**Editorial with Marty King**



Greetings and welcome to another exciting season of the Pineapple Hotel Cup. To newly appointed club coaches and officials thanks for coming on board and good luck in the ever challenging times at club land.

After consultation with all stakeholders a number of changes have taken place in the off season which will hopefully promote autonomy and competition from within the competition. These changes include

- Reverting to a "Final Five" format from the previous "Top Eight" system. This will certainly make jockeying for finals contention more competitive and value add to away wins and percentage boosters
- Moving to stand alone status for the Duncanson/Todd Medal Presentation. In 2008 due to the Queensland "Hall of Fame" format at this years Grogan Medal Night time restraints and individual status of awards means the splitting of the format which will be addressed again post event
- A stand alone Pineapple Hotel Cup Grand Final for the first time in the past three years. This will also result in the Preliminary and Grand Finals being played at the best available neutral venue with the Reserves playing at the same venue as a Curtain Raiser
- And of course this new format user friendly Football Record which will be available for clubs to download and print off and control distribution rather than incur costs and sometimes be unable to pick up records from AFLQ. Once again this will be trialled in 2008 and reviewed post season. I do encourage clubs to "experiment" with this and use the format to insert their own individual brand and messages they wish to promote through the publication

It would be a gross understatement to say its been a quiet off season with a lot happening on a national front (17th AFL license on the Gold Coast) and domestically times of change within our own State League Competitions. We continue to promote varying levels of competition for the current and future wave of participants in the unique market which is Queensland footy.

Contrary to southern beliefs the game has been alive and prospering in the northern state for longer than some may think. In 2008 we celebrate the landmark of 150 Years of Australian Football. It should be and will be a celebration of our great game and especially over Rivalry Round (May 9-10) we invite clubs to join in the party and create their own footprint to commemorate this event

### Noosa v Wilston Grange

A good rivalry exists between these two strong clubs and it will be interesting to follow both clubs fortunes in 2008. They both recruit well and should be in the mix for finals participation albeit the abridged version that takes place this season. Wayne Fletcher takes the reigns at the Tigers and he will no doubt be pushing local youth with a mix of interstate recruiting. The Tigers have lost the colourful Ryan Evans and will have to find between 60-80 goals to cover that loss. Matt Hicks has kicked 15 goals in two practice matches so he appears to be commencing the season in good nick.

Grange will be looking to get an early on the road victory but they don't come much tougher than Noosa at Weyba Rd. Journeyman Barry O'Brien should add some grunt around the packs and big Mark Pennington has been appointed captain of the Gorilla's. Beasy, Cash, and Bradforde all had consistent seasons last year and along with playing coach Andrew Morrison will form the nucleus of the Gorilla premier-ship assault

### Sandgate v Maroochy Northshore

Sandgate confront this game and the season in general confident that they can be big improvers having consolidated their position at Lemke Rd and being very active in the off season recruiting caper. Two big pick ups will be 1996 Joe Grant Medallist Brett Zeidler and former Zillmere Eagles young gun David Scott. The Roo's have the basis of a good list and in R White, Bailey, Hohenhaus, and big Tyson Williams have their share of potential matchwinners. The dawning of a new season is a great opportunity for both clubs to look forward to.

### Palm Beach Currumbin v Western Magpies

The Grand Final replay will be marked by the presentation of the 2007 Premiership flag at Salk Oval which commemorates the wonderful undefeated season that was for the Lions. Bruce Sargent, Craig O'Brien, coaches, players, volunteers and all involved should take great pride in the unfurling of footy's ultimate and look forward to the challenges ahead. They have again been active off season and James Drake (Broadbeach) and Matt Fife (Wodonga Raiders) are great buys. The Magpies know their destiny for 2009 but need to keep focused on the job ahead and would like nothing more than to leave the PHC as the premier club. Games against Palm Beach are as close as dress rehearsals of playing against Division One opposition that you can get so what better a measuring stick to have than the reigning premiers first up under the Salk Oval lights.

### Springwood v Surfers Paradise

A new look Puma's will take to Lowe Oval on Saturday under the guidance of young Tasmanian Ben Milbourne and the club will be investing heavily in local youth, some quality recruits, and the loyal servants that have stuck with the club. Well done to all and sundry at the club that have "dug in" during the tough times of what will be a challenging year. The Demon's look to have a good list again and they like most clubs have recruited well. They were more than competitive in both practice matches and Paul Hams will again be in charge of a club that is more than capable of challenging Palm Beach. Reigning Duncanson/Todd Medallist Simon Fenton who was a run-away winner will back up again and look for the Demon midfield to be a major weapon throughout the season

Much of it is still confidential but suffice to say it was a most compelling case that has excitement levels among hard-headed football staff a fever pitch. ### AFLQ RESCUES RADIO COVERAGE

The ever-popular AFL coverage on the NIRS, thought to have been lost this year, is back. AFL Queensland CEO Richard Griffiths has led a rescue mission that has seen the nation-wide coverage restored. Under the revised deal, AFLQ holds the license. Three matches will be broadcast in south-east Queensland on 98.9fm each weekend on Friday night, Saturday night and Sunday (including all Lions games). Stations on the NIRS network throughout Australia have the option of taking the coverage, "I'm just pleased to see a satisfactory result," said Griffiths. The Round 2 schedule included the Brisbane-Collingwood game Friday night, followed by St.Kilda-Carlton from 5.30pm (Queensland time) Saturday night and Geelong-Essendon from 12.30pm Sunday.
