Representative Fixture

AFL Sydney vs AFL Canberra

I welcome you all to Blacktown Olympic Park for the Representative Fixture between AFL Sydney and AFL Canberra.

The clash represents the third time the two competitions have played against one another with the winner to go home with the Rod Carter – Alex Jesaulenko Shield. The Shield is in recognition of the contributions of Carter and Jesaulenko to representative and club football for the two competitions.



Carter after playing 217 matches with the Sydney Swans was a terrific amabassador for the growing game in Sydney, going on to win a premiership as player/coach with Sydney University in 1991 and coaching the Sydney Football League representative side in 1992. Over the best part of the next decade Rod has been involved in developing and coaching NSW/ACT talent and a number of under age representative sides with a primary focus in Sydney. Alex Jesaulenko has legendary status in the game, playing his formative football with Eastlake in the then ACTFL before carving out a colourful career with Carlton and St Kilda. Alex was a member of the only ACT team to ever beat the Victorians.

AFL Canberra have won the previous two meetings and no doubt the AFL Sydney side will be keen to get their hands on the trophy for the first time.

Today will also give most players/officials and spectators the opportunity to view Blacktown Olympic Park. Whilst the facility is no yet fully complete, it did play host to the recent NAB Under 16's Championships.

Blacktown Olympic Park in the AFL's expansion plans, as the venue will become the home of the new AFL club in 2012.

The \$27.5 million venue will boast two first class AFL/cricket ovals; AFL-standard player, coaching and media facilities; 1500 lux TV-quality lights and an indoor and outdoor cricket practice centre.

The grandstand has a 1600-seat capacity while the entire ground will be able to hold approximately 10,000 fans. This will allow the AFL to bring pre-season matches and special AFL events to the community, while also providing a state-of-the-art facility for the new club.

The AFL has invested significantly in the development of community infrastructure and sporting opportunities for the families of Western Sydney, and will continue to do so as it moves towards establishing the new side.


