deep as they can in the TAC Cup finals, with his side currently sitting in fourth spot.

Women's football the winner

Melbourne has hung on for a memorable victory in the fourth instalment of the AFL Women's Exhibition game against the Western Bulldogs at Etihad Stadium.

Leading by 31 points 12 minutes into the second quarter, the Demons were forced to watch on as the Western Bulldogs staged a Katie Brennan-led comeback, kicking five of the next six goals – four to Brennan – to just fall short by four points, Melbourne 6.4 (40) defeating the Western Bulldogs 5.6 (36).

Melbourne and Darebin Falcons captain Daisy Pearce dominated in the middle with 30 disposals and was a clear choice for the best-on-ground medal.

While the winning team was the same, this game offered so much more than the previous contests. Broadcast live on national TV on Channel 7, the match attracted 244,000 viewers – with 175,000 of those from Victoria – and received more mainstream media attention than ever before.

Early in the match however, it looked how far Melbourne as they raced out to a five-goal advantage over the winless Western Bulldogs.

The Demons had too much run off half back, as Daisy Pearce and Ebony-Rose Antonio linked through the middle to dominate the disposal count, moving into double figures before half time.

The Bulldogs needed someone to step up and the stage was set for Katie Brennan, who kicked two late goals to reduce the margin to 19 points at half time.

Melbourne was quick to reply after the long break with Kirby Bentley marking up forward to extend the margin back out to 25 points.

Brennan continued where she left off, marking strongly up forward after good work from Kaitlyn Ashmore, Steph Chiocci and Moanna Hope to set up her third and fourth goals of the game, and suddenly the Bulldogs were back within 13 points.

The game was set up for a thrilling finale with just 11 points separating the sides at the final change.

Hope kicked a goal at the 16-and-a-half-minute mark to reduce the margin to just four points, but the Bulldogs had time against them and as they pushed forward one last time, the siren sounded to give Melbourne four straight wins.

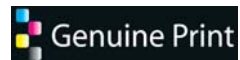
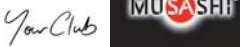

Ex-Oakleigh Charger Jordan De Goeij has been named the Round 20 NAB AFL Rising Star nominee after a tough performance for Collingwood in the Magpies' loss to Sydney at the SCG last Friday night.

The 19-year-old midfielder had 18 disposals, 12 tackles, five inside-50s and kicked a goal in the most complete performance of his debut season.

An Ashburton junior, De Goeij was selected by Collingwood with pick no.5 in the 2014 AFL Draft and made his debut in Round 1 as the substitute after an impressive NAB Cup campaign.

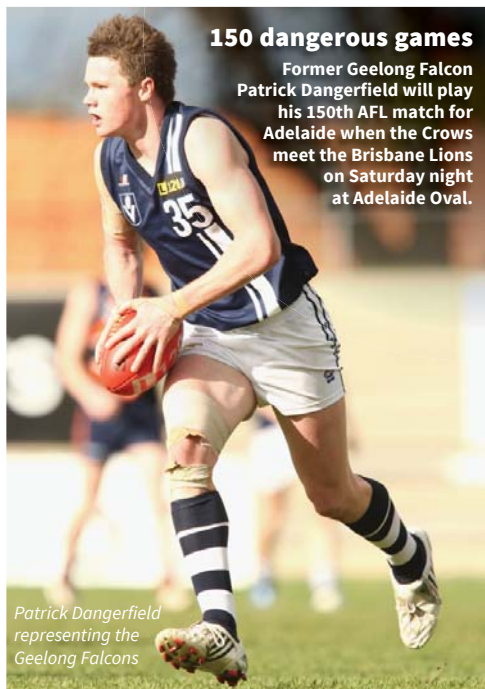
The 2014 Oakleigh premiership player and Vic Metro representative is averaging 13 disposals and five tackles per game across 13 matches this year.

150 dangerous games

Former Geelong Falcon Patrick Dangerfield will play his 150th AFL match for Adelaide when the Crows meet the Brisbane Lions on Saturday night at Adelaide Oval.

The 25-year-old has developed into one of the game's most damaging and explosive midfielders since being selected with pick no.10 at the 2007 AFL Draft.

An Anglesea junior, Dangerfield made his senior debut in Round 20, 2008 and has gone on to be named in the All Australian team in 2012 and 2013.

He finished in the top three of Adelaide's best-and-fairest award from 2012 to 2014 and looks certain to be at the pointy end of the count again this year, having put together another prolific season in the Crows' engine room.

Dangerfield's ability to win the ball in contested situations and then burst away from congestion has made his signature for 2016 highly sought after, as he remains unsigned at Adelaide for next season.

Another ex-TAC Cup player will bring up a milestone this weekend, as Will Hoskin-Elliott plays his 50th match for GWS in the Giants' clash with Sydney at Spotless Stadium on Saturday.

After playing his underage football with North Sunshine and the Western Jets, the 21-year-old was picked at no.4 in the 2011 Draft.

Hoskin-Elliott has kicked 41 goals (including 26 last year when he was second at GWS behind Jeremy Cameron for goals kicked) and has often impressed with his mix of speed and endurance.
