OFFICIAL STATEMENT BY THE CHAIRMAN SOLOMON ISLANDS NATIONAL SPORTS COUNCIL

The National Sports Council has been instrumental in assisting the National Olympic Committee of Solomon Islands fulfil the bid requirements enshrined in the Games Charter. We are mandated by the Government to ensure that NOCSI is strengthened and supported in all ways possible in order to place the bid before the Council. We are also mandated to cooperate fully with NOCSI in

INTRODUCTION

The founders of the South Pacific Games nearly 50 years ago had a vision – "to promote a unique friendly world-class competition for the benefit of the people, the nations and territories of the Pacific community".

Solomon Islands shares in this vision and will offer to the sportsmen and women of the Pacific region a competition that will be remembered for many years to come. In so doing, our primary consideration will be the interest and wellbeing of the Pacific athletes.

We acknowledge that the Pacific community has changed, even transformed, over the years since the days of the 1st Games in Suva in 1963. The world has become smaller in terms of communication technology. The Internet has changed the way we live and do business and source information. At the same time new challenges have emerged which are having direct impact on our young peoples' perspective on life and on the world around them – issues of international terrorism, climate change and global economic crisis. In summary, we are living in a new era in which new levels of regional cooperation and unity is demanded of us all. It is a time to strengthen our relationships and friendships within the spirit of the Games.

The XV Pacific Games will offer an excellent opportunity for our young people to realize their common bond as "people of the sea" where rise in ocean level and reduction in fish stock due to changes in weather patterns pose serious and real threats to their wellbeing and survival.

The Games is not a time to become oblivious to our fears about sea rise and carbon emission, far from it. It is a time to embrace everything that is good about the Pacific, the ocean, the rain forests, the beaches and the numerous islands which have become our heritage and our inheritance. It is a time to **EMBRACE THE VISSION** of the founding fathers of these Games. It is a time to enjoy ourselves as we showcase our talents and skills to the highest sporting standards, despite the challenges we face in the 21st Century.



BACKGROUND INFORMATION

The Country

Solomon Islands stretches from the Shortland islands in the west bordering PNG to the tiny island of Fataka in the east, near to the northern border of the Republic of Vanuatu. This is a distance of more than 1,200 km. The land area of the country is 27,600 square kilometres, making it the second biggest country in the insular Pacific, next to PNG.

This nation of more than a thousand islands is the proud host to two world heritage sites – Roviana Lagoon in the Western Province, the world's longest enclosed coral lagoon, and Lake Tengano on the Polynesian island of Rennel, which is the biggest raised atoll lake in insular Pacific (15,500 ha) with some of the world's rarest fauna and flora species.

Solomon Islands is located at 9.20degrees south, 159.48 degrees east.

Population

The population of Solomon Islands as at 1st January 2009 was estimated at 630,000 based on the 1999 growth rate of 3 % per annum.

Solomon Islands is the melting pot of the Pacific when it comes to racial composition. While Melanesians form the majority of the population (80%), there are a large number of Polynesians who occupy the outlying islands (10%) and Micronesians of ni-Kiribati origin (3) who first arrived in Solomon Islands in the early 1950s. There are a large number of second and third generation Chinese and Asians who call Solomon Islands their home. All races have shared equally in the task of building the Solomon Islands state.

Religion

Solomon Islanders are genuinely religious. Christianity accounts for about 90% of the population while other minor religions form the rest.

The Solomon Islands Constitution guarantees freedom of religion and beliefs. This is a constitutional right which is valued highly and exercised freely by Solomon Islanders.

The Government system

Solomon Islands became independent on 7th July 1978 and has adopted a constitutional democracy based on the Westminster model. The English Monarch is the Constitutional Head of State who is represented in Solomon Islands by a Governor General.

The National Parliament is unicameral. Its 50 members are elected every four years by universal suffrage. Parliament elects the prime minister who then chooses his cabinet ministers from amongst the members of Parliament. Ministers are then formally appointed by the Governor General. Under the Constitution (Prescription of Ministers) Act, the prime minister may choose up to 24 ministers.

Every Solomon Island citizen from 18 years up may register as voters, but voting is not compulsory.

How the Country earns its money

More than 70% of the Solomon Islands population depend on the subsistence economy for their sustenance. The cash economy comprises only 30%. The subsistence sector has

often provided effective safety net against imported inflation and has been the reason why so many people have been able to survive through difficult economic times. They live mainly off the garden and on the fish from the ocean. Timber, palm oil, copra, cocoa and fisheries are the mainstay of the nation's foreign exchange earnings. Gold export is expected to resume in a few months following the closure of the main Gold Ridge Mine in 2000, following the ethnic crisis on Guadalcanal.

Honiara – the Host City

The Games venue will be in Honiara, the National Capital. The fastest growing City (the fastest in the Pacific according to World Bank report in May 2007) has a population of 84,000 people, 70% of whom are below 30 years of age.

The Port of Point Cruz is the main shipping gateway to Solomon Islands. It is also one of the main transhipment ports approved by the Pacific Forum Fisheries Agency for transhipment of fish catches by foreign vessels licensed to fish in the Solomon Islands EEZ.

Diving

For those who are interested, the seas near and around Honiara offer exciting dive destinations for war wrecks. These wrecks are protected by law and removal of items found on the wrecks are illegal.

Dining Out

Honiara has a good number of restaurants which serve excellent Chinese, European, Japanese and island cuisines.

While the OC does not encourage athletes to over-entertain and over-socialise while in Honiara for the Games, there are several licensed nightclubs which open six nights a week from early evening to 2pm.

Sites to see

Sites to see in Honiara are the national museum along the Mendana Avenue, the National Arts Gallery, Parliament House, Honiara Main Market and the newly restored Chinatown.


Beaches west of the City are beautiful resting areas. Some areas are under the control of customary landowners who charge small fees for vehicle parking.

CLIMATE DATA

The climate of Solomon Islands is tropical, mainly hot and humid, with little annual variation in temperature. The wet season (November to April) can bring severe tropical storms. Honiara experiences the least rainfall in the whole country as it is located on the leeward site of the main island of Guadalcanal.

Required Clothing

Tropical, light-wears and cottons clothing are recommended. During the wet period from November to April, having an umbrella is handy.

It is our desire to host the Games during the period between July and September 2015when rainfall is lowest.



SPORTS PROGRAMME

We propose to host the Games to coincide with Solomon Islands 37th Independence Anniversary on 7th July Jul 2015. The period is also the driest. The opening ceremony should take place one week after the Independence anniversary celebrations.

The academic school holidays, which last for six weeks, also starts at the end of June.

ORGANISING COMMITTEE

In order to achieve the Vision of the Games' founding fathers, we will ensue that the Organising Committee consists of the best sport leaders Solomon Islands can offer.

Charter and Legal Status:

The Organising Committee will be incorporated under an Act of Parliament. As soon as the Bid is successful, the Bill will be tabled in Parliament which will establish a Games Authority. The Authority will be responsible for the overall administration of the Games.

Organisational Chart:

The organizational chart of the OC will be as shown in "Annexure A", which shows the relationship with and representation of the PGC and the National PGA. The OC will be constituted in accordance with the terms of Regulation 20 of the Charter.

Membership of the proposed Games Authority and the various subcommittees will be drawn from the community, the government, the Host City and from technical expertise to be engaged from overseas.

All efforts will be made to have as any members of the Bid Committee as possible to be retained in the OC structure.

Volunteer programmes.

The OC will be supported by over 200 volunteers to be drawn from holidaying students and others in Honiara, mainly from the sports federations that are members of the local PGA, the National Olympic Committee of Solomon Islands ("NOCSI"). They will operate under the leadership of the Director of Volunteer Corp who heads one of the subcommittees within the Games Authority.

Director of Sports

The coordination of the various sporting activities, technical staff including presentation of awards will form the basis for well-organised Games. These will come under the leadership of the Director of Sports.

Director of Games Village

There will be a subcommittee headed by a Director to oversee all matters of logistics and service delivery at each of the proposed five Games Villages. The committee will coordinate its efforts with the volunteer corp. group to ensure effective tasking and assignment of manpower and supplies.

Director Venues and facilities

The subcommittee tasked with coordinating and making preparation of venues and facilities will be the first to go into operation, soon after the winning of the bid. The director will work closely with the government through the national sports council and NOCSI to ensure that all venues and facilities earmarked for the Games are completed in time. Thereafter, his committee will ensure that venues and facilities remain ready for each scheduled sport competition.

Director Security

Security will be a top priority of the OC. The recruitment, training and tasking of manpower for this particular assignment will be carried out by the Director of Security in consultation with the Royal Solomon Island Police and the Host City authority.

The service will come under the management of the Director of Security.

Director Marketing

Like the venues and facilities subcommittee, marketing and sponsorship will form the backbone of the preparation for the Games. The Director of Marketing will ensure that his committee raises public awareness both within and outside the country in order to draw in needed revenue and technical know how. The OC will ensure that key nationals and friends

from both the private and public sectors get involved in this important task.

An important assignment awaiting the committee is the planning, launching and management of national lotteries as part of the Games' fundraising efforts.

Director of Media Services

The exposure of the Games throughout Solomon Island and to the rest of world will enhance not only the Games Vision but will also benefit Solomon Islands in the short, medium and long term. The subcommittee headed by the Director of Media Services will shoulder this important responsibility.

Membership of this key committee will be drawn from the local media as well as from overseas.

Director of Liaison

Timely input and involvement by relevant government and semi government bodies at crucial times is critical from the preparatory stage right up to the Games period. There are certain laws and regulations which will have to be complied with and permits and licenses issued. These will be achieved only if there is maximum cooperation between the OC and the relevant government authorities. The task will be performed by the Director of Government Liaison and his subcommittee.

Director of Events

The main assignment of this subcommittee under the Director will be the organisation of the opening and closing

ceremonies and other events required to add quality to the Games.

The Torch Relay will be one of the important events to organised and supervised by the subcommittee.

PAST SPORTS EVENTS & OTHER MAJOR EVENTS

Major events organised by Solomon Islands in the past were the 1981 1st South Pacific Mini Games, the FIFA Under 17 world cup Qualifying tournament in 1998, and the 2004 FIFA World Cup Qualifying rounds in 2004. In addition Solomon Islands also hosted the home matches against Australia of the Oceania FIFA World Cup finals against Australia in 2006.

TECHNICAL OFFICIALS

In respect of the sports listed for the 2015 Games there are very few technical people currently available locally to organize and manage the events. Where expert assistance is required, the NOCSI and the Government will source assistance from overseas, in consultation with the relevant federations.

Local training of coaches and technical staff will be organized at least two years from the Games date.

Current pool of technical officials are as follows-

This obvious shortfall will be bridged through a coordinated and planned programme aimed at training and equipping the required number of technical expertise in readiness for the Games and beyond

FACILITIES

Sports and Related Facilities

Existing Facilities include Lawson Tama FIFA Stadium, King George VI School sports fields, the Golf Club facilities and the Multi Purpose Hall Gymnasium at Lawson Tama. The KGVI fields and those at the S I College of Higher Education are adequate as training venues for the athletes.

The main venue for the Games will be the National Stadium at Burns Creek. Construction of the stadium will be completed by the end of 2011, three years ahead of the Games date. The stadium will have crowd capacity of up to 30,000 (grand stand for 6,000)

Facilities which will be required and which are yet to be developed are for swimming and shooting. Others to have basic facilities which will be renovated and upgraded. These include tennis, cricket, basketball and boxing.

The new rugby stadium at Town Grown is under construction and will be completed by the middle of 2010. Total spectator capacity will be 8,000.

Games Village

The main Games Villages will be at KGVI and the two SICHE campuses at Panatina and Kukum. These together will accommodate about 2,600 athletes. Additional accommodation will be secured from other institutions such as Don Bosco Youth Centre and the Betikama College.

Athletes will be housed in rooms with four athletes to a room, using double bunker beds.

Total rooms in the proposed institution campuses will be 3,000. The rooms will not be air conditioned but will have ceiling fans. Each unit has toilet and shower facilities which will be upgraded for the Games.

Each of the three campuses have own dining facilities.

Throughout the day refreshments and coffee will be available from 6 am right through to 12 midnight at all Village venues.

Medical Centre and Media Centres

There will be two main medical centres: one to be located at King George VI School and the other at the Kukum Campus of the Solomon Islands College of Higher Education.

Press Centre

The main press centre will be located at the Panatina Campus Pavilion of the SICHE.

Banking

Based on initial discussions with the three commercial banks in Honiara, it will be possible to locate banking services at each of the Games Villages for currency exchanges and withdrawals. Additional ATMs will be located throughout the City to meet demand.

For money transfers the Solomon Islands Postal Corporation offers services through the Western Union.

Postal and telecommunication services

Solomon Telekom has the capacity to establish temporary telecommunication outlets at a central

location at each of the Games villages. This will include internet cafes and printing services.

For postal services, athletes may use Solomon Post, operated by the Solomon Islands Postal Corporation.

Travel Bureau

The main travel office will be located at King George VI High School. Arrangements are being made with all the existing airlines and travel agencies.

Dry-cleaning and Laundry

Each Games Village will have a laundry and dry cleaning facility with capacity to service needs of athletes. Athletes will do their own washing when it comes to personal clothing and uniforms, otherwise the laundry staff will be available to assist at cost to the OC.

Other Facilities

To add to athlete comfort and requirements, additional facilities for the followings will be placed at each Games village-

- Indoor entertainment facilities for snooker and darts
- Film shows with large screen TV access
- Physiotherapy rooms

Accommodation

HQ Hotel for Council and PGA members

Members of the Games Council and PGA delegates will be accommodated at the Mendana Kitano Hotel at Point Cruz. Alternative accommodation will be the Heritage Park Hotel, also at Point Cruz.

Each of the hotels provides bar, restaurant), internet, conference and international telephone services.

Technical Officials, IF delegates, members of the news media and others may be accommodated at either the Heritage Park Hotel, the King Solomons or at the Pacific Casino Hotel. All these are within 15 minutes drive to the Main Games venues.

Transportation Arrangements

Transport arrangements will as follows-

Coach Minibus Special:

Each country and territory participating at the Games will be allocated coaches and mini buses (with drivers) based on team size. Coaches and mini buses will also operate from Games villages to the main venues. The drivers and buses will be located at each Games village.

Other vehicles and cars

In order to ease movement of team management during the Games period, cars and other vehicles will be made available on request. Each country and territory will be provided with at least two cars which will remain with the team for the duration of the Games.

Council Group

Members of the Council will be picked up at their hotels by designated mini buses to and from Games venues or other destinations. They will, in addition, will be allocated two cars for their own use.

The President of the Games Council will be allocated a car and a driver. The other executive members of the Council will also be allocated one car each and a driver. Similar privileges will be accorded any 'Life Member' who will be visiting Honiara for the Games.

Representatives of International Federations which will be in Honiara for the Games will be housed in one hotel to allow for easy delivery of transportation. In summary the OC will comply with the transport requirements described at Regulation 12.12.9 to the Games Charter

Training Areas

These will be mainly at the KGVI NHS and at the Panatina Campus fields of the SICHE.

Training areas for various sports will also be provided at Burns Creek Oval (near the National Stadium), King George High School grounds, AE Oval (opposite the National Stadium).

Existing facilities throughout Honiara will be upgraded as training venues for tennis, netball, rugby and other team and individual sports.

GENERAL ARRANGEMENTS

Village per diem

Consistent with Melanesian and Pacific Islands tradition athletes to the 2015 Games will not be required to pay any per diem for meals, accommodation and transport. These will be provided free of charge by the Government of Solomon Islands and the National Olympics Committee of Solomon Islands...

Travel grant to be offered

All transport for athletes and officials will be free as these will be absorbed by the Games Budget.

Hospitals and medical facilities offered

Each Games village will be provided with a clinic. Arrangements will be made with the Honiara Referral; Hospital to designate certain facilities and staff to serve the medical and medicinal needs of athletes and Games officials, if the need arises.

Drug Testing Procedure

Solomon Islands will ensure that effective anti-doping regime is put in place for the Games. Athletes may be tested at any time and at any place.

Arrangements will be made with the Oceania Regional Anti Doping Organisation (ORADO) in relation to drug testing of athletes prior to and during the Games period. Through their advice the name of the proper laboratory will be identified and information provided to the Games Council and other participating PGAs.

Arrangements for transportation of samples will also be discussed and agreed with the identified laboratory.

Solomon Islands will ratify the UNESCO Anti Doping Convention against doping in sports within the next few weeks. Under Solomon Islands law this is required to be done by Cabinet, not the National Parliament.

Transport

Honiara City poses one of the highest rates of busses and taxis per capita in the entire South Pacific. Buses can be boarded at five minutes intervals from anywhere in the City. Bus fares range between SBD\$2 and SBD\$5 for adults or USD\$00.40 and USD\$00.50 respectively.

At the time of this Bid there are ten taxi services operating in the City each with a fleet averaging between 10 and 30 vehicles, all linked by radios and numerous other taxi operators working as individuals. Taxis fare is about USD\$1.50 per Km.

In addition to these public modes of transport, there are several hire car businesses operating in Honiara, the most popular are Budget, Supreme Car rentals and Kosol Car Rentals.

Village services

The Games village will be the nerve centre of the entire Games. It is NOCSI's desire to make these venues places at which there is security, peace and comfort for all athletes. While the villages will be

interconnected in terms of communication and transportation, they each will be independent in terms of management and administration.

Dining facilities will be at each village, to avoid movement from and to dining venues (if they are centrally located).

There will be nightly cultural entertainments at each Games Villages. Solomon islands is a land of abundant cultures and will wish to show case this richness during the Games.

Hotels and Motels accommodation

Hotel accommodations may be secured by visitors to the Games at various motels and hotels in Honiara. By Games date there will be about 1,200 hotel rooms and more than 400 motel rooms. Current hotel and motel listings in Honiara are as follows:

FINANCE

It is the Government's commitment to allocate adequate funds towards the capital an operating costs of the Games.

The operating costs will be provided by the Government as well as from revenue generated through marketing and sponsorship.

The main capital cost component will go towards the construction of the new national sports stadium complex and other related facilities upgrade. Funding for these projects will be provided by the government of the Republic of China. A summary of the proposed budget is as follow-

Sources of Revenue

The main funding source will be the Government of Solomon Islands and the Republic of China.

In additional a national lotteries will be organised and operated jointly by NOCSI and the National Sports Council (NCS).

In consultation with the Solomon Islands Chamber of Commerce, agreements will be secured in relation to sponsorship and tax exemptions to attract contribution to the funds. The consultations will ensure that there is no conflict in sponsorships.

Major sponsorship agreements will be secured with selected corporate houses, in particular the leading banks, the National Provident Fund and other targeted companies operating in Solomon Islands.

Coordination of these fund raising and sponsorship efforts will be done by the OC.

GUARANTEES

As required under the Games Charter, the following guarantees are assured:

- (1) The Government guarantees the payment of the Host Fee. On being awarded the Games the NOCSI will execute forthwith the Host contract and will comply with the commitments stated in Protocols 2, 9, 10, 11, 13, 14, & 18 inclusive of a host fee as set by Council.
- (2) All member nations and territories of the Pacific Games Council will be invited to take part in the 2015 XV Pacific Games;
- (3) NOCSI also confirms that members of participating contingents at the Games entering Solomon Islands will be exempted from payment of airport taxes and visa fees (where applicable). All persons entering

Solomon Islands will be issued with three months visitors' visas upon entry as is allowed under Solomon Islands Immigration laws.

- (4) Import duty exemptions will also secured for Games participants in order to ensure that items brought into the country in connection with the Games will be free of duty.
- (5) The Solomon Islands constitution guarantees freedom from discrimination based on race, gender, religion and association (including political affiliation).
- (6) There are no laws in existence which will restrict, interfere with or interfere with the Games in anyway. Where compliance with local laws are required in respect of any particular sports, the OC will secure permits and or licenses from the relevant authorities.
- (7) All contractual obligations required under the Games Charter will be performed and carried, in particular those which relate the PGC Guides of minimum requirements included in

the Draft Contract relating to Games Village, Media, Marketing and Accreditation.

- (8) This Bid Document is prepared consistent with Regulation 20 of the Games Charter, in particular Protocol I to that Regulation.
- (9) The sport of shooting firearm licenses will have to be obtained from the Firearms and Ammunition Board.

Applications for such licenses will be made by the OC on behalf of and for each participant in the sport. The relevant law is the Firearms and Ammunition Act.

International TV and Broadcast Rights:

Broadcasting the Games

The OC will seek linkage with sports broadcast specialists, Octagon, and the Solomon Telekom to ensure that maximum broadcasting output is achieved throughout the Games. It is the desire of the OC to ensure that the Games is seen in all the participating nations and territories. The main features of the broadcasting will be the opening and the closing ceremonies. During the Games the broadcast will include a daily feed of sports highlights for 12 days and maximum

number of hours required to broadcast sports actions covering all sports.

Pre-Games Broadcast

As part of the pre-Games publicity campaign the OC will, in consultation with Solomon Telekom, One News TV and the Solomon Islands Broadcasting Corporation, run series of educational programmes every week during the twelve months leading up to the Games.

International broadcast rights

Consistent with the Games Charter, the OC recognises the exclusive right of the Games Council to international TV and Radio broadcasts, including the archiving of materials related thereto. There are no domestic laws etc which will impinge on those rights, although there regulatory laws.

Host Broadcast Signal:

Discussions are underway with the Solomon Islands Television Board and Solomon Telekom to facilitate allocation

of TV channels and transmission by visiting media of live broadcasts. Adequate facilities will be provided for the host broadcaster on financial terms to be aged. Such costs will be born as part of the Games Budgetary commitments. Local TV and radio coverage will be carried out by the Solomon Islands Broadcasting Corporation and One TV.

The latter will be required, with the assistance and support of

the OC, to increase airtime at cost to the OC.

As part of the planning for the Games, the services of Solomon Telekom will be sourced to ensure that the minimum.

standards prescribed by the Council in relation to Television and Radio signal, Internet content, and all Television and Radio archives created for the Games are met. Progress reports on these aspects of the preparation programme will be submitted to the Games Council before the Council meeting in Rarotonga in September 2009

TECHNOLOGY GUIDELINES

At the time of producing this Bid Document NOCSI is yet to receive advice on the appropriate technological components required in terms:-

- Network configuration (WAN an LAN)
- Major Hardware components
- Registration and accreditation systems.
- Timing / Results Systems (including integration with the Host Broadcast signal)
- Judging / Scoring / Measuring Systems
- Internet
- Electronic Services and Infrastructure (closed circuit TV,
- Scoreboards, video screens/walls, sound and acoustic, audio and video recording

- Equipment requirements (phones / e-mail / fax / office equipment
- Technology support to the media and to the Main Press Centre

Expert advice is being sought through Solomon Telekom and details will be provided in future progress reports to be submitted prior to the Rarotonga Council Meeting.

TV an Broadcast rights are governed by the Television and Broadcasting Act. Obtaining rights from the relevant government agencies will be a matter of formalities. The Media Committee which form an integral part of the OC will coordinate an facilitate the acquisition of these rights as part of the Games preparatory strategies.

The OC will ensure that the appropriate systems are delivered and tested well ahead of the Games date.

COMMUNICATIONS

Media Committee

The Media subcommittee will coordinate and supervise all media activities to ensure maximum and free coverage of the Games, subject to accreditation procedures.

Main Press Centre

The media centre will be located the Panatina Campus of the Solomon Islands College of Higher Education and will come under the management an supervision of the Director for Media Services – a subcommittee of the Games Authority.

The Press and Media Centre will be linked to the sports subcommittee to ensure that there is effective transmission of information on various events and programmes taking place at various venues.

Transportation for the media and the press come under the Services subcommittee. We guarantee that the media will be having access to transportation during the course of the Games.

Accredited international media staff will be accommodated at the King Solomon Hotel along Hibiscus Avenue in Honiara. This hotel is within 15 minutes travel time to all sports venues.

Broadcast Locations

The national stadium will offer excellent broadcast facilities. Broadcasts from other venues will be arranged with the SIBC and the Solomon Telekom under the coordination of the Media Committee.

Photographers

Accredited photographers will form part of the media staff and will be serviced by the Media Committee.

Within each venue areas for photographer will be identified and clearly marked.
