Match Report:

On yet another windy day for football, the Reds journeyed to Glen Iris to take on an old foe.

A win would shore up fourth spot in the run towards the finals. Missing Mike and Fitzy, captain Harry won the toss and kicked with the breeze. A good start was made by the onballers, with Lachie, Schwabby and Fraser winning contests and pushing the ball Ashy's way. Fraser, in one particular play, worked hard with three superb efforts in a contest. Up forward, Adam, Luke and Ed B were providing good options, but Glen Iris was successfully forcing The Reds towards the dead pocket, making it hard to score majors. Spud got his hand on the ball a number of times, and was proving a problem for the opposition. A series of near misses at least got Ashy on the board, but was not reward for effort. Great forward pressure by Matt and Ed B, on the siren, forced an error, with Ed converting a difficult set shot to give Ashy a two goal break.

Clearly, it was going to be difficult to kick goals, let alone score, at the other end. The coaches instructed how to move the ball into the wind- get numbers to the ball; keep possession with short passing; with teammates playing in front. Scads, Alex and Sean all led from the front, as they continually ran into space to mark or receive the next possession. Great work and run from Adam and Adrian saw Ashy twice move the ball from the wing into the forward line and convertfirstly, through Joe, who ran on to a loose ball, run in and snap; and secondly, through Lachie, who bounced a long kick through. These crucial goals seemed to lift Ashy and deflate GI. Fraser and Schwabby both laid crunching tackles, while Anthony and Luke showed clean hands and good judgement with overhead marking into the wind. GI got a couple of lucky goals back, but efforts from Christian (whose tackle at half back stopped a threatening forward move), Dom and Sean (who both shut down space for GI to attack, and ran the ball well) saw Ashy continually pressure GI and deservedly lead at half time.

In the third quarter, GI again forced the ball into dead space and Ashy found it hard to put pressure on the scoreboard, with just one goal for the quarter- a lovely snap out of a pack from James, who had given a great contest earlier in the ruck. Another nice mark from Ed B, and some great work from Ed G, who pushed up continually from CHB to create opportunities saw Ashy dominate the game. Great individual efforts from Stephen and Alex, with marking, tackling and ferreting balls under packs could not increase the lead. The Reds were up against it at the final break, with a twelve point lead.

Great football was needed in the last quarter to win, and great football was delivered. The wind had AUJFC – The Web 7/2010

increased, but Scads, who had been superb on the ball in the first half, was a big factor in this quarter, as he continually got into the right positions to mark or force a contest. Stephen, Alex, Ed G and Lachie were also hugely effective as they beat their opponents with great anticipation and ball use. Harry made a great spoil to stop a GI attack, and this was typical of the desperation shown. Luke was great at CHB, denying his opponent a kick for the quarter.
