

This year our Association has reached a huge milestone with this being the 75th Annual Report to be presented to members – 75 years of badminton in Wellington – WOW! As we reflect on so many years I can't help but mention our Patron and Life Member Ken Orams. Ken is now 90+ years old and has been our patron for many years and still takes an interest in what is happening within the WBA. Ken started his playing days long before the current facility was built, continued into administration and of course left a huge legacy with the work he undertook as project manager / engineer during the 1970s when the 4 court extension was added to the original 4 court hall. Here we are now, 75 years on and looking at extending our facility once again by another 6 courts. Ken continues to keep in touch with the Association and receives our newsletters. He is always interested in what is happening and we recognise him as a very special badminton supporter on this our 75th anniversary.

I would like to recognize and extend thanks to the many dedicated volunteers involved in our Association. We have a continuing goal to move our Association forward and introduce new initiatives and a solid platform for our up and coming junior players. To achieve these goals we need the support and enthusiasm of volunteers, parents and grass roots players.

We would not be able to achieve goals without the dedication of our Badminton Centre staff. Without their enthusiasm, professionalism and encouragement to everyone who passes through our doors – from the 7 year old players to the 70 year old players and all ages in between, our sport would not be able to continue to grow in Wellington.

As I reported last year, we are in dialogue with the Wellington City Council and other stakeholders such as Friends of the Town Belt, Tranzit NZ, local lwi and of course our friends and neighbours within the Hataitai Park Precinct, to extend our Centre. Our Committee has received a presentation of final draft plans for this extension project and at time of this report going to print, we are not far off being able to commence the resource consent process. This process will be a fairly drawn out one but we go into it feeling confident of success.

Our player base continues to increase and with the credit card access for bookings and / or payments now cemented in, this is working to everyone's advantage.

Our junior representative teams showed great spirit and tenacity and achieved their best results ever in the Central Region competition [see Junior Development Officer's report].

Our senior Division 5 team played their way to promotion for 2010 and will compete in Division 4 in 2010. We will have one less team in Senior Division for 2010 but an additional team in Masters Division. Our goal for 2010 is to have a Slazenger Cup team (Division 2) by the 2011 inter-association season.

Badminton New Zealand

We continue to work with Badminton NZ and enjoy an excellent relationship with their office. Our Association appreciates the support of Mike Kernaghan and his Board. Mike is happy to come along and share Badminton NZ news with us and officiated at the recent WBA Awards where outstanding achievements were recognised.

Junior Committee & Parents

Once again we have been lucky to have a group of dedicated parents who have given their time and expertise in many areas to assist our junior programs / travel to tournaments / catering and generally ensuring our junior players are well looked after at all times.

As I have said many times, the Association remains absolutely committed to our junior programs and we continue to set goals in our business plan to promote and encourage our young players to achieve success.

Hall Operations

Jian Dee Chew continues to work hard in and around our Centre. He has the confidence of all players and administrators alike and inter-acts with a wide range of people on our behalf {see Hall Operations Report].

Hall maintenance

Thanks to our maintenance team who continue to monitor general maintenance around our aging hall. This team includes John Walton, Anthony Van Driel, Stewart Lee and Roy Krebs.

Apart from the flooring on Courts 1-4 which we are still looking at as a replacement project when funds allow, we have also identified that our electrical board, currently sited in one of the changing rooms, needs updating. Quotes are currently being considered for this work and we will probably be looking at a funding application to meet the costs as it is a major overhaul.

NZ u.23 Regional Team Event & NZ Police u23 Championships

Wellington Badminton successfully hosted the inaugural NZ National u23 Regional Teams Competition and the NZ Police National u23 Championships from 9-13 April this year. There were 6 teams participating in the NZ National u23 Regional Teams Competition being Auckland, Central, Mainland, North, Northern Districts and Waitakere. Auckland signalled their intention to win this competition by sending their strongest team. Half of the players in the Auckland team were currently training in the NZ National Squad and as predicted Auckland went through undefeated to clinch the title.

The NZ Police National u23 Championships commenced straight after the regional teams competition concluded. The matches were of high quality due to the participation of our national squad players in this event. 52 players participated in the individual championships.

Wellington Open Championships

The Wellington Open Championships were successfully held on 26 & 27 June with a total of 47 players participating, including many from outside of Wellington [see results further down this report].

NZ Police Secondary School Finals

Wellington hosted the NZ Police Secondary School Finals from 3 – 6 September. A total of 24 teams (12 boys and 12 girls] from across the country participated in this event which was sponsored by NZ Police. The participating teams had qualified for the national finals through regional and zone finals play offs. The competition was closely fought with the results not being known until the last ties were played in most instances. Our Association was proud to host this event and thoroughly enjoyed the experience. Thanks to all the volunteers who freely gave their time to ensure the tournament was such a resounding success.

2010 will see a major change to the NZ secondary school champs with a zone qualifying format no longer running. The event will be open entry i.e. schools will have to notify an expression of interest by the end of March and confirm their entry by the end of June. The event in 2010 will be played at Nth Harbour during the secondary schools winter tournament week in September. Long term, the plan is to run a second tier competition concurrently with the top level; this will only occur once a point is reached where the number of teams entering the competition cannot be catered for.

Coaching

We have some dedicated coaches within our Association and we are starting to achieve some goals in this area in that new coaches have come on board this year. This year six coaches attended the Badminton NZ Coaching Forum in Christchurch funded partly by **NZ Community Trust** and partly by Wellington Badminton Association. Coaching development and player talent development go hand in hand and it is extremely important that we continue developing our coaches.

The restructuring of our junior training system has allowed more volunteer coaches to be involved in our junior development program. We now have 12 accredited and/or trainee coaches coaching our junior development squad and junior elite squad.

Appreciation

As this year draws to a close we say farewell to our Treasurer Terry Harrison who has done a sterling job during the past six years and has been responsible, along with the management committee, of ensuring our financial viability into the future. Terry's financial acumen will be sorely missed but I wish him, his partner and their baby son Aaron, all the best as they move to the warmer climes of Bay of Plenty.

We also farewell Pam For who has indicated she will not be available for the management committee in 2010. Pam has been Secretary for 2 years and a committee member since 2004. She too will be missed. On a personal basis and on behalf of all members, I sincerely thank Pam for her commitment and enthusiasm to WBA. I am sure and hope we will see Pam involved as a player for some time to come yet.

On behalf of all members I sincerely thank Megan Jamieson, Terry Harrison, Santy Tan, Pam For, Zhi Young, Peter Sugden - the dedicated people who make up your management committee. Also Craig McLeod who represented Wellington Club and Te Arawa Club who also had a representative at most meetings. I record special appreciation to Vaiola Vaeau, Jian Dee Chew, Bronwyn Hopkin and Chanmony Khieng – our front of house people – for their hard work and dedication during the past year. Bronwyn is also leaving her 'official' role with WBA and was recognised at our recent Awards night.

Financial Report 2009

After six years as Treasurer of the WBA, I will be finishing after this financial year.

Financial Statements

There is \$22,000 in the main operating bank account and \$20,000 in the building maintenance savings account.

There was only \$22,000 in grant funding received this year with \$10,000 going towards operating related costs. This means the WBA has a sustainable revenue stream to cover the running costs and is less reliant on, ever harder to obtain, grant funding.

This year coding of the revenue to the Inter-school competition has shown the revenue in utilising the courts during the off peak work day hours, thus improving the Junior Development result. General costs are down this year including depreciation as some assets had a \$0 value for the financial year.

We have moved to the MYOB financial system this year which meant better reporting of financial information. There is room to expand on MYOB functionally and further improve the reporting for the future.

This year the WBA changed to Business Internet banking which has improved the payment approval process through two person authorisation, and better description of on-line transactions.

I would like to thank our main sponsors – NZ Community Trust, Pelorus Trust, Koha Products, Southern Cross Family Bar & Restaurant, AMI, Ashaway, SOTX and the Wellington City Council. Thanks also to Badminton New Zealand and our auditors, Martin Jarvie PKF.

I have enjoyed my time as Treasurer for the WBA and it has been a pleasure seeing badminton grown in Wellington, especially with the efforts of the management committee and through the hard work of Vaiola Vaeau, Jian Dee Chew in particular. I wish the Association all the best for the future.

Operations & Promotions Report 2009

In preparing this annual report, I looked back at 2009 for some achievements, new initiatives and stories that I would like to share with our members. As I reflect back I also realised that this is my 4th year in my current role at Wellington Badminton Association.

2009 was a very challenging year for our organisation and perhaps other non profit organisations as well as the world is experiencing an economy downturn. Many external funding agencies such as New Zealand Community Trust, Pub Charity, Pelorus Trust etc have indicated that they are feeling the pinch of the recession because money is really hard to come by at this difficult times.

As a result, non profit organisations like ours who rely on funding from these agencies are also being affected by the recession.

Although we did not receive all funding applied for, it wasn't all gloom and doom for our organisation. It just means that we have to spend our money wisely and cut down on our expenses. We are always looking at the ways we do things to manage our finances efficiently to adapt to the current financial circumstances.

Despite all the challenges we are facing, I am also very happy to report that our organisation has achieved many encouraging results for 2009. Some of our achievements are as follows:

- Successfully hosted the inaugural New Zealand u23 Regional Teams Competition & New Zealand Police Secondary School Finals
- Increased participation for casual markets with our off peak rate (9am to 1pm everyday) and also through Entertainment Book sales (50% off voucher)
- New sponsors/partners StudentlT, SOTX, ASHAWAY and WHOLLY BAGELS
- New sponsorship package for our junior players to inspire and encourage them to perform better
- A new floor scrubber machine (funded by New Zealand Community Trust)
- Social room refurbishment
- Acquired new technology for running tournaments/events
- Growth in participation at our grass roots level and many more

In the next few months, the Association will be actively recruiting members to become court officials. As I mentioned in my report last year, we are looking at improving in this area. There will be a Court Officials course organised by Badminton New Zealand in March 2010 and our Association is very keen to have some of our members attend this course.

I am also looking forward to 2010 where we will continue to provide quality services to our members and introduce new initiatives. Many of you may not know that our Association will be hosting the North Island Championships in May 2010 in conjunction with our Wellington Open Championships. This is a national event and will attract many top players from around the country.

Lastly, I would like to take this opportunity to thank all our sponsors and business partners for their support and contribution. The confidence you have shown us to deliver our events, projects, etc is much appreciated. Not forgetting also our volunteers - a big "Thank You" to all of you. Without your help, our events would not run smoothly.

To all our members, thank you for all your support. We hope you will continue to support and enjoy badminton in Wellington.

Junior Development Officer Report 2009

Another busy year in 2009, which saw us witness improvements in all areas.

Junior clubs are running well and this year saw us open and run a club in the Karori Recreation Centre on Thursday's in terms 2 & 3.

Junior club numbers have seen an improvement at Hataitai plus the addition of the 16 new players who signed up at Karori. Next year will see us improve our delivery of club badminton in both Karori and Hataitai.

Junior Rep teams have improved in terms of both numbers of teams competing plus improved results. Two teams in each age group at Central Regions level pus 1 team in each age group at North Islands. The top team in each age group at Central Regions level were competing for the title on the final Sunday of competition. The u13 top team came 4th, u15 top team came 1st, u17 top team came 2nd and the u19 top team also came 2nd. Central Regional and North Island [see results below].

We still have a lot of work to do in regard to our u11, u13 & u15 players as we are still very fragile with the young numbers coming into this area. Very hit and miss and serious work needs to be done to ensure that we have a constant supply of new young players by building stronger relationships with primary schools within close proximity to WBA. With new funding from SPARC into schools and organisations delivering sport we need to be at the front and well organised to establish strong relationships with the schools in close proximity to the hall then expand from there depending on our ability to deliver by way of personnel and facilities available.

A huge thank you to all of our parents, coaches and other juniors plus juniors recently turned seniors for all of the assistance on and off the court. We are very fortunate that we have a number of volunteers prepared to assist when asked and augers well that they have belief in what we are delivering and want to be involved.

Our Coaching team involved and contributing to both club, school and rep coaching this year consisted of Elaine Cheung, Jian Dee Chew, Lionel Chin, Karl Dowland, Emma Garnham, Rhys Hopkin, Chanmony Khieng, Kent Khoo, Joshua Lee, Sam Marsh, Matt Phua and Carol Wu. Thank you all for your work this year.

Inter-School competitions held on Tuesday's and Wednesday's again was well received with Wednesday's basically at maximum and Tuesday's still with some room for the younger year 5 and 6 students. Thank you to these schools teachers and parents for their continued support of this competition [see results below].

From this competition a number of students are identified and we will give them training in term 4 and term 1 of next year in the hope that they will join clubs and want to be part of our representative program at u13 level or building up skill wise to get there in the next year or two.

The AMI Wellington u13, u15, u17, u19 Championships went very well with a big field even without the North Harbour group that came down last season. We still managed to attract players from Canterbury, Marlborough, Hawkes Bay and Wanganui plus other Associations in between. We are very thankful to AMI for all their support and I am sure we distribute one the highest levels of prize money for an Association level tournament. This helps us in attracting quality players locally as well as further a-field [see results below].

A very big thank you for another successful year, to all our young players' parents who are extremely supportive. Without their support we would not have nearly the numbers of players that we have. So thank you for your faith in what we are delivering. Without sponsors we would find life a lot more difficult and while sponsors can't provide everything they do add a nice touch on top. We saw that this year with AMI, Wellington Badminton and Yonex, Ashaway and SOTX providing sponsorships for three young players for 2010. Each package amounted to more than \$1000.00 in value with \$300.00 in cash from AMI to assist with tournament, rep, travel, training costs, plus \$500.00 from racket sponsors by way of product and \$300.00 from WBA by way of court time and re-stringing.

I also wish to acknowledge the continued support from New Zealand Community Trust, Pak N Save Kilbirnie and the Eastern Suburbs Sports Trust who continue to provide assistance. Also Pelorus Trust for their support in assisting with getting our Junior North Island Representatives to their event in the past couple of seasons. We would love to acknowledge more and in 2010 we will let players apply for individual sponsorship and hope to acknowledge and support more players in 2011 who are doing the work and going the extra mile to become a quality player.
