# A fond farewell

**The end of any football season brings with it the usual retirement announcements and club departures.**

2015 will be no different with two competition stalwarts in North Ballarat coach Gerard FitzGerald and Coburg captain Nick Carnell saying farewell to their respective clubs.

This week in the Record we pay tribute to Gerard's 19-year career within the Peter Jackson VFL and TAC Cup, as he coaches the Roosters for the final time against Coburg at Eureka Stadium.

The VFA/VFL coaching record holder leaves a lasting impression on the competition, with his tally of 345 games at the end of the season across three clubs – North Ballarat, Casey Scorpions and Port Melbourne – setting a benchmark that will be hard to surpass.

The three-time Roosters premiership coach knows the talent pathway well, providing opportunities to local players in the region at North Ballarat for 15 seasons, helping nurture and educate players both at state league and U18 level.

Across his coaching career the likes of Nathan and Mitch Brown, Isaac Smith, Nick Maxwell, Dean Towers, Josh Gibson, Stephen Clifton and Darren Jolly have all benefited from the 'Fitzy' style of coaching and gone on to play at the elite level in the AFL.

Anyone that has spoken with Gerard knows his passion for football, and his time and commitment to coaching has helped develop not only players but also coaches over his career.

Footscray premiership coach Chris Maple started his coaching career under Gerard at the North Ballarat Rebels in the TAC Cup and Box Hill Hawks premiership coach Damian Carroll played under him during his one year stint at Springvale (Casey Scorpions) in 2003.

A four-time state coach and two-time VFL Coach of the Year, Gerard has been a great ambassador for our competition, continuing to promote the value of the VFL in regional areas for not only the players but also the community. We wish him all the best in the next chapter of his coaching career.

At Coburg last weekend, Lions captain Nick Carnell said his farewells after a decade playing at the top level. Players like Nick are great role models for the many young players coming through the ranks and the TAC Cup graduates on the Lions list are sure to have benefited from the leadership and professionalism he has displayed. The respect Carnell has gained from his opponents over the years was highlighted last round when the Casey Scorpions players formed a guard of honour as he was chaired from the field in what was to be his last game in the Coburg guernsey.

Both FitzGerald and Carnell reflect the mix of quality people we have involved in our competitions and we wish both well in their future endeavours.

# Farewell to Fitzy

**One of the most decorated coaches in the history of the Peter Jackson VFL says goodbye to the club he has become synonymous with on Saturday.**

North Ballarat's triple premiership-winning mentor Gerard FitzGerald will leave the Roosters after their final match of 2015 against Coburg at Eureka Stadium as a true ambassador of the VFL competition.

He is the record-holder for most games coached in VFL history (Saturday's game will be his 345th) and is one of only four VFL/VFA coaches to have led their team to three consecutive premierships (in 2008-10).

FitzGerald started his VFL coaching journey in 1997 at North Ballarat having previously played three games at the elite level for Geelong in 1977 and coaching a variety of local country clubs while also pursuing a teaching career.

He said receiving that first opportunity at the Roosters ranked as one of the most memorable moments of his coaching career.

"The club showed faith in a country coach who wanted to continue to grow and develop as a coach – I was given a chance and I'll always cherish that," FitzGerald said.

"I've always appreciated the faith the club showed in me."

After joining the VFL in 1996, just two seasons later – in FitzGerald's second year as coach – North Ballarat

reached a preliminary final.

In 1999 and 2000, the Roosters rose further, losing Grand Finals to Springvale and Sandringham respectively, with FitzGerald being named coach of the VFL Team of the Year in 2000.

But his incredible adaptability is illustrated in the fact that during his first stint at North Ballarat from 1997 to 2002, the mission wasn't just about winning games of football.

"We were trying to build a club – and we were trying to convince people that we could do it," FitzGerald said.

"As a club based in Ballarat and taking on some clubs that had been playing for over 100 years in this competition, we had to overcome the doubts and just achieve some belief and confidence.

"Back then, coaching was more about trying to grow and develop that club from just being a part of Ballarat to being Ballarat's club."

Since that time, FitzGerald has coached Springvale in 2003, Port Melbourne in 2004 and the North Ballarat Rebels in the TAC Cup in 2005 and 2006, before returning to again take the reins at the Roosters in 2007.

Each experience has forced him to adapt as a coach,

with the Springvale job being a part-time position and Port Melbourne a full-time role, while at the Rebels he went back to dealing with kids as he had in his life as a teacher.

"I enjoyed it enormously," FitzGerald said of his two years in the TAC Cup.

"I enjoyed nurturing and developing the talent and I enjoyed being an influence on boys' lives in their 17th and 18th years.

"My teaching background helped me then and helps me even with what I'm doing today, as I prepare training, as I provide feedback and deal with the complexities of human nature."

Upon returning to coaching senior football at North Ballarat, FitzGerald had to change his game again.

It reaped rewards almost straight away, with the Roosters marching to premierships in 2008, 2009 and 2010, and FitzGerald overseeing the development of players such as Isaac Smith, Orren Stephenson, Dean Towers, Stephen Clifton and Cameron Richardson into AFL draftees.

While preferring to always look forward than reflect on the past, FitzGerald said he's proud of the results he's produced through his ability to reinvent himself as a coach.

"The game challenges you to adapt and change, and if you don't adapt and change, you'll end up withering," FitzGerald said.

"The game will change again next year from how it is now.

"Your principles and values must stay sound and you must always abide by those, but at the same time, your methodology must continue to change."

In an era when the VFL is becoming increasingly professional through the involvement of AFL clubs in the competition, every method designed to equip part-time footballers to compete with elite-level players is crucial.

The methodology will be even more vital at North Ballarat once FitzGerald is gone, as the club's partial alignment with North Melbourne ends ahead of the 2016 season.

"The difference in the competition now to when I started is considerable, and a lot of it's because of the AFL involvement," FitzGerald said.

"The AFL clubs joining our competition in 2000 demanded us (coaches) to become much more professional – to get the very best out of our boys knowing we've only got a minimum amount of time with them because they're all doing something else other than playing football."

But the challenges of coaching a modern-day VFL team hasn't stopped 'Fitzy' from doing what he does best – getting the best out of footballers by truly connecting with them.

"The relationships that I've formed, I've cherished," he said.

"It's a relationship-based industry, coaching; football clubs are about relationships and connectivity.

"I enjoy that and I've developed some fantastic relationships and am connected all over Australia as a result of my coaching.

"I'd hope that my players would say I cared – that I cared about them as footballers and I cared about them as people."





No football team should ever go into the season without their eyes on the major prize – winning a premiership.

This week Victorians were issued a challenge that will see us all working together as a team until we reach our ultimate goal of zero deaths or serious injuries on our roads.

Towards Zero sets an ambitious target, but if we're not aiming for zero we're saying to ourselves that there is an acceptable level of road trauma.

Many of you will have seen the Transport Accident Commission's new Towards Zero advertisements on television this week.

An everyday Victorian is asked what a more acceptable road toll would be. His answer is 70. He is not an actor and he is not prepared for the sight of 70 of his closest family and friends walking around the corner.

This campaign represents a new direction for the TAC, the Victorian Government and its road safety partners.

It begins with opening Victorians' minds to the reality that road trauma is not about numbers. It is about people's brothers, sisters, mothers, fathers, teammates and colleagues and not one of them should die or be seriously injured just because they use our roads.

But Towards Zero is not just a new campaign. It is a fresh approach to road trauma reduction and every Victorian has a role to play, whether you're playing back pocket for the local footy team, you're in business, politics or the everyday person in the street.

We know people make mistakes but we also know that if Victorians are safer drivers, safer pedestrians and safer riders, these mistakes will be less frequent and the consequences less severe.

If, for example, people are driving a car with a five-star ANCAP safety rating, there will be a host of vehicle safety features that will intervene in the event of a mistake to prevent an accident or cushion the vehicle occupants from death or injury.

If they are travelling at safer speeds, the forces involved will be reduced along with the risk of hurting themselves.

Road design also has a big part to play in the march Towards Zero and Victorians will see unprecedented spending on safer roads infrastructure in coming years.

The TAC recognises the power of football in reaching out to Victorians and we see our continued relationships with AFL Victoria and the TAC Cup as playing an important role in Towards Zero.

We'd like everyone in the footballing community, whether you're a fan, a coach, a parent or a player to think about what is important you and make a commitment to be safe every time you use the roads.

There is no one someone won't miss.

## Cole cuts it at upper levels

Tom Cole certainly hasn't felt out of place stepping up from TAC Cup level to the Peter Jackson VFL this year.



The 18-year-old Bendigo Pioneers defender/midfielder has represented Geelong's VFL side three times in 2015, being named in the team's best players twice.

After spending most of the season in Bendigo's midfield, Cole has relished the chance to return to half back at the Cats, a position he played as a bottom-ager at the Pioneers last year and where he said he's "probably more settled".

"I've played a lot in the midfield this year and not a lot down back, so getting to play down back with the Cats has been good," Cole said.

"They've just sort of let me play my natural game and try to do what I do best, and I think the players around me have really helped too."

Cole had 17 disposals at 100 per cent efficiency and took eight marks in Geelong's 28-point loss to second-placed Sandringham at Trevor Barker Beach Oval on Sunday, receiving on-field advice from AFL-listed Cats such as Josh Cowan and Cameron Delaney.

The AFL Academy member said playing at senior state level was "a pretty nervy experience" at first, but he has clearly adapted quickly.

After also representing Geelong in Round 4 and Round 17 of the VFL season, Cole has found the experiences allowed him to return with added confidence to TAC Cup level, where he's averaging over 25 disposals and six tackles per game in eight matches.

"I don't think the pace of the game is a lot different at VFL level – it's just the bigger bodies," Cole said.

"It's harder to win your own ball I suppose... but it makes it a lot easier to do so at TAC Cup level, so I think learning how to deal with that (in the VFL) even helps you play against kids your own size."

Cole has had senior football experience previously too, at local level for Sandhurst in the Bendigo Football League.

Last year, he even played in a Grand Final against a Strathfieldsaye side boasting ex-St Kilda sharpshooter Stephen Milne, who booted six goals to help sink Sandhurst by 55 points.

Cole got a first-hand look at how the former Saints star goes about his business.

"I played on him for a little bit, but not a lot," he said.

"I think he kicked one (goal) on me, but they took me off him after that."

Not to be deterred, Cole has taken all before him in 2015, compiling performances with both the Pioneers and Vic Country that have him rated as a potential first-round selection at November's NAB AFL Draft.

Having already shown his wares with and against AFL-listed opponents, Tom Cole should have few problems adjusting to the elite level if he's lucky enough to make it there.

Better still, Stevie Milne will be nowhere in sight.

# Dragon doing things differently

**Sandringham Dragons half back Andrew Tashevski-Beckwith has had to learn how to do things differently during his time in the TAC Cup.**

The 18-year-old missed all but one game of Sandringham's 2014 season due in part to snapping a finger tendon while playing school football for Melbourne Grammar.

But this year, Tashevski-Beckwith has played almost every match he can – either in the TAC Cup, APS competition or NAB AFL U18 Championships – missing just one match for his school through soreness.

There was a lesson to be learnt when an injury to one finger could impact a season of football so profoundly.

"I was tackling and I had my fist clenched with the opponent's jumper in my hand, but then he pulled away and I was still holding on – it forced the tendon back in my finger and snapped it," Tashevski-Beckwith said.

"That tackle was with my fingers, so now I'm a lot more conscious of what can happen and I always tackle with my body or more than just my fingers."

The extra time on the field this year has allowed 183cm Tashevski-Beckwith to demonstrate his ability as an attacking half back flanker.

He's averaging over 18 disposals and four tackles per game in seven matches for the Dragons, and averaged 12 disposals at 80 per cent efficiency in two games for Vic Metro at the U18 Championships.

But to play as a damaging defender at the highest underage levels, Tashevski-Beckwith has had to change his game up since trialling for a junior local league representative team several years ago.

"I remember I kicked eight goals in each of the two trial matches as a forward but I didn't get picked because I couldn't kick properly – I had a two-handed ball drop," he said.

"I spent about three or four years on my kicking and now I'm a lot stronger with it, and I just play as a half-back flanker setting up play."

As an Essendon supporter, Tashevski-Beckwith has enjoyed watching Michael Hibberd drive the Bombers forward from defence in recent years.

However, the main goal is to emulate Hawthorn



champion Sam Mitchell – who has spent time across half back in recent seasons – and his rare ability to kick equally well with both feet.

"My main strength for my game is being able to kick on both feet," Tashevski-Beckwith said.

"I want to be like Sam Mitchell; I've got a long way to go, but I watch a lot of Hawthorn games and I just try to watch what he does."

Tashevski-Beckwith will have a chance to test his kicking boot – or boots – at October's Victorian AFL State Combine.

But, also like Mitchell, he hopes to develop his running ability and move into the midfield at times, something coach Jeremy Barnard has allowed him to do occasionally at Sandringham in 2015.

While his midfield craft may still be a work in progress, Andrew Tashevski-Beckwith has already shown the ability to successfully learn how to do things differently on the football field.

## Double chance battle

**With the minor premiership and final eight being settled in Round 19, all eyes will be on the battle to claim a top-four spot and finals double chance this weekend.**

Box Hill's 90-point victory over the Northern Blues and Williamstown's 15-point loss to Werribee on Saturday means the Hawks have the 2015 minor premiership and a home qualifying final wrapped up.

Meanwhile, Casey's thrilling 17-point win against Coburg ended the Lions' charge towards September and secured eighth position for the Scorpions.

Second-placed Sandringham and third-placed Williamstown appear safe in the top four, but other Round 19 results left a logjam of teams sitting between fourth and seventh on records of 11-6.

The percentage gap between fourth-placed Footscray and the chasing teams – Essendon, Werribee and Collingwood – means the Bulldogs likely just need to defeat Werribee on Sunday to claim a top-four berth.

But if the in-form Tigers win their fifth straight match against Footscray at Avalon Airport Oval and Essendon loses its match, they'll instead travel to Box Hill City Oval to face the Hawks next week.

However, on form, the Bombers will be confident of accounting for Richmond at Windy Hill on Saturday and will be relying on Werribee to do them a favour by defeating the Bulldogs.

Due to its poor percentage, Collingwood needs to triumph over Port Melbourne at Victoria Park and have the three teams above it on the ladder all lose to snatch fourth.

The Werribee vs Footscray match is the key to the finals equations though, and you can watch it unfold from 11.30am this Sunday on Channel 7.

### VALE John Nicol

There was sad news during the week for the Werribee Football Club, with the passing of president John Nicol.

A local of the area, he joined the Werribee Board in 1996 and had been president since 2006.

During his tenure, John helped resurrect the club's financial position, as well as managing a facilities improvement program.

Last year he not only became a VFL life member, but was also inducted into the Werribee Football Club Hall of Fame. Our thoughts are with the Werribee FC and his family.




## News

### Race for Frosty

**It's a race in three for the 'Frosty' Miller Medal as we arrive at the final home-and-away round of the Peter Jackson VFL season.**

The battle for the league's goalkicking title will be fought between Port Melbourne's Jordan Lisle (41 goals), Box Hill Hawk Sam Grimley (41) and Richmond's Liam McBean (40) in Round 20. 196cm Lisle and 202cm McBean face the defences of Collingwood and Essendon respectively for the first times in 2015 on Saturday, while on Sunday, 199cm Grimley – last year's 'Frosty' Miller medallist – meets Williamstown, a team he booted five goals against in Round 10.

### Development League finals equations

**First and second spots have been sorted ahead of the final round of the AFL Victoria Development League home-and-away season, but fourth position remains up for grabs.**

The undefeated Box Hill Hawks have had the minor premiership in hand for a while now and will face second-placed Williamstown (11-4) at Box Hill City Oval this weekend in a dress rehearsal for next week's first semi final.

Casey (9-6) is only one game ahead of Sandringham (8-7) in fifth, but a superior percentage (135.5% to 124.8%) means it's unlikely the Scorpions could be overtaken by the Zebras unless Sandringham inflicts a particularly heavy defeat on them at Trevor Barker Beach Oval on Saturday.

Sitting nervously in fourth with a relatively poor percentage of 113.0% is Coburg (9-6), which will need to defeat the Northern Blues at Preston City Oval on Sunday to guarantee a finals berth if the Zebras do manage to knock off Casey the previous day.

## Round 17 Highlights

**The TAC Cup final eight is effectively settled with one home-and-away round to play, after the Sandringham Dragons failed to overcome the Gippsland Power in Round 17 action.**

The ninth-placed Dragons needed to win both their remaining games and hope the eighth-placed Calder Cannons lost both of their matches to sneak into the finals.

However, despite Calder losing to the ladder-leading North Ballarat Rebels by 26 points at Eureka Stadium on Saturday, Sandringham went down to Gippsland by 51 points later that day.

The Dragons started brightly at Morwell Football Ground, leading the Power by nine points at quarter time, but Gippsland turned the screws with six goals to two in the second term and never looked back.

Meanwhile, the Eastern Ranges enjoyed an important 49-point win away from home against the third-placed Murray Bushrangers at Norm Minns Oval.

In a see-sawing battle, Murray led by three points at half time and trailed by 10 at the last break, before Eastern let loose with a devastating seven-goal-to-one final term.

The victory sees the Ranges maintain their hold on fourth position for another week ahead of the Geelong Falcons (who are even with them on premiership points) and at the same time drew to within two premiership points of the Bushrangers.

The Falcons also accounted for a fellow top-eight team in convincing fashion at Warrabee Park, knocking off the sixth-placed Oakleigh Chargers by 30 points.

With just one point in it at the main break, an eight-goal Geelong onslaught in the third term opened up a match-winning 41-point lead at three-quarter time.

In Round 17's other matches:

- The Dandenong Stingrays kept pace with the Rebels in the race for the minor premiership in defeating the Western Jets by 85 points at Burbank Oval; and
- The Northern Knights recorded a well-deserved third win of 2015 by beating the Bendigo Pioneers to the tune of 83 points at Epsom Huntly Reserve.

Ryan Clarke is in scintillating form for the Eastern Ranges at the moment. A week after racking up 42 disposals in the club's big win over Bendigo, the Rowville product found the ball 45 times in Eastern's victory over the Murray Bushrangers on Sunday – 18 more disposals than anyone else on the ground.

A key to Geelong's triumph over the Oakleigh Chargers on Saturday was tackling pressure. The Falcons laid 36 more tackles than their opponents, led by Lockey McCartney with 10. The Geelong Grammar boy had more tackles than disposals (six), clearly priding himself on the defensive side of the game.

## Power boys impact the VFL

**The Gippsland Power had one player step up and make an impact at VFL level and another return from making an impact in the state competition last week.**

19-year-old Tom Papley played his third VFL match of 2015 with Casey on Saturday, helping to secure a finals spot for the Scorpions with a crucial last-quarter goal in their important clash with Coburg at Piranha Park.

176cm Papley, who has booted 25 goals in 13 games at Gippsland this season, has now kicked five majors in his three games with Casey and none more important than the one that put the Scorpions 10 points clear of the Lions early in the final term.

Meanwhile, AFL father-son prospect Josh Dunkley – son of former Sydney player Andrew – played his first game for the Power since Round 11 on the weekend.

The 18-year-old had played five consecutive matches for Richmond in the VFL (six in total in 2015) before returning for Gippsland's win over the Sandringham Dragons, averaging 12 disposals and almost four tackles per game at the higher level.

Dunkley collected 20 disposals and laid 10 tackles against the Dragons.

### The finals equations

**With the final round of the TAC Cup home-and-away season upon us, let's have a look at how the positioning of the top eight could still change in Round 18.**

The eight teams participating in finals are effectively settled, with the ninth-placed Sandringham Dragons a game and 14 percentage points behind the Calder Cannons, meaning the key races are those for the minor premiership and spots in the top four.

The North Ballarat Rebels and Dandenong Stingrays are the clubs in contention for the minor premiership and both are guaranteed to be involved in qualifying finals next week.

Despite sitting in North Ballarat's shadow for much of the season, Dandenong is still in a position to swoop on the minor premiership and dislodge the Rebels from top spot, which they have held since Round 7.

The Stingrays are even on wins but 13 percentage points behind the ladder leaders, so they need to defeat the Geelong Falcons at Simonds Stadium and hope North Ballarat loses to the Oakleigh Chargers at Eureka Stadium to claim first spot.

The Falcons will be no easy beats however, as they're in a tight battle with the Murray Bushrangers and Eastern Ranges for third and fourth positions – and a vital double chance in finals.

Geelong is currently sitting in fifth, half a game behind Murray in third and nine percentage points behind Eastern in fourth. It therefore needs to beat Dandenong while hoping that either the Bushrangers lose to the 11th-placed Bendigo Pioneers in Rochester or the Ranges lose to Sandringham at Rams Arena to claim a top-four spot.

On form, Murray will be highly favoured to travel to Bendigo and return with the four points, but if that doesn't happen, the Bushrangers could even fall out of the top four if both Eastern and Geelong triumph – a position they wouldn't have been in since Round 6.

Lower down, Calder can't move out of eighth position, while Oakleigh (6th) will be facing the Gippsland Power (7th) in an elimination final next week.

## Statewide player points system to be introduced

**AFL Victoria has confirmed a statewide player points system will be introduced as part of the implementation of the Community Club Sustainability Program in 2016.**

AFL Victoria Community Football and Engagement Manager Brett Connell said feedback from metropolitan leagues and region commissions following recent testing of the draft framework indicated strong support for immediate implementation of a Player Points component of the Community Club Sustainability Program in 2016.

"Feedback from leagues and commissions was comprehensive and overwhelmingly supportive of a system that addresses equalisation concerns in community football and tackles escalating player payments," he said.

"The Working Party will now look to finalise the Community Club Sustainability Policy with a view of releasing it in September to allow clubs time to determine an appropriate recruiting strategy.

"In response to wide ranging feedback from clubs and leagues, there will be some minor changes to the draft policy tested during 2015 but it will fundamentally remain based on categorising players by their playing history and achievements.

"The Working Party remains confident the Policy will be adopted statewide and will work with leagues and region commissions to develop regional strategies that cater for the individual challenges faced by clubs and leagues."

Mr Connell said the Working Party has acted on the feedback from leagues and commissions in regards to the implementation of a league-specific salary cap.

"Through this consultation process, feedback indicated support for a phased-in approach of the Community Club Sustainability Program – in particular, more information requested on the operation of a salary cap before it's fully implemented," he said.

"The Working Party will continue to work with leagues and clubs on the formation of a comprehensive Salary Cap policy and envisage it to be operational in the vast majority of leagues by 2017.

"Any policy will be accompanied by an extensive education program outlining the roles and responsibilities of clubs and leagues, and include enforcement provisions.

"As a result of feedback, the Working Party has submitted an application to the AFL in relation to altering the National Player Transfer Regulations to allow the registering of players to occur prior to Christmas."

Mr Connell thanked the members of the Working Party, clubs, leagues and commissions for their commitment to reducing player payments and improving competition equalisation across community football in Victoria.

"The Working Party will continue to work with all stakeholders to achieve an outcome that will improve the sustainability of community football throughout Victoria but acknowledges that there are many factors involved in achieving this goal and much work still to be done," he said.

- Increase awareness of the risks associated with gambling
- Help prevent problem gambling and related harm
- Raise awareness of Gambler's Help services



Clubs joining the program are asked to sign a Responsible Gambling Charter as a demonstration of their commitment to taking a responsible approach to gambling. Benefits for clubs who participate in the program include:

- Free support and advice on responsible gambling practices
- Free education sessions delivered to your club
- Support to minimise the risks associated with gambling at your club
- Assistance in creating a club culture that will help attract new participants to your club, and retain those you already have
- Support to become a community leader in responsible gambling practices
- Community recognition for being a responsible gambling club

AFL Victoria encourages all clubs to sign up to the program, as we believe gambling is a growing concern for youth and sporting clubs across the state. The program offers clubs a fantastic opportunity to increase their awareness and knowledge of the risks associated with gambling for free.





### Holmes and Smith debut

**In a historic day for football, Jason Holmes became the first American to play a senior AFL match when he ran out for St Kilda in the Saints' draw with Geelong at Etihad Stadium on Saturday night.**

The 203cm 25-year-old has been developing his game as a ruckman at St Kilda's Peter Jackson VFL affiliate Sandringham since being taken as an international rookie ahead of the 2014 season.

Holmes played 19 matches at senior VFL level and one in the Development League last season but has flourished in 2015, playing 16 senior matches and ranking second in the VFL for total hitouts before receiving the call-up to the elite level last week.

The Chicago native had seven disposals and a game-high 34 hitouts against the Cats.

Joining Holmes in making his AFL debut in Round 21 was Western Bulldogs rookie Rourke Smith, a former Calder Cannon.

18-year-old Smith was a member of Calder's losing 2014 TAC Cup Grand Final side before being selected by the Bulldogs with pick no.5 in last year's Rookie Draft.

Originally from Sunbury, the athletic defender had nine disposals and took three marks as the Bulldogs lost to West Coast by 77 points at Domain Stadium.


Lang recorded 16 disposals, three marks and one score assist against the Saints, and is currently ranked first for score assists at the Cats in 2015.
