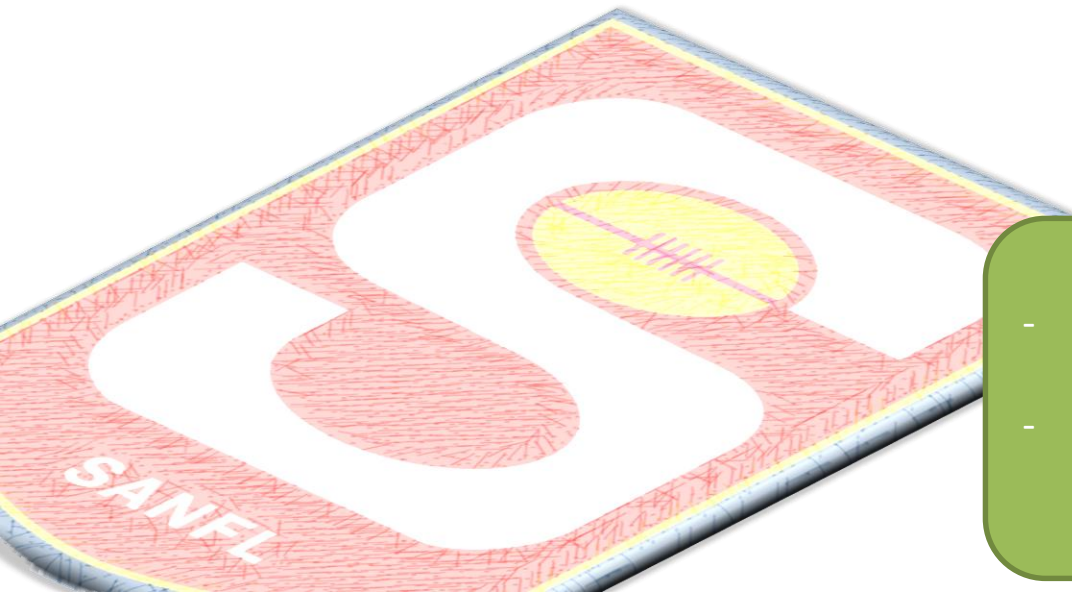

Our goal

*Develop a favourable **competition and management structure** for the **attraction** of participants to Australian Rules, **retention** in the game and which offers quality **support for club administrators** and **volunteers**.*

- Goal identified by the project team involved was to make it easy to be involved in football
- Remove the complications and the barriers to implementing best practice

The current landscape

- Four junior leagues operating independently
- Volunteer or part-time administration
- Little to no collaboration leads to duplication and inefficiencies
- Disconnected from peak body and SANFL clubs



Club feedback

- 36 club meetings, 10+ junior league meetings
- Club feedback indicated leadership and improved governance was required
- Clubs expect professional efficient competition management

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- Current governance model is confused and includes too many layers of bureaucracy
- For support and resources from the SANFL to reach community clubs, there are too many groups/committees that need to be consulted

*Our **Clubs:*** Celebrated football competition cultivating strong communities, Clubs, leaders and elite pathways.



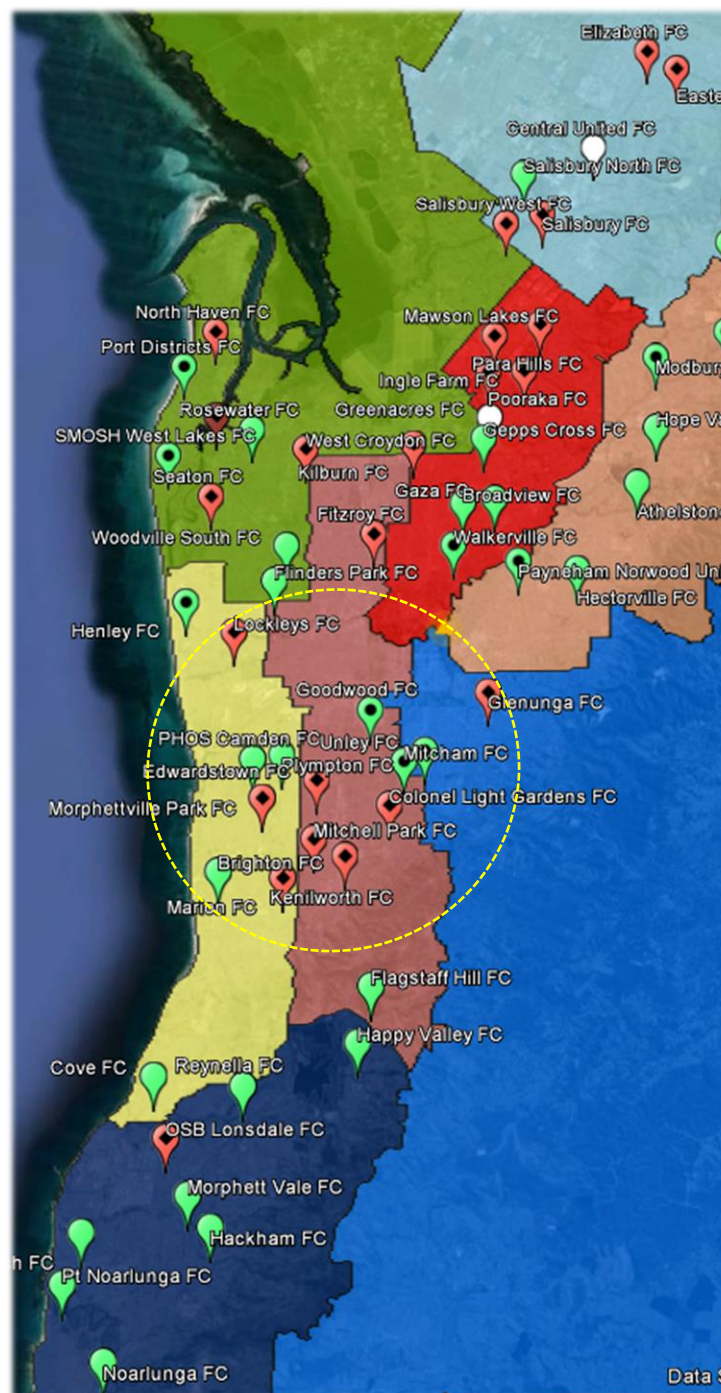

- The new model offers clubs a much closer connection with the peak body
- Support will be easier to access, communication lines will be opened up
- All clubs can benefit from collaborative effort
- Competitions will be divided into 'conferences' of clubs in an immediate area



SANFL Juniors

58 Member Clubs



- In terms of who you play against week to week, for Metro South clubs, it is unlikely that significant change will be necessary
- There are enough teams in each age group to maintain competition structures
- Possible inclusion of clubs from the immediate area could add variety and depth to the competition
- Centralised management provides FLEXIBILITY that has never existed before

Club desires

- Local competitions
- Revenue from match days

- Competition managers are well aware that parents don't want to travel large distances for junior football and that clubs need to drive income through their BBQs and canteens on match days
- These needs will be used as the guiding principles when fixture is created

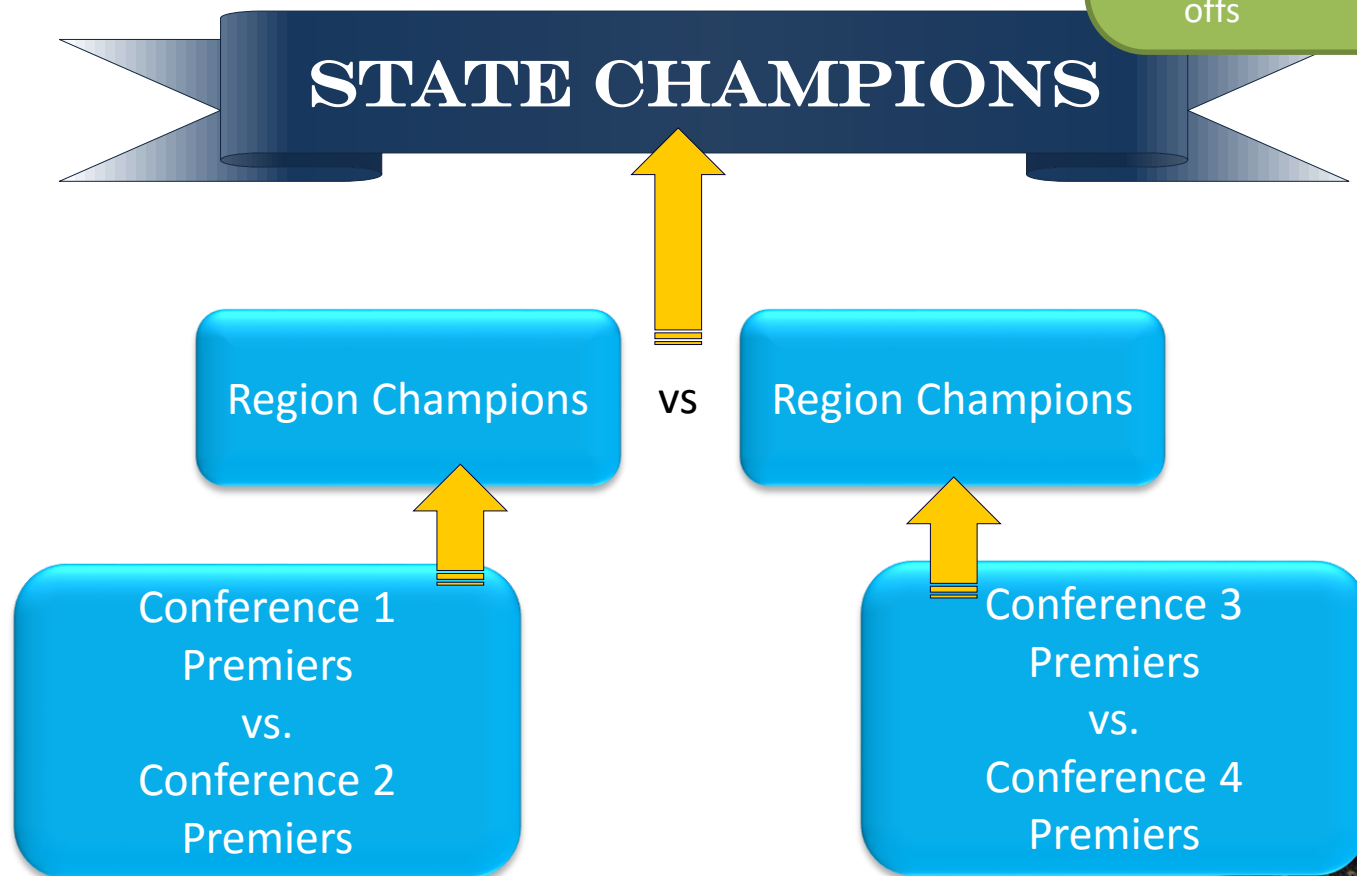

- The new model will consolidate the junior pathway, providing clubs an opportunity to attract participants from the year they are turning five, through to senior youth age
- Strong focus on offerings at the key 'drop-out' ages to ensure retention rates are high and junior clubs feed senior clubs

State Championship Series

- Opportunity for “Premier Teams” to participate in a State Championship event/series and compete against other Premiers
- Possibly use Adelaide Oval, AAMI Stadium or an SANFL venue for the play-offs

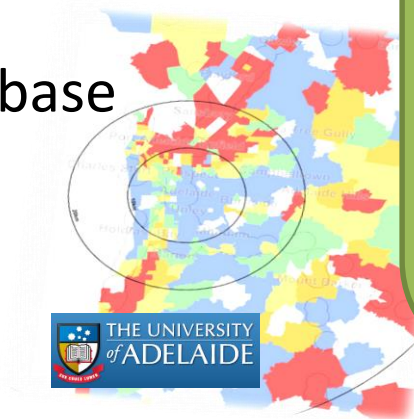


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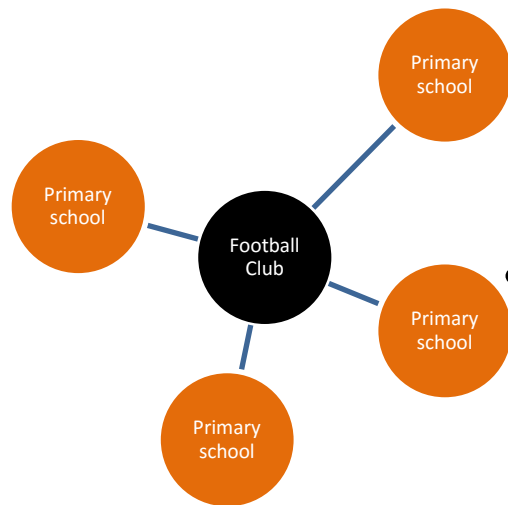


Participation growth

- Spatial database



- Working to develop strong understanding of demographics of specific areas so we can assist clubs in attracting and retaining participants
- Investigating possible 'school alignment models' used interstate to allow clubs to draw players from specific schools in their immediate area
- Training developed for key volunteer roles to support clubs recruitment

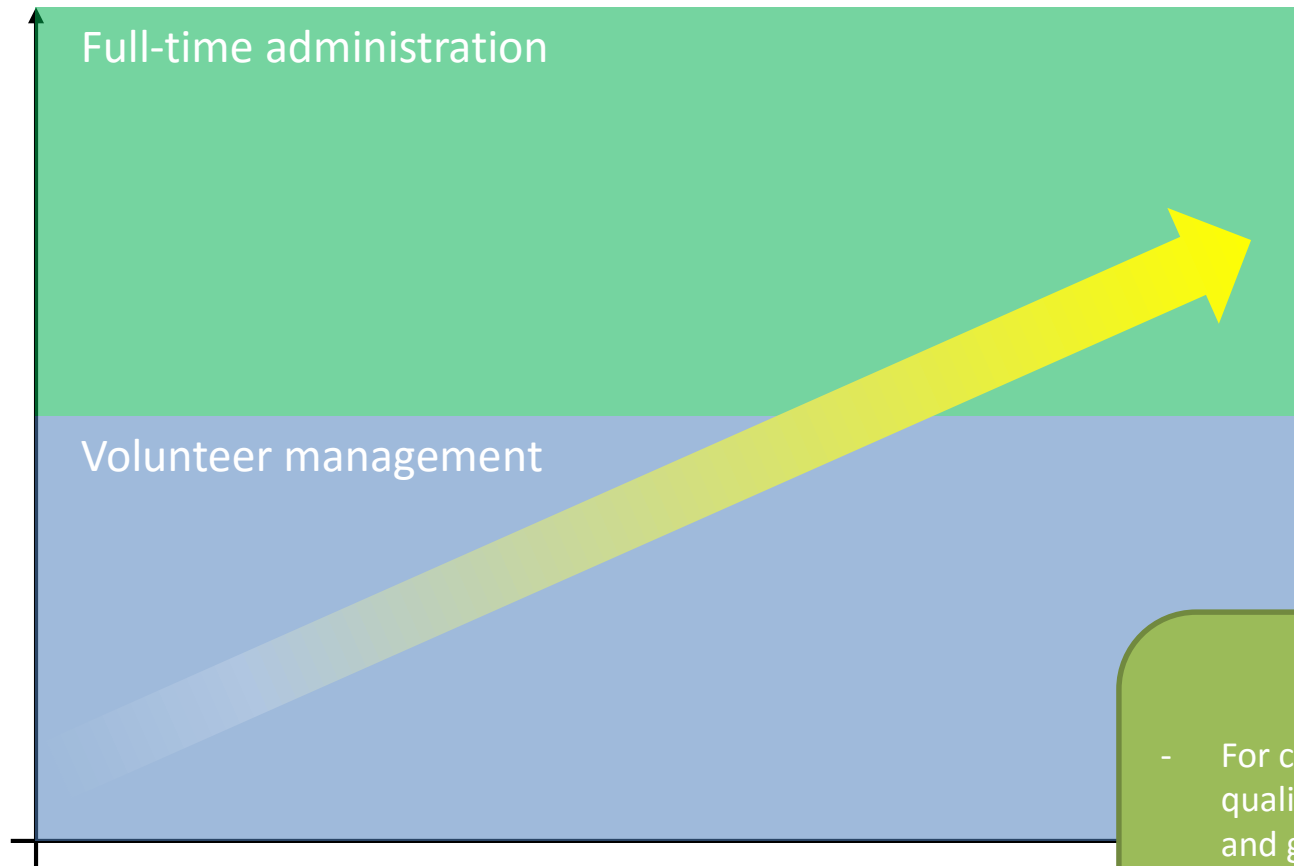
Umpiring

- Quality umpire coaching and training
- Direct support from SANFL Umpiring Department
- Centrally managed appointments
- Local panels aligned with competition conferences



- Consistency in competitions will have flow on effect for umpiring with better support for coaches leading to improved umpiring quality
- Centralised management will also strengthen umpiring development pathway

Competition management



- For continued improvement in the quality of junior football competitions and growth in clubs, a full-time professional administration structure is required



League administration

- Full-time competition management team to be appointed by the SANFL
- Casual staff utilised to assist at peak periods of the year

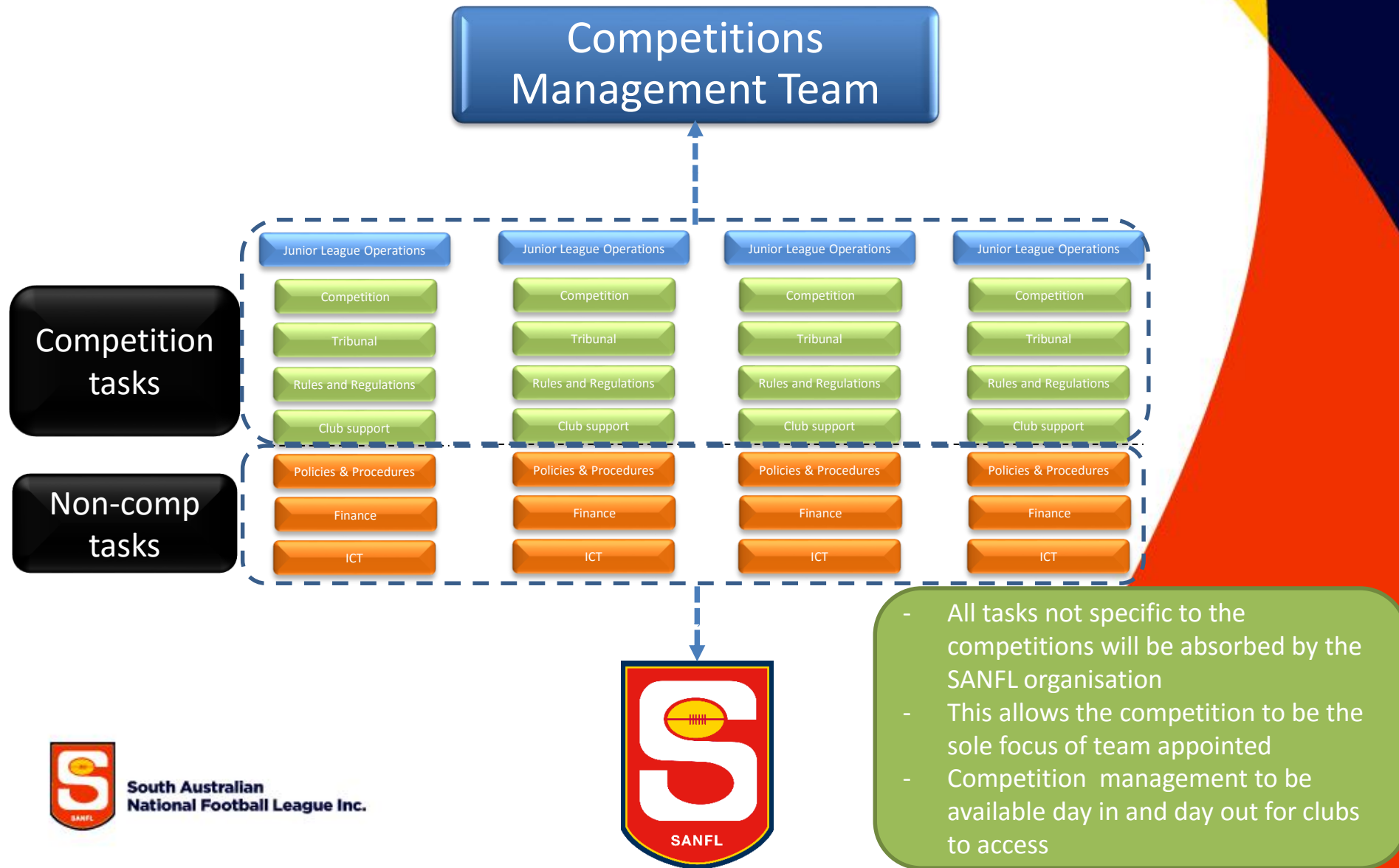

Competition Management

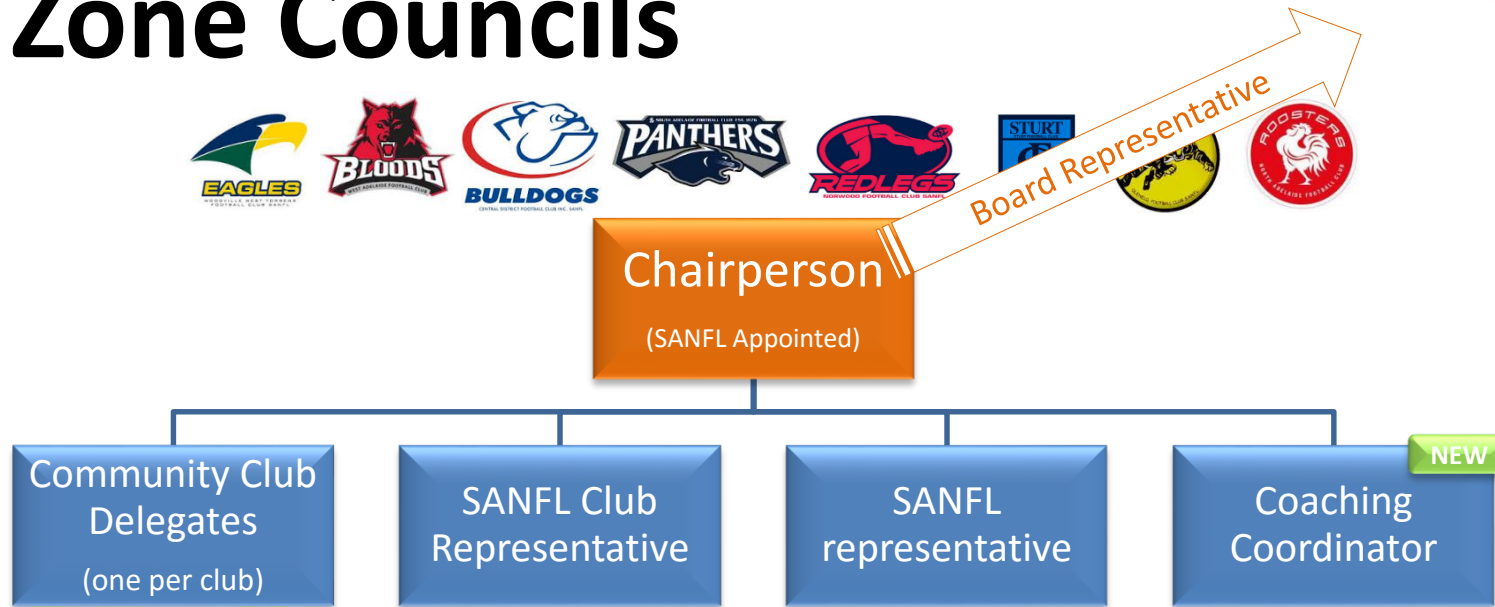


- Strength of this structure lies in the benefits of the Competition management team having day-to-day access to other SANFL departments and resources

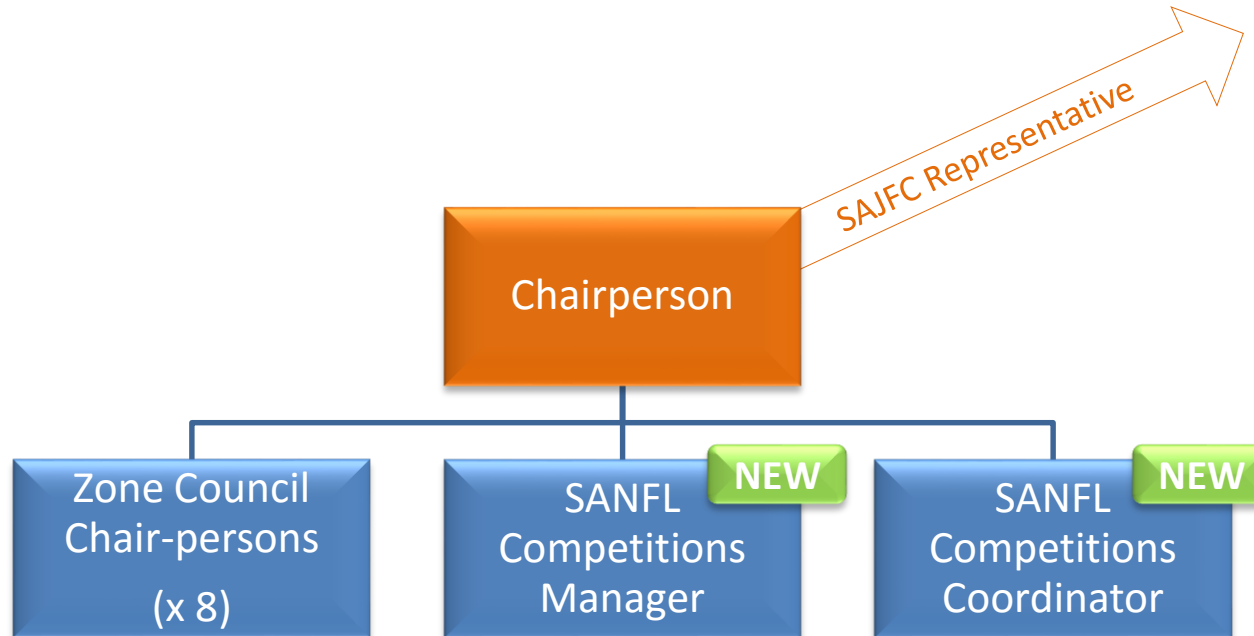

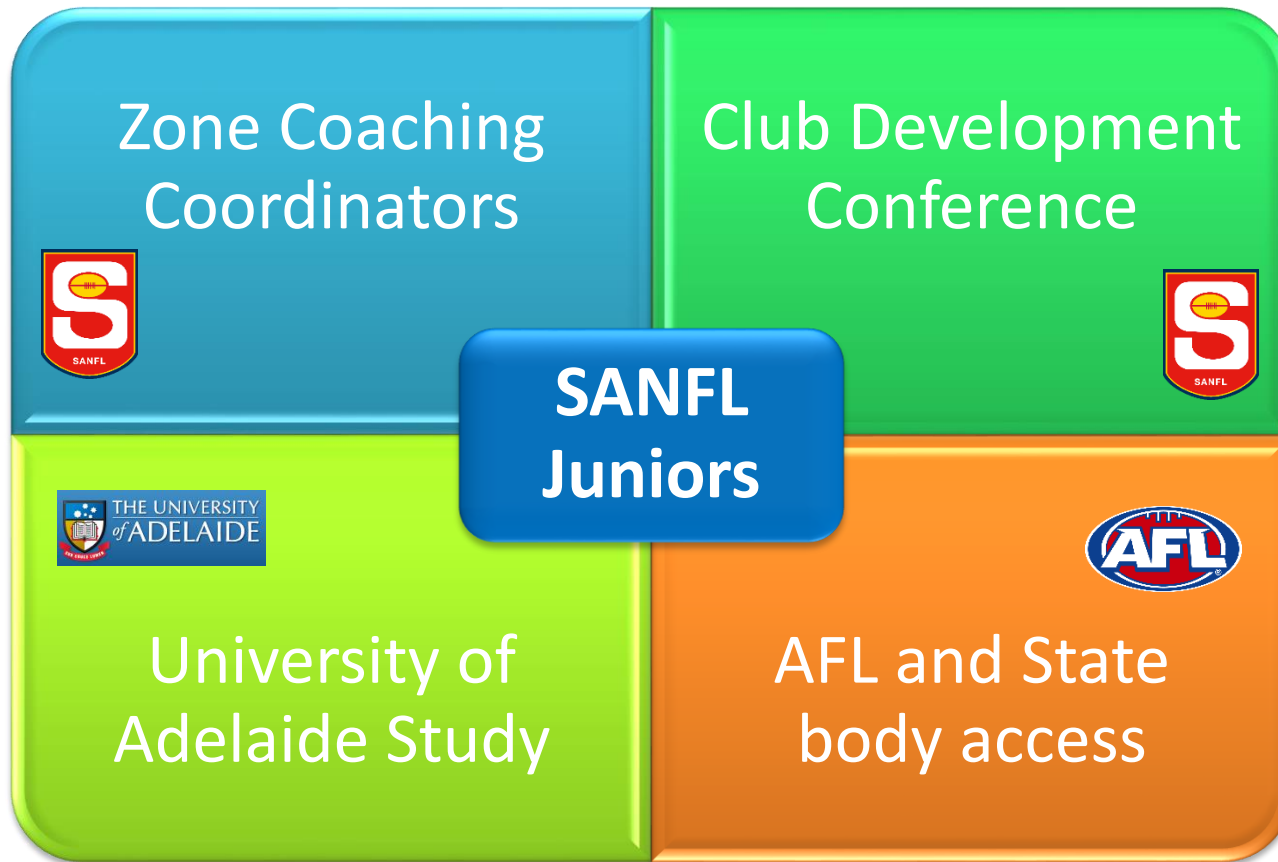
- Chair from each Zone council to represent that Zone at competition board level

One governing body to oversee the junior competition in metropolitan Adelaide



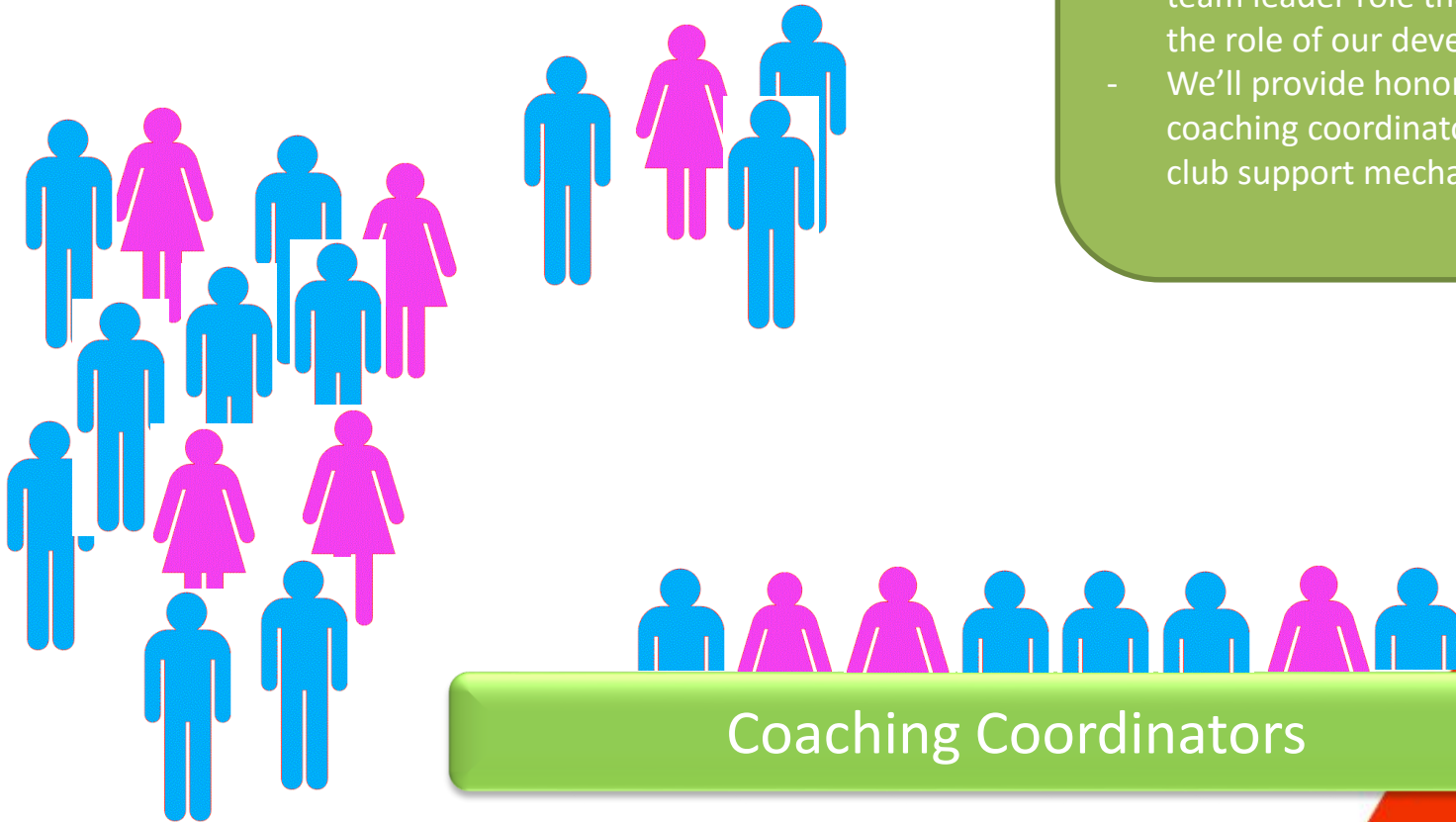
Resources

- Significant other support resources that can provide maximum benefit to clubs under centralised management model



SANFL investment in Game Development....

- SANFL currently employs 12 full-time staff in this area
- This model will see three additional staff members in the competition management team, plus another team leader role that will oversee the role of our development staff
- We'll provide honorariums for eight coaching coordinators to add to our club support mechanisms.
